Introduction of PAC Executive team:

- Each Pac Executive had a slide with their picture and a brief write up about themselves and why they are part of PAC. This was read by each member.

Principal Report:

- It was wonderful to see many parents in the building on Meet the Teacher Night last month and big thank you to PAC for setting up a welcome table as well
- September $30^{\text {th }}$ for the first Truth \& Reconciliation Day, and the staff wanted the students to understand this day was a time to remember as opposed to just another holiday. Time was spent that week on what the words "truth" and "reconciliation" means
- Ms. Gallello and Ms. Wilk (gr. 6 class) are once again spearheading student leadership and are planning a kindness poster campaign/contest starting sometime in October
- The government FSA exams for grade 4 and 7 students are happening this month, and they are a snap shot of how our students are doing in literacy and numeracy


## - Melanie S asked if this is for grade 4 and 7 only: Confirmed.

- The contract for Delta gymnastics just got approved yesterday so we are looking forward to lessons from a professional starting on October $12^{\text {th }}$; the students will all have 3 lessons each and then the teachers will continue with the gymnastics unit on their own
- Please note that interim report cards should be coming home on October $18^{\text {th }}$ or $19^{\text {th }}$ and parent/teacher conferences for those who need to meet are scheduled for October 21 ${ }^{\text {st }}$; make an appointment directly with your child's classroom teacher
- For October $29^{\text {th }}$, Kindergarten to gr. 4 will be participating in a Halloween parade and then having individual classroom activities for that day; I will be taking class photos of the children in their costumes as well
- Mr. Ferguson is coaching volleyball but there isn't as much interest among the grade 6 and 7 boys this year, so he might be coaching the girls instead
- Photo retake day is Monday, November $8^{\text {th }}$ and we plan to have an outdoor Remembrance Day assembly on November $10^{\text {th }}$ at 12:45 p.m.
- Besides gymnastics, we are planning for curling lessons in the new year and hip hop lessons in May. Ms. Welch is also looking into possibly getting a professional artist to come in and do some art with the students and will try and apply for a grant that will help cover the cost of it
- Our school wide goal continues to be in the area of social and emotional learning

2021/2022 Budget:

- As of August 2021:
- General Account: \$13,727.47
- Gaming Account: \$12,021.58
- TOTAL: \$25,749.05
- We have some funds leftover from last school year due to how schools operated last school year because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Review of budget was completed.
- Question from Katie N about FlipGive/FunScript - Confirmed these are separate fundraisers, one for gift cards and one for online shopping, and will be noted in upcoming meeting and newsletter.
- Question from Katie $\mathbf{N}$ about bank charges and how much they cost. Tabitha advised these actual amounts from last year will be provided. Alex advised cost is mainly related to new cheque purchases from the bank.
- Ashley commented she works for GF Financial and is willing to help if needed to switch and help save money on these costs.
- Sunshine Fund: This fund is used to support kids in need.
- Proposed update to Sunshine Fund use of funds: PAC would like to provide Mr.Lam with 18 hot lunches, $\$ 7$ per lunch, so children in need can be provided lunch.
- Discussion about allowing Mr. Lam to use at his discretion to allow for confidentiality of students used for. Consideration for sibling groups which would be easier to manage if Mr. Lam can use at his discretion. Mr. Lam will be able to discuss with the school child care worker who will know who can use this extra help. Parents can always help in addition to this if they wish, can purchase extra lunches on Munch-A-Lunch, and direct message PAC to let them know.

- Question on chat from Ashley A re: do volunteers have to be parents of grade 7 students. Tabitha confirmed that they do not have to be, however, prior to canvassing for volunteers within the parent community, effort will be made to reach out to grade 6 and 7 parents first.

Walk to School Wednesdays:

- Held the first Wednesday of each month
- Mr. Lam noted quite a few students did participate, however, there was still so many drivers and with the gates to the parking lot closed, it caused more chaos.
