## - Halloween

- Photos were well received and Tabitha enjoyed seeing all the costumes and students faces
- PAC provided a mini chocolate for each student; these were separated into classroom bins and picked up by the teachers when they came for photos
- Christmas
- In talks with local bakeries to make Christmas decorated nut-free cookies for the students, in place of our annual hot chocolate
- The plan is for these to be prepacked and individually wrapped and to be delivered to classrooms in bins, similar to how it was managed for Halloween candies


## New Business

- Fundraisers for rest of school year: will depend on Covid-19 restrictions and the school being open)
- FunDays - Kernels Popcorn \& Purdy's Chocolate via Munch-a-lunch will continue monthly
- FlipGive - Website/app; register before you shop (for example on Amazon, Home Depot); Share the link, no cost to PAC, or to the individual using this link
- Bookfair - Tabitha is in discussion with Scholastic for Christmas and Spring
- Read-a-thon - Considering more of a literacy program instead of as a fundraiser; Tabitha will be doing further researching and planning, hopefully for Spring Break
- Clothing Drive - Currently planned for January $13^{\text {th }}$, and will organize another for Spring
- Coffee - Potentially to be run in the spring
- Neufeld Farms - Potential to run in April, so orders will be available in time for summer BBQ season
- Grade 7 Funds
- PAC Executives have decided to rework the way funds are allocated to the Grade 7's to provide an equal amount for every grade 7 year after year - Proposing to offer a 'cost per student' - the end cost would differ year after year depending on how many Grade 7's are enrolled
- The 'cost per student' would replace the 'flat rate' which does not change year to year based on how many are in enrolled in grade 7
- Having a 'cost per student' instead of 'flat rate' is a more fair and streamlined process
- PAC intent to move to this platform is to have this money used for memory mementos for the students by way of something such as yearbooks and medallions, For students to have as keepsakes. The current quote for medallions was $\$ 6.86$, and for yearbooks $\$ 4.50$. This would be $\$ 11.36$ per student.
- PAC anticipates this change will help reduce the strain on Grade 7 parents having to plan events and fundraisers, as well as act as some financial relief for Grade 7 parents. This increase in funds and method of calculating is an appreciation from the PAC for all the years the students and parents have helped in the school and with fundraisers
- The PAC would like to present a motion to approve a change in expenses from $\$ 500 /$ year, to $\$ 15 /$ Grade 7 student, year over year. This would allow some extra money after the medallions and yearbooks, to be put towards something such as a pizza party or luncheon.

- Technology presented by Mr Lam - Due to covid and online/blended learning the school would like to increase the laptop inventory to two full class sets of laptops; currently there is one full set plus 10 more which would be a need for 20 more. Purchased in bundles of 5 the cost is $\$ 1000 /$ laptop. Current Technology budget is for $\$ 2500$, PAC will consider financial status for next PAC meeting and readdress any possible increase in technology funds for this
- In-school Instruction presented by Mr Lam - Idea of Curling; Cost is 4 days $\$ 980+$ gst for 4 days of Covid safe instruction
