Why Fundraise?



2. If you have ordered with us previously, login with the same information, update your child's class when prompted, and order as usual.

If this is your first time ordering, click on the "register here" link. You will be prompted to verify your school. Click "yes"






3. Create your account by filling in your name, email, and create your password. Click "Create My Account".

NOTE Use an email that you check regularly. You will receive 2 emails when you place an order. One confirming your order, and another that you have paid. Make sure that you receive these emails, otherwise your order will not go through and your child will not receive hot lunch.



4. Select whether you would like to receive a reminder the day before hot lunch.




5. Enter your child's name and select their grade and division. Make sure their division is correct as that is where their lunch will be delivered to. Select "Add a child" if you have more than one child at Maple Green to add them for your future ordering.




6. When you set up your account, it will ask if you would like to order hot lunch. Click on the Lunch session. For future hot lunches, click "Order Lunch" at the top of the page.




7. Select the items on the left that you would like to order for the first child by clicking on them. Click on the green "select" arrow. Your child's order will appear on the right hand side. Click "finish" when done.




8. Verify your order and click "next" if it is correct for this child.




9. Check your order and click "yes, this is correct" to proceed or "no, go back and edit" to make changes.



10. If you have additional children at the school to order for, click "create another lunch order" and follow the previous steps for each child. When you have finished ordering for all of your children, click "Next".



11. Fill in your credit card information and submit to make payment. Once it is processed, you will see a payment "Success" message. You should now have 2 emails. One confirming the order and one confirming payment. Please make sure the payment email is received as your order may be cancelled if payment hasn't been processed.

Medical Alerts



Parents should ensure that the school is informed of any medical conditions which require emergency response. There are forms at the office for students with life threatening

allergies, asthma, seizures etc. Please make sure that all information is up to date and any medication that is needed is labeled and all information is current. When a child needs medications at school, particular District policies must be followed. Please make sure to see the office if this pertains to your child.

Visitors at Maple Green

All visitors must sign in at the main office counter and receive a visitor badge prior to entering any classrooms. Teachers will not be allowing parents to enter the classroom directly through their outside classroom doors.

Get Routines Established Early

- planners signed
- nightly reading time
- set homework place and time-free from distractions
- assignment calendar for quick reference
- lots of sleep

Eat Healthy

Give your child's mind the fuel it needs to be alert. Keep nutritional snacks, such as cut up fruit and vegetables, cheese sticks, low fat yogurt and butter free popcorn, on hand.





Review Safety Tips

- make sure your kids know safe routes to and from school
- know their address and phone number

Get lots of sleep

- establish a bedtime routine that allows for calming down time free of tv, and video games
- this is the perfect time to share in a read aloud of a favorite story
- research shows that there should be NO SCREEN TIME 30 minutes prior to bedtime for optimal sleep



Optional Student Accident Insurance

Did you know that the Surrey School District does not insure expenses for student injuries that happen on school grounds or during school activities? You are responsible for these expenses as a parent or guardian.

Several private insurance providers offer accident insurance to help cover unexpected expenses. Parents interested in purchasing student accident insurance are encouraged to select a provider and plan that best meets their family's needs. For added convenience, Surrey Schools provides information on available options through Insure My Kids and Student Accident.

Some of the Plan features:

- Provides coverage 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, in or out of school.
- Coverage for expenses that may be limited or excluded under MSP, private, or group insurance plans—such as private tutoring, lump-sum payments for fractures and dislocations, counseling services, and more (see plan details for a full list)
- Covers injury related **Dental** (including future expenses).
- Ambulance fees
- Covers injury related Eyeglasses (limits may apply).
- Annual premiums range from \$17 \$33 per student.
 (Discounts are available for families with 3 or more children).

Combined-grade classes: Learning together

Combined-grade classes consist of students in two consecutive grades grouped together in one class. They are common both locally and internationally, with "one out of every five Canadian students enrolled in a multi-grade classroom" according to at least one study. There is a good chance that Surrey children will have the experience of being in a combined-grade class during their elementary school years.

Organizing classes to best meet the needs of all students is a complex process. While practical factors such as shifting enrolment, class size and composition influence the formation of classes, the Surrey School District is committed to creating balanced classes that focus on students' learning strengths and the needs of the whole child.

There are academic as well as social benefits to combined-grade classes. Studies indicate that children in combined classes do as well academically as children in single grades.

Research has shown that combined classes:

- allow students learn from one another,
- provide models for younger students,
- help older students see what they've already learned,
- provide opportunities for a greater range of learning,
- encourage students to work together,
- promote social responsibility,
- help students to become independent and
- foster a positive attitude toward school.

Students in combined classes are not held back to the level of younger students, nor are they expected to handle work beyond their ability. In every classroom, there is a wide range of skills and abilities. Children mature at different rates in various aspects of development. Teachers are aware of these individual differences and structure

learning activities according to the needs of each learner.

Children learn continually; their intellectual, social and personal development does not occur in discrete steps according to grade level. Studies have found that on average, a single-grade class



includes students whose development spans five years. The developmental range in a combined class is not significantly different.

Within the combined class there will be children of both grade levels with similar levels of performance. Whether a child is gifted or needs considerable assistance, each will be challenged to excel as much in a combined class as he or she would be in a single-grade class.

Researchers have reported successful learning is less dependent on how students are grouped into classes, than on the quality of instructional practices.
