It is with great excitement we think to next week and welcoming all of our students and families to our new school! There has been so much work completed at Theresa Clarke to prepare for opening day. We hope that all of you have enjoyed a summer filled with family, friends, and rejuvenation.

On Monday August 25, Knowledge Keeper Chris Silver and his sister Melissa Sam, both in relation to the Kwantlen First Nation, completed a ceremonial cedar brushing of the entire school. The purpose being to cleanse the school's energy in preparation for our students' arrival on September 2. Chris offered a welcome to the land and a prayer song before starting the cleanse. All witnesses had an opportunity to be brushed as well. At Theresa Clarke Elementary, we hold our hands up in gratitude to Chris, Melissa, and the Kwantlen people for helping open our school in a good way.

Below is very important information about our return to school. Please read carefully and contact us if you have any questions. Please check our <u>school's website</u> regularly for updates and information.

Questions and Answers

Q: Where does my child go on the first day of school?

A: Our first day of school is Tuesday September 2. This first day's purpose is to welcome families and students and to confirm attendance so we can begin organizing classes. Students will be meeting in grade groups. Please see the map below that shows where grade groups will be **dropped off and picked up** on Day 1 September 2. Please have your children go to their designated area. Please don't hesitate to call Isha or Jennifer in the office with questions at 604-595-4048.

Q: My child is newly registered to attend Theresa Clarke. Where do they go?

A: While all of our students are new to Theresa Clarke, some have just recently registered. If this is your child, please check-in at the office before bringing your child to their designated grade group area (refer to map).

Q: When do students come to school on Tuesday September 2?

A: For students in Grades 1 - 6 school is in session from 10 - 11am

Q: Where does my child go on the 2nd day of school?

A: Your child will meet their grade group in a designated area. Please refer to the map below for details on where your child will be dropped off and picked up. Day 2 is a full school day 8:35am – 2:28pm.

Q: My child is in Kindergarten, when do they come to school on September 2?

A: Students in Kindergarten come to school from 10 - 10:30am.

Q: I have not yet registered my child. How do I do this?

A: All registration is now done online. To register your child, please go to <u>here</u>.

Q: Where can I find the school supply list and can I order online?

A: School supplies can be purchased on your own or from School Start – follow the "Quick Links" tab (at top of page) from Theresa Clarke's website <u>here.</u>

Q: Why is there no Kindergarten or Grade 1 supply list?

A: Our Kindergarten and Grade 1 teachers will be purchasing bulk supplies and asking for \$40 per student.

Q: How do I pay for school related items?

A: Theresa Clarke Elementary prefers cashless payments that can be made online. To do this, please create a CASH ONLINE account here. You will be notified when items are added to your account. The final page on this document has information on how to setup a CASH ONLINE account.

Q: When will I know what class my child is in?

A: We will be working diligently to welcome students, confirm numbers and organize classes. Organizing classes is a very important process that requires adequate time and patience. You can anticipate information regarding class placement no later than the end of the second week of school.

Q: What if my child will be away on the first day of school?

A: It is VERY IMPORTANT that you inform the school right away by phone 604-595-4048 or email at theresaclarke@surreyschools.ca

Q: Where does my child go on the 2nd day of school?

A: Your child will meet in the same area as Day 1. Day 2 is a full school day 8:30am – 2:28pm.




Why sign up for School Cash Online?

Credit Card

eCheck

An electronic version of a paper check used to make payments online. Anyone with a checking or savings account can pay by eCheck on *School Cash Online*.



myWallet

An online wallet that can be loaded to hold funds and pay for your child's fees on *School Cash Online*. myWallet also allows you to allocate funds to pay for school fees at a later date.
