- A "C" or better in Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Ability to work independently
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Dexterity & good physical condition
- Four weeks of technical training at KPU Cloverdale

Collision & Refinishing Common Core

- 34 week program at VCC's Broadway Campus
- Successful completion of Math 10 and English Language Arts 11
- Possess a mechanical aptitude & interest
- Minimum of an "L" Driver's Licence
- Basic computer skills & access to an internet connected device

Heavy Mechanical Trades Foundation

- 36 week program at VCC's Broadway Campus
- Must be in Grade 11 to apply
- Successful completion of Math 11 & English Language Arts 11 or 12
- Automotive Tech 11 required
- Automotive Tech 12 recommended
- An "L" or "N" Driver's Licence

Baking & Pastry Arts



- 23 week program at VCC's Downtown Campus
- Successful completion of Math 10, Science 10 and English Language Arts 11
- Program starts in July
- Work experience component to the program
- Current Food Safe Level 1 Certificate
- As many Foods & Nutrition courses as possible

Culinary Arts



- 21 week program at Tamanawis Secondary School
- Program runs in Semester #2
- Successful completion of Grade 10 required
- Current Food Safe Level 1 Certificate
- Desire to learn using a hands on, practical approach
- A passion for food and cooking

HAIRSTYLIST @ NORTH SURREY LEARNING CENTRE

- A two-semester program that starts in Semester #2 at North Surrey Learning Centre
- Program runs Monday to Thursday with students encouraged to train in an industry setting on Fridays
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Physical ability to complete the required work
- Two three-week work experience placements

Automotive Service Technician

- 21 week program at Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary with one month at KPU's Cloverdale Campus
- Successful completion of Math 11 with a "C" or better
- English Language Arts 11 & Auto Service Tech 11 are required
- Physics 11 or a Science 11 is strongly recommended
- Possess a mechanical aptitude & interest
- An "L" or "N" Driver's Licence

Piping Program

- 28 week program located at Panorama Ridge Secondary
- Successful completion of Math 10 and English Language Arts 10
- Program starts in February and ends mid-August
- Physics 11 recommended
- Good hand-eye coordination

Millwright Program

- 24 week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic's Cloverdale Campus
- Program runs February-July
- Completion of Grade 11
- Minimum of a "C" in Math 11 and English Language Arts 11
- Physics 11 is recommended
- Physically able to complete the work required

Welding Program

- 28 week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Cloverdale Campus
- Programs starts February
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a minimum of a "C"
- Completion of Grade 11 recommended
- Manual dexterity & agility
- Physically able complete to the work required



Explorations in Aviation Careers @ NORTH SURREY SECONDARY

- Offered in Semester #2 at North Surrey Secondary
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Ability to work independently
- Good hand-eye coordination
- 5 weeks at BCIT's Aerospace Campus
- Three-week work experience placement

Horticulture Program



- 16 week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Langley Campus
- Programs runs February to March
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a "C"
- Strong interest and marks in science
- Particular interest in botany
- Physically able to the work required

CADD/ Drafting Program



- Computer Aided Design & Drafting located at KPU's Cloverdale Campus
- Students attend two evenings a week
- Successful completion of Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Must be enrolled in or have completed CADD/Drafting 11 or 12
- Recommended students be in Grade 11 prior to starting the program

Early Childhood Education

- Interested in working with young children?
- Program runs in second semester in partnership with Douglas College
- Students need to have successfully completed Language Arts 12, as well as Science 11 and Math 11 requirements
- Excellent attendance & punctuality
- Strong speaking and listening skills
- Students complete a 10-week theory coursework prior to a 200-hour practicum experience
- Upon successful completion of the program students receive an Early Childhood Educator Assistant License

Tah-Tul-Ut Indigenous Education Pathway



- Offered at SFU's Surrey Campus & Surrey College
- Students must be prepared to complete graduation requirements in first semester of Grade 12
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 12 with a "C+" or better with excellent written communication skills
- Strong math skills – Foundations or Pre-Calculus recommended
- Identify as an Indigenous person

Education Assistant



- Program located at one of Surrey College's locations
- Program runs February - June
- Successful completion of Grade 12 is required in the first semester of Grade 12 year
- English Language Arts 12 with a "C+" or higher
- Successful completion of Foundations or Pre-Calculus Math 11
- Possess excellent writing skills

Metal Fabrication Program



- 23 week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic's Cloverdale Campus
- Program runs February-July
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a minimum of a "C"
- Manual dexterity & agility
- Physically able to complete the work required

Electrical Program



- Program located at Princess Margaret Secondary School
- Program starts in February and runs into mid-July
- Successful completion of Grade 10
- Completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Physics 11 or Chemistry 11



PAINTER & DECORATOR PROGRAM @ Finishing Trades Institute

- Offered in Semester #2 at the Finishing Trades Institute in Surrey
- Six-week program that starts in June
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Dexterity & good physical condition

Community & Public Safety CAPS



Child & Youth Care Counsellor



- Tuesday evenings at Kwantlen Park Secondary
- Program runs in September to December
- Students must be in Grade 12 while taking the program
- Recommended "C+" or better in Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Applicants must have a strong interest in pursuing a career in community and public safety

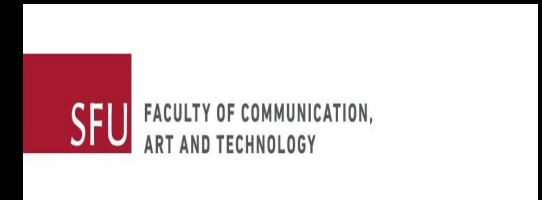
- Program located at Queen Elizabeth Secondary School
- Program runs July - August
- Successful completion of Grade 11
- Require this course with the intention to pursue a career as a Child & Youth Care Counsellor
- Capable of academic rigor

Legal Office Procedures



- Course located at Kwantlen Polytechnic University's Surrey Campus
- Program runs July - August
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 10 with a minimum of a "C"
- Students must have successfully completed Grade 11 prior to starting the program
- Basic keyboarding skills recommended
- Good communication skills, strong organizational skills and exceptional professionalism
- Interest in pursuing a career as a legal office assistant or a paralegal professional

Graphic Design



- Course located at Simon Fraser University Surrey Campus
- Program runs September to December with a combination of online & in person learning
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 10 and Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Students must have successfully completed Grade 10 prior to starting the program
- Students must require this course with the intention to pursue a career in graphic design or digital media arts
- Students will be expected to put in time outside of class to learn required software and to work on projects

Health Science



- Wednesday evenings at Guildford Park Secondary
- Program runs in September to December
- Students require a "C" or better in English Language Arts 11 or 12
- Students require 2 additional Grade 11 or 12 academic courses, as well 2 Grade 11 or 12 electives
- Applicants are expected to meet Emily Carr academic admission requirements
- Art 11 or 12 courses recommended

- Program located at the Kwantlen Polytechnic University Surrey Campus
- Program runs from July - August
- Successful completion of Grade 11 is required prior to starting the program
- English Language Arts 10 & Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Require this course for the intention of pursuing a career as a nurse

- Visit the Career Centre at your secondary school and speak with the Career Facilitator
- Work with the Career Facilitator to complete the application
- Applications are detailed and lengthy so leave ample time to complete prior to the deadline

What happens after you have applied?

- Student applications will be submitted by the Career Facilitator to the District Career Office
- Program Coordinators and Instructors vet the applicants to create a short list of students to interview
- If granted an interview, students will prepare with their Career Facilitator to complete the interview process
- Once interviews are complete, interviewees are notified in writing as to whether they are conditionally accepted into the program
