At Berkshire Park, we believe in working together as a team to help create an environment where people care for one another. We want our school to be a place where our students feel safe both physically and emotionally, while maintaining high academic standards. In such an environment, student learning will improve.

At Berkshire Park, students are expected to:

- Be **respectful of others** by treating others in a way that they would like to be treated.
- Be **respectful of our school** property by taking good care of the building, grounds, and resources.
- Be **courteous to all** staff members, students, parents, and visitors by using appropriate manners and behaviour.
- **Show responsibility** for themselves and their learning. Students are expected to do their best. Homework is to be finished on time, and students must have the necessary supplies to do his/her work. To assist in this area, students should also use their planner as a daily communication tool between home and school. Responsible students are punctual and attend school regularly.
- Safely conduct themselves each day so that injuries or accidents are prevented.

At Berkshire Park, parents are expected to:

- Ensure their child's attendance is regular.
- Encourage their child to discuss school work and activities at home.
- Ensure their child has adequate sleep, nutrition, and emotional support.
- Ensure homework is completed.
- Work in partnership with the school to resolve problems.
- Check their child's planner on a daily basis.
- Ensure that their child has the necessary school supplies and equipment.

At Berkshire Park, the staff is expected to:

- Model respectful, caring behaviour to staff, students, and parents.
- Work as a team to develop a positive, supportive learning environment.
- Continuously learn, develop, and improve our professional practice.
- Guide our decisions by what is best for the children.
- Maintain open communication between home and school.

Safe Arrival Program

To help ensure student safety, we have a Safe Arrival Program:

Visitors to the School

In the interest of the safety of our students, when visiting, please enter through the front door and sign in at the office.



Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance and being on time are two important factors in a student's successful school life. It is better to aim to be early for school instead of aiming to be on time. The first few minutes of the school day are often when teachers outline the day's activities, discuss the expectations for the day, and deliver valuable instructions. It is crucial that students be present during this important time.

Communication between Home and School

Communication between home and school is crucial in supporting our students' learning. The student planner is a good tool for students to keep track of their assignments and can also be used as a communication tool between home and school. If you have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to call the school.

We will use the school website, newsletters and the student planner to communicate with home about what is happening at school. The school's calendar will be updated as necessary to reflect changes that occur throughout the school year.

The safety of the children is our first priority. Please note there is no supervision on the playground after 2:42 p.m., so we encourage students to head home as soon as possible, unless supervised by a parent or another adult. If children are injured or are put in a compromising position after 2:42 p.m., adult support may not be available to ensure their safety.

Use of School Telephones

Students are always able to make any important calls home from their classroom phone. Students do, however, need to make any 'social' plans ahead of time, not from the school phone.

Bikes and Wheels on School Property

We love having students ride bikes, scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, etc. to school but please make sure all of your children are getting off their 'wheels' when they get on the school grounds. Helmets are required for all 'wheel riders' as well.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of an emergency (fire, earthquake, bomb threat, etc.), the school has policies and procedures in place to ensure your child's safety. All schools have regularly scheduled fire and earthquake drills to prepare for these emergencies.



In the event of an emergency, all classes meet in our designated area on the gravel field. Attendance is taken to ensure all students and adults are accounted for. The school will remain open until all students have been picked up by an authorized contact person for your child. *Please make sure you inform the office if any of your contact information has changed*. If our site is unsafe, our off-site assembly area is at Fraser Valley Christian (Surrey Christian) High School located at 15353 92 Avenue.

Allergy Awareness



Please be reminded that several Berkshire Park students and staff have severe anaphylactic reactions to tree nuts, peanuts, and their by-products. Please help us in committing to do everything possible to protect them. <u>Please do not send food to school that contain peanuts/nuts</u>, remind your children to wash their hands carefully after eating, remind your children not to share or trade snacks and do not use these products in any treats you may send into the classroom over the year. Thank you for your continued understanding and cooperation as

we work together to make our school a safe environment for all students.

Cell Phones and Multimedia Devices

This includes iPhones, androids, iPads, tablets, and other devices capable of accessing the internet. These are only to be used by students inside school buildings or school related functions with permission from the teacher or administration for educationally sound reasons. When these devices are not in use, they should be silenced, kept out of sight and safely stored. The school assumes no responsibility for the personal property of students, including multimedia devices. Students and parents are urged to give appropriate consideration to what is brought to school.

iPads, iPods, Textbooks, Library Books, Classroom Materials

Student iPads, iPods, computers, textbooks, library books and classroom materials are very expensive. It is essential that students treat all of our learning resources and classroom materials with great care. It is the responsibility of the student to always keep track of their technology, textbooks and library books, and report to the teacher if the book is missing. The cost of replacing any lost or damaged school resources will be charged to the students.

Lost and Found

Lost and Found items are kept in a bin by the gymnasium. When items are missing, please check the child's classroom first, then the lost and found area. Please check the lost and found regularly. Items that are unclaimed at the end of each term will be donated to a local charity. Please make sure you mark your children's items with their name.



Dress Code

Students should be appropriately dressed for the activity in which they are involved and for the weather conditions. Clothing should not be offensive to others or otherwise detract from the learning situation.

Students should NOT wear the following: t-shirts with negative or inappropriate symbols, pictures or slogans.

Please note that hats and hoods are discouraged inside the school building as it is important that we are able to recognise the students. This is for student safety.

Being Environmentally Conscious

The Surrey School District has the Rethink Waste program in schools across the district. We will be sorting our waste into 4 streams: Organics (compost), Containers (plastics, metal & glass), Garbage and Paper.

Volunteers in School

Parent volunteers provide valuable teacher and student assistance in a wide variety of activities. Your child's teacher will let you know when volunteers are needed for classroom activities or for supervision and transportation on field studies. Our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) is always looking for volunteers for various fundraising and school events. Please make sure you are on the PAC email distribution list to receive information about volunteer opportunities. You can be added to the PAC list by emailing <u>berkshireparkpac@outlook.com</u> As a volunteer, you are placed in a position of trust. When working with students and teachers, **CONFIDENTIALITY** is of crucial importance. Parent volunteers are not to discuss students or staff with anyone other than the child's teacher or the Principal. Playground, hallway, or neighbourhood discussions of students or staff are not appropriate.

School volunteers always work under the direction of a staff member. Teachers and the Principal are to handle all discipline and behaviour problems. If you have a concern, please notify the teacher immediately.

Traffic Safety

Traffic safety is an on-going concern at Berkshire Park School, especially during drop off and pick up times. We are all safest when as many people as possible **WALK or ROLL** (bike, scooter) to school. You help the earth and reduce traffic congestion at school.

<u>Tips for Pedestrians</u>

- **USE THE CROSSWALK**. Before crossing the street, wait at the curb, and make sure all vehicles have stopped.
- Look left and right, then over your shoulder for vehicles that may be turning.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing at a crosswalk; make sure they see you.
- **Do not jaywalk**. Drivers do not expect to see pedestrians away from intersections and crosswalks.
- Do not wear headphones, talk on the phone, text, or use handheld devices when crossing a street.

Tips for Drivers

- The parking lot is for staff members and students with special needs.
- Park on the street or in an empty visitor stall if you are leaving your vehicle to meet your child.
- The circular drive is a drop-off and pick-up only zone. Stop, drop (quick pick-up), and roll on out! **PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR UNATTENDED.** Give hugs and kisses at home. Put backpacks in the seat next to your child; **not in the trunk.**
- **Do not turn right out of the drive through** (8:00 9:00 am and 2:00 3:00 pm) into the busy main crosswalk.
- **<u>NO IDLING</u>** Berkshire Park is a no-idle zone. Please turn off your car engine. Idling contributes to poor air quality, which negatively impacts student health.

Berkshire Park Elementary Code of Conduct

We believe that all students have the right to learn in a safe, caring, and orderly environment, a place where they can develop academically, socially, and emotionally. Our Code of Conduct is designed to provide guidelines for appropriate student behaviour when students are on their way to or from school, at school, on our playgrounds, or away from our school at any school-sponsored function. One of our goals is to help student become responsible, self-regulated, and cooperative citizens. Berkshire Park Broncs are:

- Respectful
- Responsible, and
- Safe



We understand that inappropriate behaviour includes, but is not limited to:

- interfering with learning of others, including their physical and emotional well-being
- bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, threats, intimidation, marginalizing, and violence
- verbal, physical, or sexual abuse
- discrimination, theft, and vandalism
- retribution against a person who has reported the misbehaviour of others
- misusing cyberspace, cell phones, electronic devices, or computers
- possession, use, or distribution of illegal or restricted substances such as alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, e-cigarettes
- possession or use of weapons (including replicas), fireworks, or explosives

Consequences

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner, respecting individual rights, responsibilities, age, and maturity. There will be increased expectations for behaviour as students mature through successive grades.

Inappropriate behaviour typically has the following consequences:

- review of expectations followed by a meaningful consequence (for example: a warning, a timeout, a verbal or written apology, school service, loss of privileges)
- parents are informed
- short-term (in school or at home) suspension up to 5 days
- long-term suspension (over 5 days) or referral to a district program
- consultation with the police and/or other agencies
- expulsion
- reasonable steps will be taken to prevent retaliation against a student who has reported a breach of the code of conduct

Notification:

As circumstances warrant, the school has a responsibility to advise other parties following a behaviour incident:

- parents or guardians of student exhibiting major misbehaviours
- parents or guardians of student on the receiving end of major misbehaviours
- Assistant Superintendent, Safe Schools team member and/or other District Staff ministerial agencies and/or police
