# 7:18-7:51 PM – Principal/Vice Principal Report

- Over 70 students over projection, some students needed to redirect to Morgan Elementary
  School
- 25 Divisions this year
- Ms. Hamilton has moved from Peace Arch to become Grade 1 teacher and portable not originally being used for a classroom will now be converted to a classroom
- Permanent classes established September 11
- Thoughtful consideration put into class placements

- Soccer team being established by Ms. Terepocki for 6/7's
- Terry Fox Run Friday, September 20<sup>th</sup> with help from Parent volunteers
- Open house 4:30-5:30 open classrooms then BBQ from 5-6:30 Sept 19<sup>th</sup>
- Intermediate presentation proposed as an additional event (Equity/Diversity/Acceptance/Inclusion) Nashaka (sp?) as a speaker – Diane Bradley will give info to PAC
- Rocket fuel Discussed whether or not continue to Rocket Fuel on Munch a Lunch. Hot lunch begins October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Will continues to offer option to contribute to Rocket Fuel to help other families in need. Contributions did decrease last year as the cost of the food items have increased.
- Rainbow crosswalk plans to meet with president chair of Surrey Pride Society to discuss doing a community grant
- Outdoor learning area proposal accepted. Site inspection done and a plan being made now.
- Parent asked about if we get more increase of funds due to increased enrolment in the Surrey school district. School trustees are pushing for more funding. The district did not expect the huge increase in enrolment so doing catch up and trying to be creative with different deliveries for models of education
- Playground areas will be kept open including gates normally after school. Sometimes custodians aren't aware that it is usually kept unlocked
- Multicultural events that take place are Lunar New Year, Indigenous speakers, Ramadan, Diwali, LGBTQ/acceptance/inclusion, SOGI, equity and diversity, discussion happens school wide and cin individual classes (included in the curriculum)
- Special holidays we would encourage committees to be made. This year we would like to celebrate/emphasize Black History Month
- Towards last year we have selected Cultural Liaison's to help inform PAC of needs, concerns and improve diversity and culture in the school.
- Idea of including other language links to school newsletters
- Concern from parents about the gate being open/unlocked, discussed gates do need to be unlocked to be able to leave in case of emergency as the school is fully enclosed
- Emergency Drills for earthquake, fire, intruders done throughout the year to prepare students

# 7:51-7:57 PM – Treasurer Report

- Current expenses this year include \$100 spent for BC PAC membership, \$336 Munch a lunch fee, \$2685.90 from Capital project New athletic jerseys
- Anticipated budgets include: Sister school donation \$2500, Admin \$1000, Health & Safety -\$1000, Multicultural events \$1000, Graduation - \$5000, Teacher Appreciation - \$1700, Capital project - \$10,000, In school experiences - \$11,000 (school cannot ask parents to pay for in school experiences), Teacher discretionary - \$7500, Teacher requests/project funding - \$1000, Welcome back bbq \$1500, Technology upgrades \$10,000, School wide presentations/fine arts - \$12000, Book fair - \$200, Spirit events - \$200
- Overall every year we require around \$70,000
- Usually we make \$23,000-28,000 from Hot lunch proceeds

- Hot lunch program done every Thursday in 3 month allotments. Ordering will be open Monday to start on October 3<sup>rd</sup>. New vendors kiki's Greek food, booster juice, cha time, jojos chicken and some special hot lunch days during cultural holidays. Volunteers needs to help deliver lunches in classrooms, and we need teams for Thursdays to organize lunches. Sign up sheet will be made for volunteering for organizing and then class parents will arrange for hot lunch distribution for the individual classes
