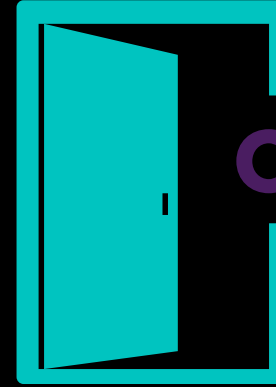

- Offered in semester #2 at Frank Hurt and Guildford Park
- A "C" or better in Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Ability to work independently
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Dexterity & good physical condition
- Four weeks of technical training at KPU Cloverdale

Vancouver Community College Partner



Collision & Refinishing Common Core

- 28-week program at VCC's Broadway Campus
- Successful completion of Math 10 and English Language Arts 11
- Possess a mechanical aptitude & interest
- Minimum of an "L" driver's licence
- Basic computer skills & access to an internet connected device

Heavy Mechanical Trades Foundation

- 36-week program at VCC's Broadway Campus
- Must be in grade 11 to apply
- Successful completion of Math 11 & English Language Arts 11 or 12
- Automotive Tech 11 required
- Automotive Tech 12 recommended
- An "L" or "N" driver's licence

For the LOVE of Food...

Baking & Pastry Arts



- 23-week program at VCC's downtown campus
- Successful completion of Math 10, Science 10 and English Language Arts 11
- Program starts in July
- Work experience component to the program
- Current Food Safe Level 1 Certificate
- As many foods & nutrition courses as possible

Culinary Arts



- 21-week program at Tamanawis Secondary School
- Program runs in semester #2
- Successful completion of grade 10 required
- Current Food Safe Level 1 Certificate
- Desire to learn using a hands on, practical approach
- A passion for food and cooking

HAIRSTYLIST

- A two-semester program that starts in semester #2 at Studio 36 in the North Surrey Learning Centre
- Program runs Monday to Thursday with students encouraged to train in an industry setting on Fridays
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Physical ability to complete the required work
- Two three-week work experience placements



Kwantlen Polytechnic University Partner



Automotive Service Technician

- 21-week program at Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary with one month at KPU's Cloverdale Campus
- Successful completion of Math 11 with a "C" or better
- English Language Arts 11 & Auto Service Tech 11 are required
- Physics 11 or a Science 11 is strongly recommended
- Possess a mechanical aptitude & interest
- An "L" or "N" driver's licence

Piping

- 28-week program located at Panorama Ridge Secondary
- Successful completion of Math 10 and English Language Arts 10
- Program starts in February and ends mid-August
- Physics 11 recommended
- Good hand-eye coordination

Kwantlen Polytechnic University Partner



Millwright

- 24-week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic's Cloverdale Campus
- Program runs February-July
- Completion of grade 11
- Minimum of a "C" in Math 11 and English Language Arts 11
- Physics 11 is recommended
- Physically able to complete the work required

Welding

- 28-week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Cloverdale Campus
- Programs starts February
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a minimum of a "C"
- Completion of grade 11 recommended
- Manual dexterity & agility
- Physically able complete to the work required



Explorations in Aviation Careers

- Offered in semester #2 at North Surrey Secondary
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Maturity
- Ability to work independently
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Five weeks at BCIT's Aerospace Campus
- Three-week work experience placement

Horticulture



CADD/ Drafting

- Six-week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Langley campus
- Program runs February to March
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a "C"
- Strong interest and marks in science
- Particular interest in botany
- Physically able to do the work required

- Computer Aided Design & Drafting located at KPU's Cloverdale campus
- Students attend two evenings a week
- Successful completion of Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Must be enrolled in or have completed CADD/Drafting 11 or 12
- Recommended students be in grade 11 prior to starting the program

Nursing Prep

- Considering a career in nursing?
- Program runs in semester #2 in partnership with Kwantlen Polytechnic University's Surrey campus
- Students need to have successfully completed Language Arts 12 with a minimum C+, as well as Chem 11 and Anatomy & Physiology 12 with a minimum of a B
- Excellent attendance & punctuality
- Strong speaking and listening skills
- Students receive 4 high school dual credit courses



Early Childhood Education

- Interested in working with young children?
- Program runs in semester #2 in partnership with Douglas College
- Students need to have successfully completed Language Arts 12, as well as Science 11 and Math 11 requirements
- Excellent attendance & punctuality
- Strong speaking and listening skills
- Students complete 10 weeks of theory coursework prior to a 200-hour practicum experience
- Upon successful completion of the program students receive an Early Childhood Educator Assistant License

SIMON FRASER
UNIVERSITY

- Offered at SFU's Surrey Campus & Surrey College
- Students must be prepared to complete graduation requirements in first semester of grade 12
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 12 with a "C+" or better with excellent written communication skills
- Strong math skills – foundations or pre-calculus recommended
- Identify as an Indigenous person

Metal Fabrication



- 23-week program at Kwantlen Polytechnic's Cloverdale Campus
- Program runs February-July
- Math 10 & English Language Arts 10 completed with a minimum of a "C"
- Manual dexterity & agility
- Physically able to complete the work required

Electrical




- Program located at Princess Margaret Secondary School
- Program starts in February and runs into mid-July
- Successful completion of grade 10
- Completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Physics 11 or Chemistry 11



PAINTER & DECORATOR



- Offered in semester #2 at the BC Finishing Trades Institute in Surrey
- Six-week program that starts in June
- Successful completion of Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Dexterity & good physical condition



CONSTRUCTION CRAFT WORKER @ LiUNA Training Plus

- Offered by LiUNA in semester #2
- Four-week program that starts the end of June
- Candidates need to have all graduation requirements prior to program start
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Physical ability to engage in manual labour, both inside and outside
- Capable of lifting 22kg/50lbs
- Able to transition into full time employment/apprenticeship following the program

Community & Public Safety CAPS



- Tuesday evenings at Queen Elizabeth Secondary
- Course runs September to December
- Students must be in grade 12 while taking the course
- Recommended "C+" or better in Math 10 & English Language Arts 10
- Applicants must have a strong interest in pursuing a career in community and public safety

Child & Youth Care Counsellor



- Course runs July – August at Princess Margaret Secondary
- Successful completion of grade 11
- Require this course with the intention to pursue a career as a Child & Youth Care Counsellor
- Capable of academic rigor

Legal Office Procedures



Graphic Design



- Course located at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Surrey campus
- Course runs July - August
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 10 with a minimum of a "C"
- Students must have successfully completed grade 11 prior to starting the course
- Basic keyboarding skills recommended
- Good communication skills, strong organizational skills and exceptional professionalism
- Interest in pursuing a career as a legal office assistant or a paralegal professional

- Course located at Simon Fraser University Surrey campus
- Course runs September to December with a combination of online & in person learning
- Successful completion of English Language Arts 10 and Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Students must have successfully completed grade 10 prior to starting the course
- Students must require this course with the intention to pursue a career in graphic design or digital media arts
- Students will be expected to put in time outside of class to learn required software and to work on projects

Health Science



- Student pays the Emily Carr course tuition
- Course is held Wednesday evenings at Guildford Park Secondary from September to December
- Students require a "C" or better in English Language Arts 11 or 12
- Students require two additional grade 11 or 12 academic courses, as well as two grade 11 or 12 electives
- Applicants are expected to meet Emily Carr academic admission requirements
- Art 11 or 12 courses recommended

- Course is located at Kwantlen Polytechnic University Surrey campus
- Course runs from July - August
- Successful completion of grade 11 is required prior to starting the course
- English Language Arts 10 & Math 10 with a minimum of a "C+"
- Require this course for the intention of pursuing a career as a nurse

Interested in applying for a District Program?

- Spend time reviewing the program information, including the brochure on the Surrey Schools web site on the Career Education page
- Visit the Career Centre at your secondary school and speak with the Career Facilitator
- Work with the Career Facilitator to complete the application
- Applications are detailed and lengthy so leave ample time to complete prior to the deadline



What happens after you have applied?

- Student applications will be submitted by the Career Facilitator to the District Career Office
- Program Coordinators and Instructors vet the applicants to create a short list of students to interview
- If granted an interview, students will prepare with their Career Facilitator to complete the interview process
- Once interviews are complete, interviewees are notified in writing as to whether they are conditionally accepted into the program
