HOW DO POST SECONDARY SCHOOLS GET YOUR MARKS





• Many Post Secondary Institutions equire you to self-report your marks. The schools will then confirm your self-reported marks with the Ministry transcripts.

 Please check the schools for the self-reporting deadlines...they are different!

• In order for these schools to get your actual marks, you **MUST** register on the Student Transcript Service.





THE STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE HAS TWO MAIN PURPOSES:

- 1) For students to give permission to the Ministry of Education to release their marks to the schools they have applied to. These schools have the choice when they will access marks throughout the year.
- 2) For students to review their transcript and refer to during self reporting. You can also download it and send it to your Post Secondary Institutions if needed.

WHEN DO YOU APPLY TO POST SECONDARY SCHOOLS?

• Applications open for admission at different times, but most are open in early fall. Check the websites!

 In addition, sometimes to be considered for an early offer of admission, applications must be received by a certain date. Again, check the websites!

• Certain programs, such as nursing, can also have different deadline dates. Yes, check the websites!

- Requirements are changing and will likely continue to change.
- Schools also have their own policies on repeated courses and also where the course was completed.
- Check websites for the most up to date information about admissions to various faculties and programs.

TIPS ON CHOOSING YOUR SCHOOL:

- Make an appointment with your school counselor and visit the Career Center.
- Attend Post Secondary Rep sessions online and at school (check out TEAMS Elgin Grads 2023, tv monitors, Instagram (#elginparkcareers),Orca App, bulletin board and announcements).
- Check out October 6 and 7 Find Your Fit event and the October 17 BC Post Secondary night at Elgin Park Secondary.
- Check out www.postsecondarybc.ca and www.schoolfinder.com
- Research different programs and be sure to check the admission requirements for the school and faculty carefully...there are some differences!



TIPS ON CHOOSING YOUR SCHOOL:

- Visit the campus (Pro D Days!)...talk to admissions and the students.
- Make an appointment, send an email or call the admissions office with any questions or concerns.
- Post secondary websites will have information in regards to the criteria for the English qualifying exam.
- Decide where you want to attend and try narrow it down to down to 2 or 3 schools. Also choose your first and second choice faculties.

Do Not Forget To...


- Keep a notebook to keep track of passwords and deadlines.
