GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS—JUNE 2022

The final session of the B.C. Graduation Assessment Schedule is planned for Monday, June 13th – Friday, June 17th, 2022.

Grade Ten students who are currently registered in English 10 classes, during semester two, will be scheduled to write their Literacy 10 Assessments during this week.

As well, Grade Ten students who are currently registered in a Math 10 class, during semester two, will be scheduled to write their Numeracy 10 Assessments during this week.

Some of these students will be required to write both assessments during the June 2022 assessment schedule.

A schedule detailing the exact times when students will write at, (based on students' Semester 2 English and Math teachers) is now available. Parents will also receive an email, at the start of June, indicating that their child is scheduled to write an assessment. The assessment schedule will be included in this email as well.

ORANGE SHIRT DAY @ GRANDVIEW

This spring, our Indigenous Department collaborated with the Visual Art and Learning Commons programs for the Grandview Heights Orange Shirt 2022 Art Contest. There were some incredible entries, we are so proud to have so many talented art students in our school! Thank you to Reija Talbourdet, Tayanna Rust, & Jade Karran for their powerful designs. This year's winning design is a collaboration of two student artists: **Alexis McDonough, grade 11**, who designed the Sweetgrass Circular and **Isabella Johnstone, grade 8**, who designed the bear.



The hybrid design, a grizzly circled by sweetgrass, represents moving forward on Truth and Reconciliation initiatives. We all walk together as we honour the strength and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples values, traditions and knowledge. In order to make innovative changes within Grandview Heights Secondary we promote the belief that relationships, connections and communication are the foundations of caregiving. It seems quite clear that in order to embrace Truth and Reconciliation at its core, we must all walk together with courage, and with good medicine while considering the Seven Generations before and protecting and nurturing the next Seven Generations. The Seven Strands of sweet grass depict this concept in the winning design, while Courage is represented by the Grizzly. May we all walk together on this journey with strong minds and open hearts. It was such a pleasure working with GHS Indigenous Students, the IGA (Tina Patterson), the Art Teacher (Christina Mears) and the Teacher Librarian (Lisa Domeier) on the Orange T-shirt Contest. - **Grandview's Indigenous Child & Youth Care Worker, Rochelle Richards**

Alexis noted that she “wanted to play the most on the circle, an important representation of life with the notion that it continues to go on, despite the hardships we may face (and have faced). Having it be made of sweetgrass, a sacred medicine that represents healing, peace, and strength, means that not only can we move forward, but we can heal as well. In the same vein, sweetgrass can be used to honour those who passed, meaning we recognize the young lives we lost to the cultural genocide that came with the Residential schools and the effects thereof. I included the feather and the beads not only because it tied my design together but because they are very recognizable aspects of many Indigenous cultures. The feather is for honour; the beads are present in our art.”



Isabella chose to do a bear because she wanted to “connect the students of Grandview Heights together being that our school logo is a Grizzly.” Bears are often a symbol of wisdom in the indigenous culture highlighted through guardians, teachers, leaders, and healers. As we continue through the reconciliation journey, the wisdom of our elders is going to be an important part of healing and moving forward.

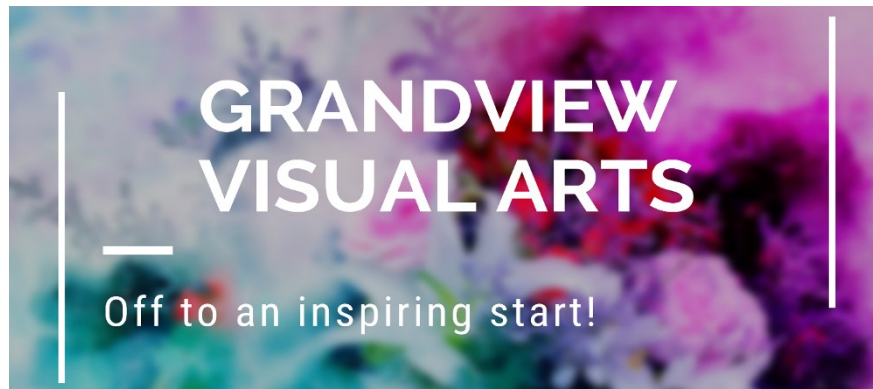

Our double art studios are well used all day, at lunchtime and after school. We had 6 art clubs including Grade 8 & Gr. 9-11 art clubs, Collage Club, Drawing Club & Photography Club. Students have enjoyed sketching in our beautiful learning spaces and in our vibrant community. They collaborated with students in other departments including a recent collab with Textiles students for the "*Trashion Fashion Show*". We enjoyed our collaborative ceramic shell projects with feeder school, Pacific Heights Elementary. Our teen students learned just as much as their grade 1-2 buddies, answering some big questions followed by touring the school.

We welcomed Craig Wardle, PE / Photography teacher to the department in second semester & his wife Alexis Wardle, Humanities / Visual Art teacher. It's been an amazing team to kick-off spring arts @GHS. Mr. Wardle took students on many Photography field trips including the Reifel Bird Sanctuary, Grandview Corners, local parks & downtown Vancouver. Visual Art 10/11's experienced a moving visit to the Museum of Anthropology for a guided tour & zine workshop of "*Xicanx, Dreamers + Changemakers*", an incredible Indigenous Mexican art activist exhibition arranged by our lovely librarian Lisa Domeier de Suarez. Our "*Post-it Note Art Show*" in the Learning Commons had over 360 entries from all grades! These mini-masterpieces were a visual smorgasbord of Grizzlies creatives. The students and staff voted on the 5 winning entries of the *Post-it Note Art Show* are: Susie Xu gr. 11, Annie Wang gr.11, Noon Ibrahim gr. 9, Savanna H. gr. 10 and Grand prize winner Siwen Zhang, gr. 11.

This fall, we will see more cross-curricular collaborations with our first Maker's Fair in early December. Grandview has a bright & creative future ahead.

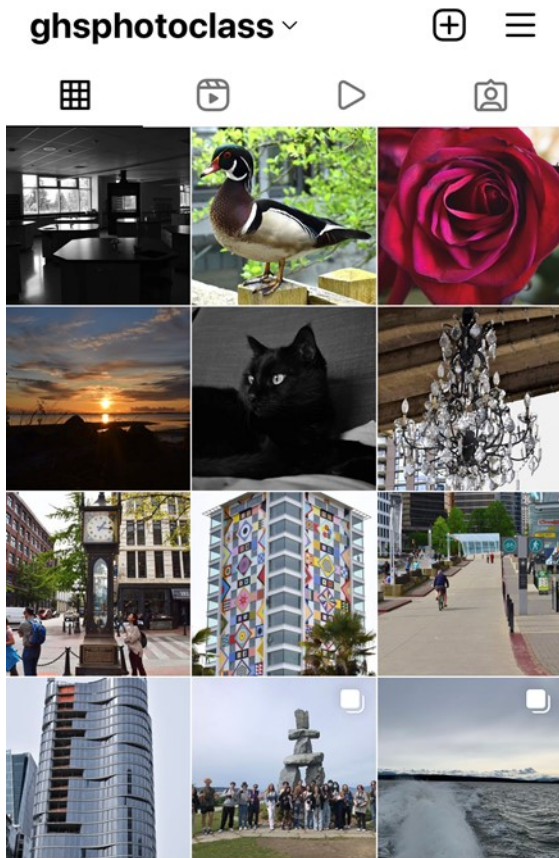

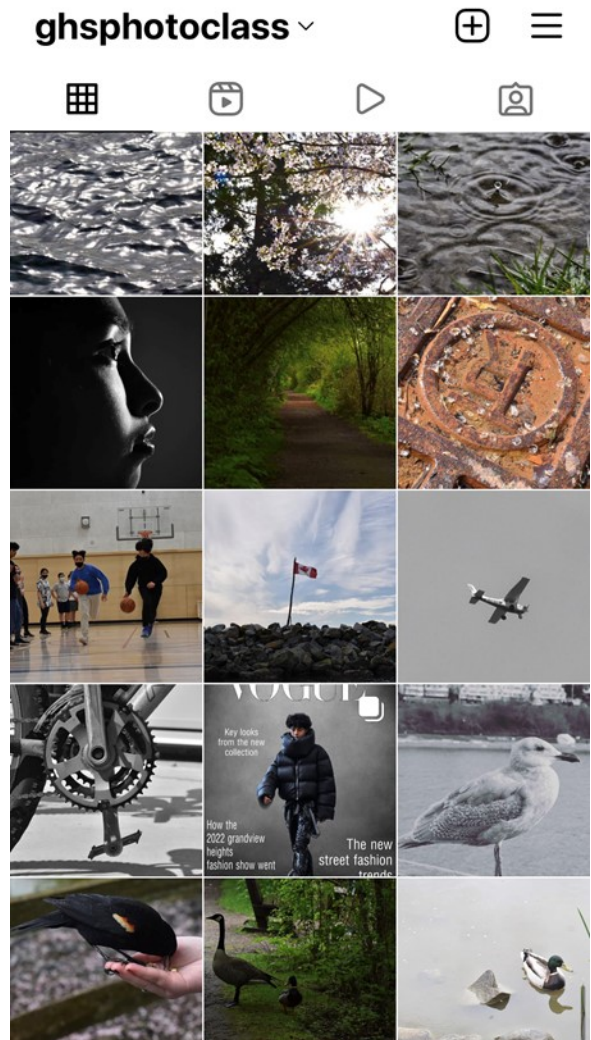




The students have been producing some excellent work, below is an example of some of their shots as part of 'Instagram Takeover'

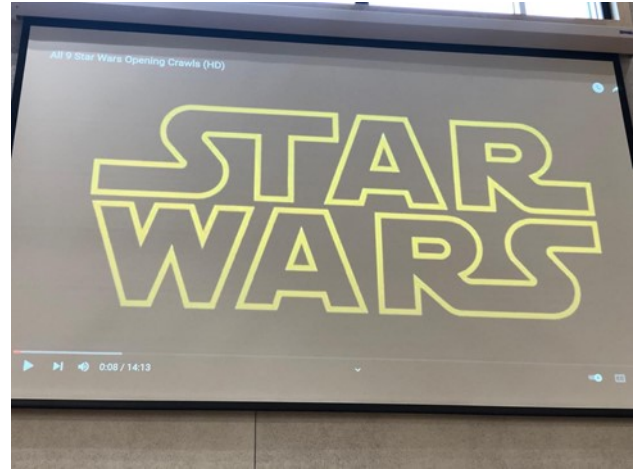

In the past week, all PE classes have had the experience of learning Wheelchair basketball, a very valuable exercise allowing students the opportunity of developing empathy and skill application.

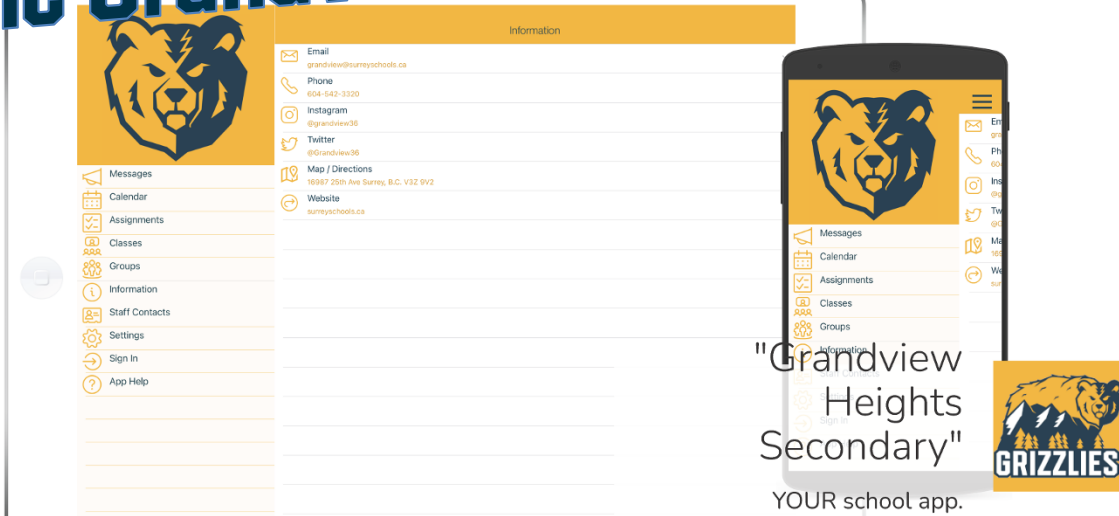
