Hello Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary!



The global movement of Pink Shirt Day traces back to 2007 in Berwick Nova Scotia, a small Canadian town with a population of 2,500.

After a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two Grade 12 students — David Shepherd and Travis Price — bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink.



With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born. It has since become a global movement.



In 2012, the United Nations declared May 4 as Anti-Bullying Day.

Now, the last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink

Shirt/anti-bullying day.

Corey Bulpitt is an internationally recognized artist from the Haida Na7ikun-Rayen Clan.



This indicates the welcoming and respect of others and serves as a friendly greeting which is used throughout Coast Salish communities, with similar gestures used throughout communities in the Northwest Coast.

### **Traffic Safety**



Traffic safety around Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary is a critical priority for our community. With increased enrollment, the number of vehicles navigating around and within our school grounds also increases.
