- The first thing to do is to check with the school principal what's allowed Food trucks have a direct contract with the school district. They have a business license with the City of Surrey. School admin usually sign the contract and they send it for the district. Two food trucks are allowed, the third should be an exception. Forms could be obtained from the principal usually.
- No bouncy castles are allowed on school grounds, but inflatable carnival games are ok.
 Mini golf is ok
- For volunteers, connect with high school students and give them volunteer hours
- Ask parents to bring shades if needed
- Signage, stamps for each table, prizes could be donated

Coupon Books

- This is fundraiser with low volunteers needed
- Community Values had cut the books into regions (Surrey and Langley has a waitlist)
- The end of the fundraiser is the hardest for books to be paid
- Encouragement the classroom with most amount of books sold
- 35\$ per book
