

# PAC MINUTES

February 6, 2023 @ 4:30pm in School Library | Meeting called to order by Laura Grier

### Agenda Items

1. Follow up items from the PAC Meeting on Monday November 14<sup>th</sup>:

### Heather/Allison:

- a. Fence beautification what stage are we at?
  - 4 shapes were chosen: an irregular heart, a bumblebee, a butterfly and a flower.
  - Fraser Heights is cutting the shapes & will include 2 holes in each shape.
  - 1 shape will be given to each student & their buddy. They will paint them together (210 shapes).
  - Smooth plywood (\$210/sheet) can get 72 pieces cut at 8" per shape 3 sheets have been purchased.
  - \$1,000 is the estimated total. \$630 has been spent on plywood and the remainder will be spent on paint, sealant & material to hang the shapes.
  - The will start cutting the shapes shortly.
  - They are aiming to get some of the shapes done by the end of the school year.
  - There is \$759.50 from the meet the teacher's bbq (September 22, 2022) that is currently held in the SchoolCash Online. Once this has been exhausted, please let the PAC know.
- b. Can we hold a bake sale?
  - Not allowed.
- c. Has First Aid for the Grade 7 students been set up? Cost?
  - No, they have been unable to find a provider to run the course. The old provider has moved.
  - Allison will let us know if anything comes up; even if it is the Babysitting course.

### PAC:

- a. Movie Night update
  - We had some issues with the volume at the December Movie Night.
  - There were students playing with volleyball and using the pull-up bar. Some students were also trying to leave.
  - Laura will go into the school and figure out the volume; maybe it had something to do with the Blu-Ray player and not the speakers.
  - We would love to have either Allison or Heather at the next Movie Night so that it helps students stay in the gym and enjoy the movie.
  - October Movie Night made \$860 / December Movie Night made \$650
  - PAC will discuss possible dates and email Allison/Heather to set is up.
- b. Donation Drive total / Digital sign replacement update
  - The total collected from the Donation Drive in December was \$1,300.

- We received another \$1,200 in donations in the last few days for a total of \$2,500 to go towards the cost of the sign.
- The cost of the replacement of the sign is \$25,300. The deposit as been submitted and the factory that is making the sign in China is making it.
- We are hopeful that the sign will be replaced in May/June. We are waiting for an update from the Sign Company as they are looking into when it will be shipped.
- c. Timing of the Scholastics Book Fair
  - February 27<sup>th</sup> to March 3<sup>rd</sup>.
  - Scholastics now charges \$25 for the Book Fair & there is a \$100 cancellation fee.
  - Mrs. Sturn is not at Erma on Wednesday's, so we need to find parents to volunteer for the day or it won't be held that day.
  - PAC is looking for two parent volunteers who can shadow Yoj so that they are able to run it in future.
  - We will ask the school to send out our flyer and we will put them around the school.
  - A sign up sheet will be posted in the school for parent volunteers.
- 2. Fundraising events from now until the end of the year
  - a. Lunch Days
    - 9 more lunch days (2/month)
    - We have made \$7,000 from September to March.
    - We make roughly \$600 per lunch day.
  - b. Purdy's Chocolatier Easter fundraiser
    - 5-week ordering period.
    - It will start on February 20<sup>th</sup> and the cutoff will be during Spring Break.
    - We will send the chocolates home the first week back from Spring Break.
    - We will ask the school to send out our flyer to parents as well as staff.
  - c. Scholastics Book Fair (discussed above)
  - d. Mother's Day cookie sales
    - We will hold this in early May.
    - Sandy will contact Echo Catering and ask them to provide us with some options.
  - e. Movie Night(s) (discussed above)

  - May would work best.
  - We will aim to hold it on a Friday.
  - PAC will discuss and contact Allison/Heather to set it up.

  - June: Cutlus Lake Waterpark, Central City Fun Park, Centennial Beach
- c. Basketball has started.
- d. Badminton is about to start with Grade 5/6/7 with Mr. Chang & Mr. Scott.
- e. Ulitmate? Allison is hoping to get this started this year.
- f. The Lunar New Year was successful and the students had fun. They sold 600 fortune cookies with the money raised going to charity.
- g. February is kindness month and there are lots of activities planned.

### 7. Parent Questions?

- a. Is Erma being rented after school to outside user groups?
  - Yes it is. This is done through the District.
- b. The balance sheet is looking very positive. Can we have more after school activities for the kids?
  - The PAC doesn't have the resources to look into this but if we can find parent volunteers to come up with options and costs, the PAC would gladly work with the parent to make it happen.
