Indigenous Grad Requirement



- All students must successfully complete a minimum of 1 course (4 credits) in Indigenous-focused coursework. There is no change to the total number of credits required to graduate, which remains at 80.
- WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?
- At North Surrey, students can satisfy this requirement by <u>choosing at least</u> <u>one</u> of the following courses:
- BC First Peoples 12 (in Gr. 11 or 12 which also satisfies Socials 12 requirement)
- English First Peoples 12 in grade 12

Education is a journey: Use this Time to EXPLORE

Grade 10 - 12 is a 3-year plan of discovery!

- Talk with family members, teachers, coaches and ask them how they got to where they are

 - > Let these points guide your decision making



Post-Secondary Considerations

- Post Secondary Schools have their OWN course requirements depending on what you want to study
- It is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to do research on this! It can be time consuming and overwhelming.
- It is your responsibility to stay updated on changing requirements and needs for post secondary admission.


Choosing the Math course that is right for you:

There are 3 senior Math courses offered:

- Math Foundations 11 & 12
 - For students interested in University studies
- Pre-Calculus 11 & 12
 - For students interested in University studies
- Math Workplace 11
 - Designed for entry into many college/trades programs and the workplace

Consider the following:

- > If you have math this semester, talk with your teacher & heed their recommendation.
- > If you have math next semester, talk to your teacher from last year or refer to your experience in previous math class.
- If you are in Workplace Math 10, you will take Workplace Math 11.



Language Courses

You do not need a Language course to graduate.

UBC and SFU no longer require a Language 11 for admission.

This is a big change for students entering post-secondary from September 2025 onwards.

If you are applying to post-secondaries outside of BC, please their individual language requirements!

Extra Courses (9th course before or after school)

Students may also select a 9th additional course in the following areas. These courses take place before or after school:

New Hybrid Learning Courses:

Career Life Connections 12- Hybrid option

This course will be in-person three days one week, and two days in-person the following week. When students are not in class, they will be working on assignments, as well as the final capstone project. There will also be tutorial time outside of your in-class days where you can check in with your teacher.

E-Commerce 12- Hybrid delivery only

This course will be in-person three days one week, and two days in-person the following week. Time not in class will be used for a combination of hybrid learning and field study opportunities within the community. There will be tutorial time outside of the in-class days.

Accounting 11

Thinking of going into Business? This entry-level accounting course is a must have for any student considering a career in Business.

Students will learn the fundamentals of accounting, basic book-keeping concepts, Excel and accounting software. Whether you are going to run your own business or simply balance a cheque book, this course is for you!

Note: This course is open to both grade 11 and 12 students.

There are other ways to get credits

- Take a course during Summer School or Online.
- Submit documentation to counsellor for:
 - courses completed outside of the district, province or country
 - completed external credits i.e. sports, music, dance, lifesaving, driver's education (ICBC).

Please see your counsellor if any of these apply to you, or if you have any questions regarding external credits

Summer School

- If you do not meet the learning outcomes of a core academic course, it is recommended that you speak with your counsellor to review options. One option may be summer school.
- ▶ <u>NOTE</u>: Summer school is a *BIG* decision because it condenses 5 months of school-work into 5 weeks.
- When entering course requests in MYED PLEASE indicate in the Counsellor's Notes section if you are planning on taking a course in summer school and what course you would want it to replace in your schedule
- Pay attention to registration dates, you will want to register ASAP as summer school fills up quickly

Online Courses

You may choose to cross enroll with SAIL to take an additional course to advance ahead, or to take a course that you may not have in your schedule.

Please consider the following characteristics of what a successful online learner looks like:

- Independent learner
- Self-motivated
- Skilled with written communication
- Able to set a schedule and keep it
- Able to meet deadlines

When entering course requests in MYED PLEASE indicate in the Counsellor's Notes section if you are planning on taking a course online and what course you would want it to replace in your schedule

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I take all academic classes?

- We recommend you balance your schedule with academic and elective courses
- Keep in mind if you want to do well, you only have so much time to complete homework and so this has to be something you think about is it better to take less "hard" courses and do well as opposed to take everything but get lower marks as a result

2. What do I do if my marks aren't high enough for the program entry to certain Universities?

- Apply to multiple programs that have different entry requirements
- Ask yourself, "Am I ready for this program"
- ► Colleges have many prerequisite courses and so you can start your program of study there and transfer at a later date.

FAQ's continued...

- 3. Do I need to take EVERY science 11 and science 12 for post-secondary?
 - ▶ No, check admission requirements for each post-secondary
 - You may want to consider summer school as an option if you are hoping to take all three Sciences.
- 4. How do I decide what Math course to take? If I have 60% in Pre-Calculus 11,
- will I be successful in Pre-Calculus 12? (I plan to work harder and get a tutor)
 - ► It is not uncommon to drop 10-15%; Discuss with your math teacher if they feel you will be successful in Gr. 12 and be open to their feedback - your teacher is the expert in the curriculum and knows your ability (even despite your effort)
 - Consider Math Foundations as an option if it meets the requirement for your post-secondary options.

FAQ's continued...

5. Can I go to university having only completed Foundations of Math 11?

▶ Yes, but check requirements of each institution and each faculty

6. If I go to summer school or take a course online, can I get ahead the following year?

➤ There is NO guarantee a student can take a class that is a year above their grade level because priorities go to the students in that grade. If you take a summer school course, please be prepared to take an elective course in place of the course you requested if there is no space in it

7. Can I choose my teacher or my block order?

▶ No, the computer generates your schedule - counsellors do their best to review each schedule and balance WHERE POSSIBLE

Please Know:

- North Surrey tries their best to honour these REQUESTS but due to a number of factors all students may not end up with all the classes they hoped for (singletons, conflicts, offerings)
- Please thoughtfully select your alternate classes (minimum 2), as we may need to use them if we cannot make your original requests work.
- If you are selecting a course at the next grade level, please know that priority is given to students with time-sensitive graduation concerns.
