✿ An educational program supporting students temporarily too ill to attend school


We help students progress through courses in which they are currently enrolled, so that they are not behind when they return to school

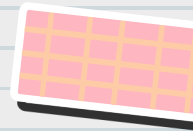

How does it work?

A teacher will visit for 1-hour 2x per week (during school hours)

Most core subjects, and some (but not all) electives can be supported while on hospital homebound





Who do we serve?

SD36 students grades 1-12 (Not kindergarten)

for various medical reasons

** Not Suspensions



Who Qualifies?

Students who are absent for 5 continuous days or more

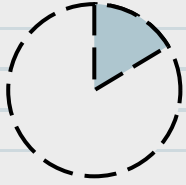
- Students who attend part time are not eligible
- Maximum of 3 months

**When a student is absent for 3 months or more, alternate education programming will be explored (ex. SAJL)



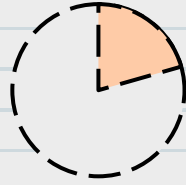

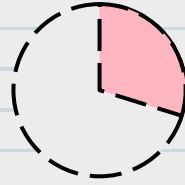

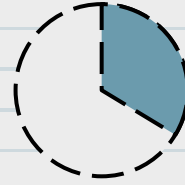

Regularly pick-up new work and drop-off completed assignments



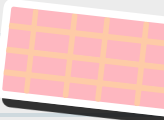

Administer tests, quizzes and major exams

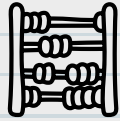


Communicate

Provide classroom teacher with regular feedback and keep school administrators informed with student's progress



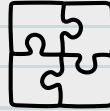

A medical note must be provided shortly after the first visit except in the case of mental health referrals

Mental Health

The hospital homebound program Mental Health Referral Protocol must be followed **prior** to submitting a referral for the HH program



This is to ensure that the proper supports are in place for the student

- Is hospital homebound the appropriate placement?
 - Is a therapist/counsellor from an outside agency involved?
 - Is the DRC/DBS involved?
 - Is the hospital homebound medical form complete?
 - Is there a plan in place following discharge from hospital homebound?

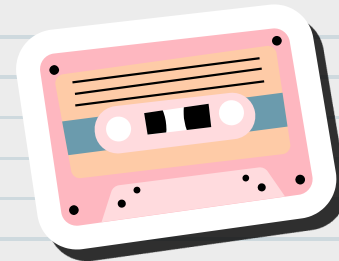
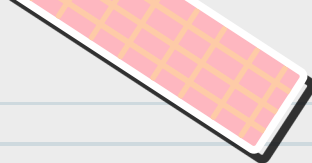
↳ What can you do?

Classroom teacher

- Provide assignments, course materials and exams
 - Prepare enough homework for 1 week at a time
 - Determine students grade (marking, etc.)
- * HH teacher will provide feedback on students progress

Counsellor

- Complete the online referral
- Inform the classroom teacher about HH
- Request homework package from the classroom teacher
- Inform the HH teacher of any special concerns regarding the student

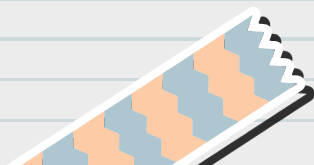


Return to School



The hospital homebound teacher will help with the transition once the student has recovered and is ready to return to regular school

The transition period does not typically exceed 2 weeks
