



Take an online course with SAIL (Surrey Academy for Innovative Learning) Pay attention to course completion deadlines used by institutions you are applying for




Take a course in Night School with Continuing Education at Queen Elizabeth Secondary



Take courses in summer school (information available in the Spring, students who have graduated in June are eligible for one more summer term) Keep in mind courses for summer school may not count towards post-secondary applications What if I graduate high school but need to make up courses later?

- Academic upgrading available at the postsecondary level as well
- Good option for students who have taken a gap year and may be missing courses required for a specific program

14% Health care and social assistance



Trades & Apprenticeships

- Over the next decade, there will be about 85,000 job openings in trades.
- Nearly half of these will be in construction trades.

Gap Year

- Focus on values, and skill development
- Job opportunities, working with current skills and strengths
- Volunteer, gain experience, develop skills, discover interests
- Make a plan for moving forward
- Upgrading high school classes
- Continuing education for professional development (First Aid, CPR Training, Food Safe, Computer Skills, Resume workshops, etc)
- In BC, 51% of students typically go directly to post-secondary after graduation. By the time students are 29 years old, 81% of students have attended some post-secondary (4 out of 5)
- Education is always waiting for them







Information you should be gathering now

If planning to pursue post-secondary next year, gathering information is important

- Know the requirements different schools / programs different requirements
- Find out the applications dates (open / close...most post secondaries opened October 1)
- Financial aid and housing deadlines
- Attend campus tours
- Attend program information sessions
- Make an appointment with an academic advisor
- Talk to people who are working in the field you want to pursue (job shadow, volunteer, informational interviews)



How to apply to Post-Secondary

- 1. Go directly to post-secondary website, specific program, "apply now"
- 2. Create an account on educationplannerbc.ca
- 3. Complete applications on education planner
- 4. Pay application fee with a credit card
- 5. Send transcripts through the Student Transcript Service on the BCeID website
- 6. Once you submit an application, you will receive a confirmation email
- 7. Feb / March conditional letters of acceptance go out
- 8. May / June official acceptance and registration dates sent out


Tips / Reminders

- Double and TRIPLE check your application to ensure accuracy
- Changes cannot be made once you hit submit
- Ensure you are checking off the option to allow post-secondary's to access your transcripts
- Keep an eye on your email
- Do not use your Surrey Schools email for anything!



BCelD and Student Transcript Service





- First students register for a BASIC BCelD
- Then students register for the <u>Student Transcript Service</u>
- Personal Education Number (PEN) is required, as well as legal name and birthdate
- You must confirm your registration through email within 24 hours or your account will be deleted
- You can choose to send your transcripts to multiple post-secondary institutions here – only send your transcript AFTER you've applied to each school
- Detailed instructions on how to create an account on the Student Transcript Services (STS) website are posted on the NS Grad 2025 Info Team under the Transcripts channel

Understanding Open vs. Limited vs. Competitive Intake

Open

- Often used in college / small universities
- Applications stay open, no limit on seats
- Grades not taken into consideration beyond min. requirements
- Examples: most KPU programs

Limited

- Has a set number of seats per application cycle
- Applications stay open until classes are full
- Often have specific requirements (grades, courses)
- Nursing programs, fashion design, trades programs

Competitive Intake

- Typically used in universities
- They want the best applicants
- Will have a closing date and will evaluate each qualified application after this date and admit a set number of the best applicants

UBC Stats, as an example

- ◆ For the 2023/2024 school year, UBC assessed over 52,000 undergraduate applications
- ◆ UBCV admitted 52% of applicants
- ◆ UBCO admitted 76% of applicants
- → GPAaverage
 - ◆ 89-91 percent for UBCV
 - ◆ 84-86% for UBCO

UBC vs SFU vs KPU

UBC

- Competitive intake
- Consider grade 11/12 marks
- Must have a language 11
- Min. 70% English 11/12
- Recommended to have 6 grade 12 courses in addition to English 12
- Need to complete UBC Personal Profile volunteering, athletics, etc. are taken into consideration
- Must have a PROFICIENT or 3/4 on the Literacy 12 Assessment
- Tuition for 1st year about \$7,300 \$13,500

SFU

- Competitive intake
- Consider grade 11/12 marks
- Must have a language 11
- Min. 70% in English 12
- Must have 5 approved grade 12 courses
- Tuition per year \$7,300 11,750

KPU

- Open / Limited intakes
- Min. C+in English 12 for all arts, science and business programs
- Limited intake programs may have more specific requirements
- Tuition per year about \$6,000



UBC – Personal Profile

- Comprehensive and holistic approach to looking at applicants
- Combination of academic coursework, grades and other accomplishments (academic and non-academic), and experiences outside the classroom
- 2023/2024 82,000+ personal profiles were reviewed
 - Virtual UBC Application
 Workshops available on UBC's website

Application Reminders

- If you apply to 3 post-secondary's you must pay 3 application fees
- Have your payment ready application fees require credit card payments
- If you are accepted to a post-secondary, you will receive a letter outlining when you have to make your decision by.



- To secure your seat you must pay an acceptance fee
 this fee will go towards your tuition.
- Around \$200-500 for domestic / International students \$5,000
- Ensure you receive confirmation that your application was submitted. Check junk folders in your email.

** If you are planning to apply or be considered for Entrance Scholarships – check the deadlines – some happen in November!!

Common Routes to Your Educational Goal

The Direct Route

Enter post-secondary institution directly from high school.

The Transfer Route

Start at one institution, then transfer to another institution.

The Transfer Route

- For some students, starting at a smaller PSI and then transferring to a larger institution is a good option.
- Direct entry from high school to large universities (UBC / SFU / UVic) is more difficult than getting into a smaller institution (KPU / Douglas) and transferring after 2 yrs.
- It's less competitive to transfer after 2 yrs to the universities
- They also find mature students with some post-secondary experience desirable
- Your final degree will be from the institution you finish at
- It is also less expensive than completing an entire Bachelor's at a large university

How to Stay Informed:

- Browse the university and college websites to get the most up to date admission and prerequisite information
- Register for post-secondary Open Houses, Campus Tours and Virtual Info Sessions
- · Call and make an appointment with an advisor at the post-secondary school you want to attend
- Be organized documents, transcripts, references, application deadlines



Commencement


- ► Monday, June 2nd, 2025 at the Bell Performing Arts Centre at 6 pm (start time)
