New Kindergarten student registration for our neighbourhood and fine arts program will be taking place soon. A lottery system for the Fine Arts program will take place for new kindergartens interested in this program. Applications for the Fine Arts K program open on January 27<sup>th</sup> and closes on February 14. All Kindergartens need to be registered first before getting into the Kindergarten Fine Arts Lottery.

# Sick Students

#### When to Keep Your Sick Child Home

For the protection of your child, as well as other children, keep your child home if he/she:

- -Has a fever, cough, runny nose, cold symptoms
- -Is too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- -Has a suspected or known communicable

disease (ie. strep throat, pink eye, chicken pox, or any other undiagnosed rash).



Keep them home until they are no longer infectious. Please let the school know your child's symptoms.
