Parent parking, Drop off and Pick up

Parents are asked NOT to drop off or pick up students directly in front of our school's main entrance/corridor or along King George Boulevard. For safety we ask you to move along the west side of the parking lot (past the portable) or park your vehicle in the parking lot to ensure steady flow of traffic coming off King George Boulevard.

Please do not line up on King George Boulevard, in either the slow lane and /or the curb lane, as this is obstructing traffic flow on King George Boulevard.

Also, construction has begun on condominiums behind our school along 94A avenue and 135th street. During the school days, these roads are not easily passible. If you are accustomed to dropping off your student in this area, we encourage you to drop them on the west side of Queen Elizabeth Meadows park, along 135th street instead. It is a very short walk from there to the school and if students are dropped there at 8:20am, there is plenty of time to get to class before school begins.








Examples of racism could include making fun of someone's accent, or calling somebody's food "smelly'






