This program is designed for:

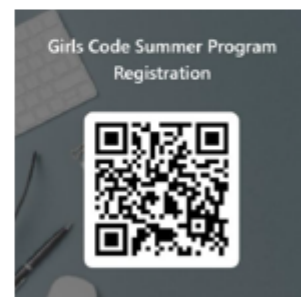
- Students who like math and want to learn more advanced skills

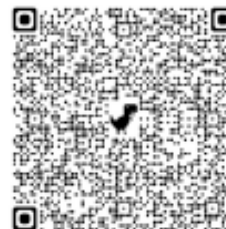

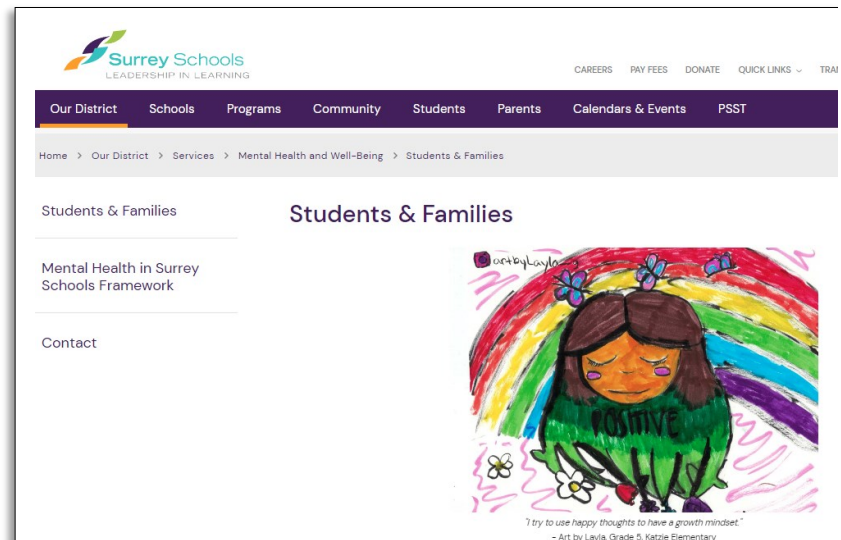

Two New Mental Health Animated Videos

The next two in our series of six animated, multilingual [mental health videos](#) are now available for students, Families and educators.



Healthy vs Unhealthy Stress defines the different types of stresses – explaining that some kinds of stress are actually ok, while others can have negative impacts on well-being. The video outlines the potential harms of unhealthy stress and healthy strategies to manage it.

Health & Wellness explains what physical and mental wellness is and how best to take steps – even small ones – toward achieving it.

The first two – **Navigating Life Changes & Digital Stress** – were released last month, with 2 more coming in June. Each of the videos is available in an elementary version for primary students and a secondary version for students in upper-intermediate and senior grades. All of the videos are also available in French, Punjabi, Arabic and Mandarin, all with closed captioning.

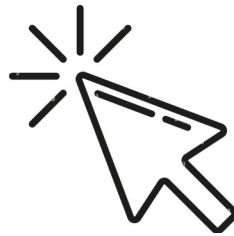

2023 Summer Learning Registration Information

April 5, 2023

Registration for Surrey Schools' [Summer Learning](#) full credit academic courses is now open for Grade 12 students, with [full credit and academic completion](#) (previously remedial) registration for other grades opening soon.

The registration dates are as follows:

- **April 3** – Full credit registration opens for current Grade 12 students only
- **April 10** – Full credit registration for current Grade 9–12 students
- **May 8** – Academic completion registration for current Grade 8–11 students
- **June 25** – Online registration closes at 11:59 p.m. for both full credit and academic completion courses

Financial Support

Financial support to make school more affordable for families that need it most.

In late August, the provincial government announced [\\$60 million in one-time funding to school districts in B.C.](#) – including \$7.385 million to Surrey Schools – to make school more affordable for students and families.

Our district has now received this funding and has allocated amounts to all of our schools. Moving forward, these funds will be used to support families struggling with the rising cost of living due to inflation.

We can use these funds at our school to ensure students can continue to participate fully in school, despite challenging financial situations.

These funds can be used to help with school supplies, food and clothing costs, and additional fees so that students in need can take part in activities, such as field trips.

Families are encouraged to reach out to principals, teachers, or their school office staff if any financial support is needed for school-based supplies or activities.

- Consider drop-off/pick up earlier and/or later in the morning/ afternoons to avoid peak traffic times.
- Do not turn left onto 80th Ave out of the school lot... this creates more traffic backlog.

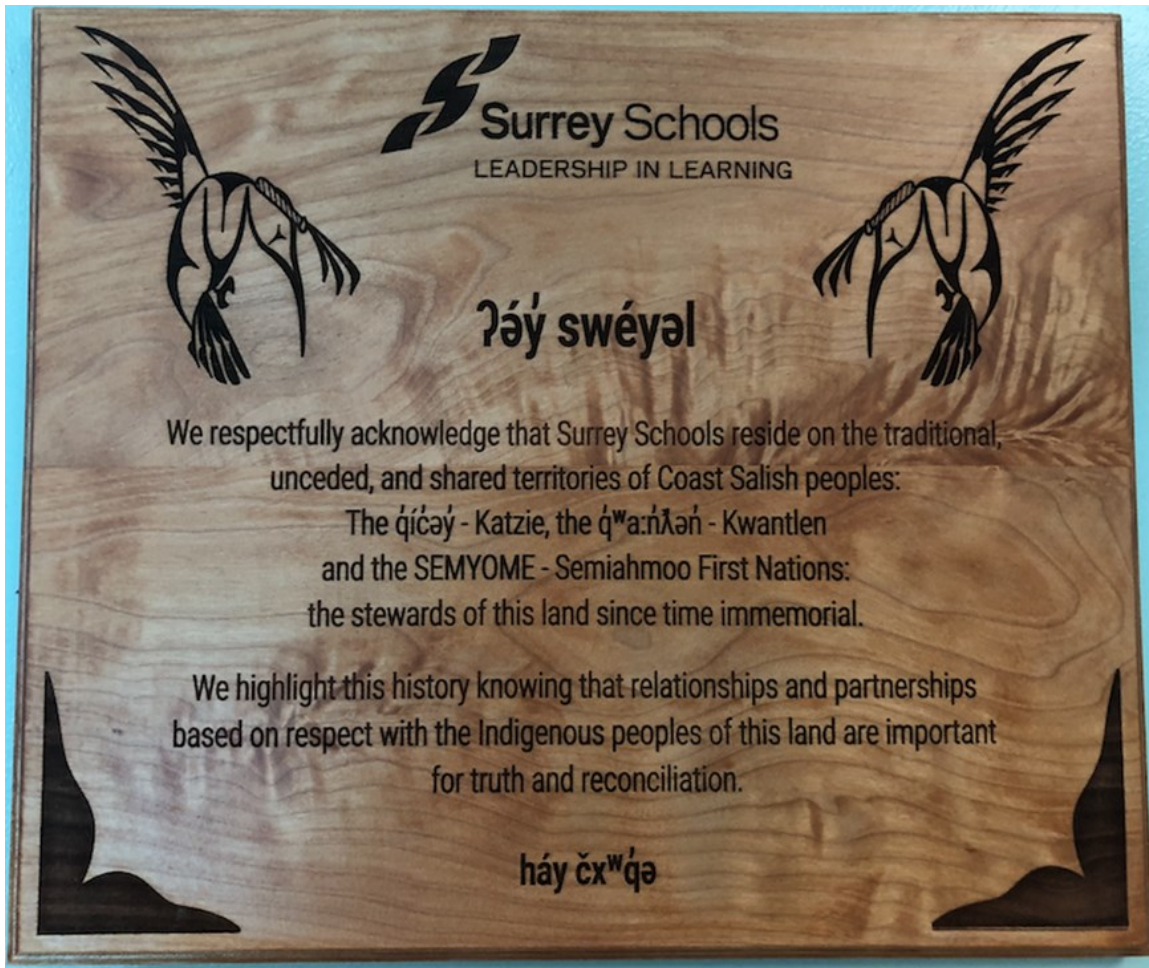
Next week is the last week of regularly scheduled classes. It will be an important week of learning and final assessment. As always, students – finish strong, stay focussed and make us proud!
