

#### Winter Health

#### Keeping your child healthy during winter

As the chilly winter season is upon us, there's a few extra things you can do to help keep your children healthy and well. Navigate this season with these essential tips.

#### Bundle up for the cold

Dressing appropriately for the cold weather is vital in keeping your child comfortable and protected. Wearing multiple layers is a great way to trap body heat and provide insulation against the cold.

Keep a warm hat, gloves, scarves and insulated boots handy. Remind your child to wear these items before heading outside to play or going to school.

#### **Protect against winter illnesses**

Winter brings an increased risk of colds and flus. Make sure your child is getting enough sleep (nine to 11 hours for elementary-aged children), eating a variety of foods and staying hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Ensure your child receives their annual flu vaccine and talk to a health care provider about any additional vaccines that may be recommended. Teach your child good respiratory etiquette such as regular hand washing, covering their coughs and sneezes and staying home when sick. If they are sick and cannot stay away from others, they can wear a mask to reduce the risk of spreading their illness. Learn more about masks here: Masks (bccdc.ca)

#### Keep their bodies moving



- •If your child has had an episode of vomiting or diarrhea, please stay home for at least 1 day before returning to school.

#### **Reminder: Dress for the Weather**

The cold and wet weather has arrived, so please ensure your child has outdoor gear for going outside at recess, lunch and throughout the day. Having a warm rain jacket, an outside pair of boots or shoes and dry socks is important. Even if it is not raining, the grounds are wet. Please ensure your child has an extra set of pants, a clean shirt, socks and shoes at school. Thank you for your assistance!



#### Weather Related Procedures: What to Know Before It Snows!

With the weather getting chillier, and overnight temperatures hovering around zero degrees, it's important for parents, caregivers, students and staff to know the district's severe weather procedures for announcing school closures, delayed openings or cancellations.

In the event of snow, all schools in the Surrey School District will remain OPEN, except under extreme circumstances.

#### When all schools are closed:

Any districtwide closure or delayed school opening will be announced on the Surrey Schools <u>website</u> and individual school websites, as well as communicated on the district's <u>X</u> (<u>formerly Twitter</u>), <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> accounts. Staff will also receive an email.

An announcement will be made by 7 a.m. at the latest, based on the best information available at that time.

Please note: Typically, only cancellations, closures or delayed school openings will be announced. Except under extreme circumstances, no announcement will be made that schools are open.

#### When schools are open:

\*\* Student safety is our first priority and a shared responsibility. As always, parents and caregivers may choose to make other arrangements if they don't feel it is safe to travel to school. Students will not be penalized for such absences. \*\*

To ensure safe travel to and from school, families who choose to attend should plan ahead by:

- allowing extra travel time, to prevent rushing on icy or wet roads;
- checking transit schedules and routes, to plan alternative transportation if needed; and
- wearing weather-appropriate footwear to avoid slips and falls.

#### How are school closures decided?

Given the varying weather conditions across Surrey and White Rock, a variety of factors are considered before a decision to close schools is made. The district takes the following steps in determining whether to delay opening or close schools due to weather:

 Designated staff members travel predetermined routes to assess conditions at and around school sites.

- A recommendation to close schools or cancel buses is discussed with key district
  personnel, as well as neighbouring school districts. Student and staff safety are always
  our top priority.
- A variety of factors are taken into consideration, including road, sidewalk and parking lot conditions, and issues such as power outages and other emergent matters.

# Weather-related closures, class cancellations and delayed school openings



In the event of inclement weather, we want to remind families, students and staff about where to find information and how we make decisions to cancel classes, delay school openings or alter bus service due to weather.

All schools in the Surrey School District will remain OPEN if at all possible, except under extreme circumstances.

#### **HOW ARE DECISIONS MADE?**

The Surrey School District covers a large geographic area, so conditions at individual school sites may vary. A variety of factors are considered before a decision is made, including:

- Road, sidewalk, school and parking lot conditions;
- Issues such as power outages and other emergent matters.



#### WHEN WILL I KNOW?

A decision to close or delay opening schools districtwide will be made by 7 a.m. at the latest, based on the best information available at that time.
