

Course: Philosophy 12

Description: Philosophy 12 is an academic course that prepares students for academic post-secondary studies.

This course will help you question every aspect of your own life – why you do what you do, why you think what you think, and why you feel what you feel. You will learn about the history of philosophical thought, where the different branches originated, and where they can take your thinking. You will use the three main divisions, metaphysics, epistemology, and value theory to develop your own thoughts.

Students will complete units on methods of research, reasoning and argument, metaphysics and the nature of reality, ontological theories of being, epistemological theories about knowledge and truth, and the theories of morality and ethics.
