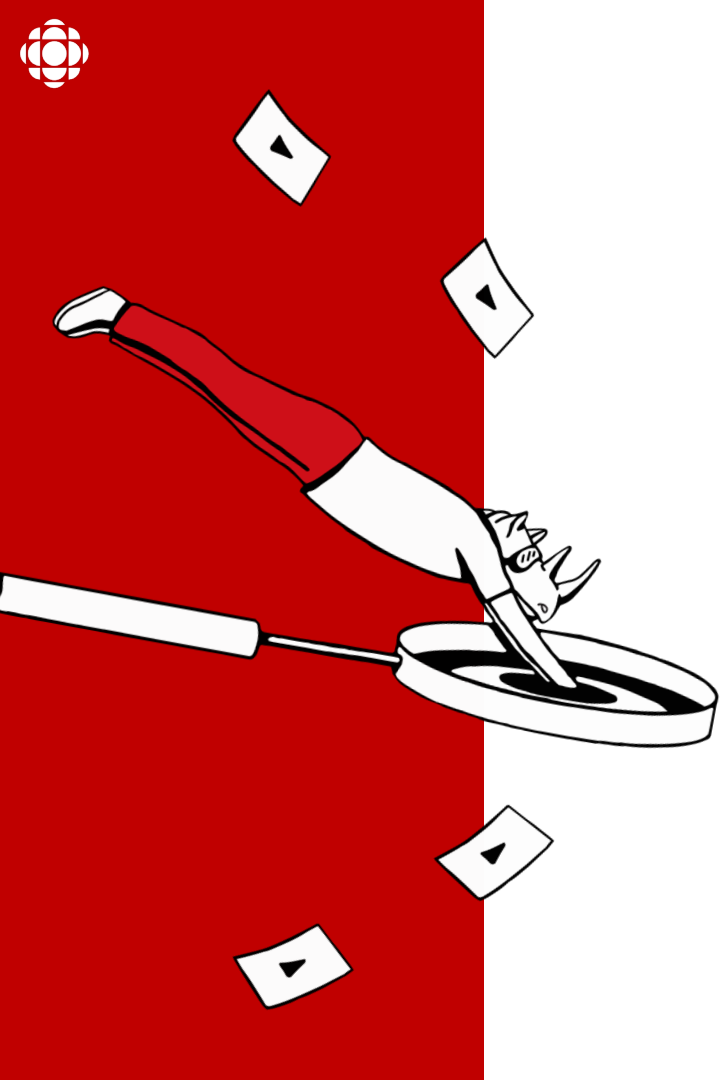
Welcome to Curio!

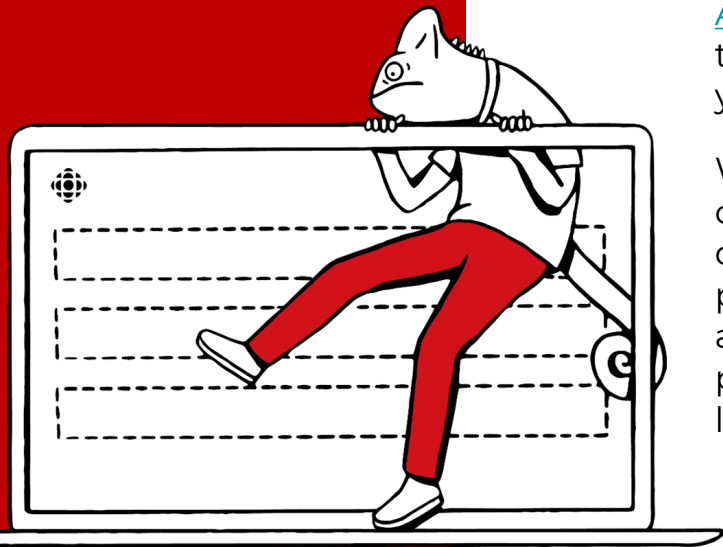


Start Exploring...

Once you've created your account, start exploring! Your home page will offer content based on your profile settings, but you can also "browse" by grade level or subject category or "discover" new titles according to specific curriculum-focused themes (see the tabs at the top of the page).

Search results can be filtered according to subject category, channels, closed caption availability, grade level, media type (audio or video), production year, series title, and/or whether or not the content has teacher guides available.

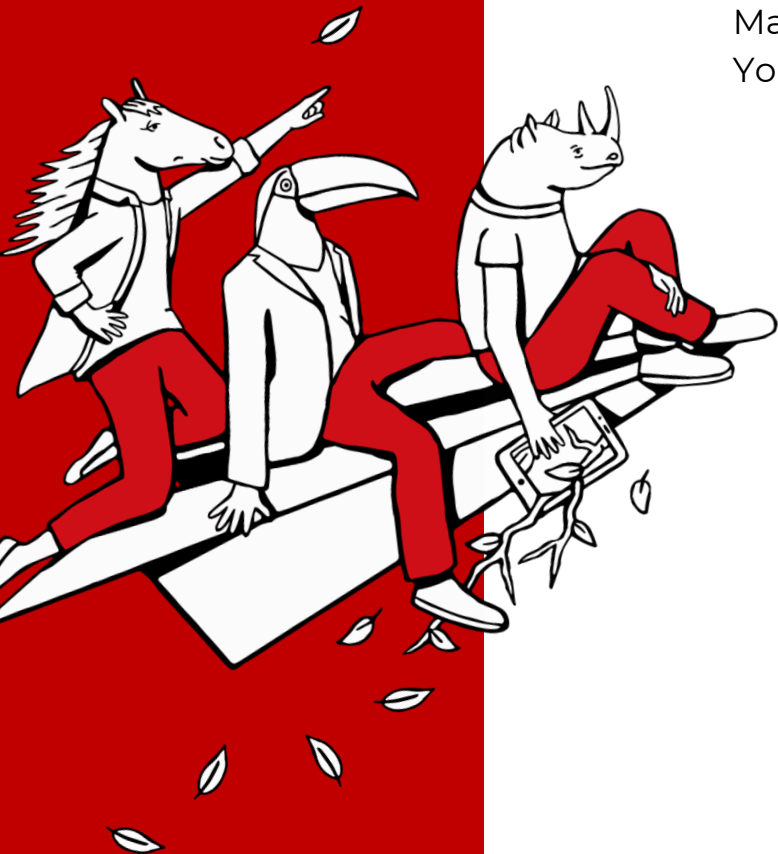

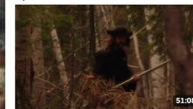
