Principal's Report - Keri Stanger

- Interim reports sent out today Oct 12 with the kids
- Shakedown will happen Oct 20th
- No school Oct 21 Pro D day
- Nov 9 Remembrance day assembly

- Regarding the budget: there are some new rules regarding bouncy castles etc so need to talk about it before booking anything.
- Immunizations will be this coming Tuesday Oct 18
- It has been 1.5 months that Grade 6's have not had a teacher. Finally teachers have been hired: Ms. Sonia Athwal (M/T/W) and Ms. Alex Nichol (TH/Fri)
- Teachers felt class parents are not needed for classes, as there is email communication. But as parents you can ask if they need help/volunteers.
- Money for technology will be needed by school as there are a few ipads that need replacing
- There is an anti-gang seminar coming up. It is to do with Safe Surrey anti-gang empowerment. How gangs work and safe community will be sending info out for parents
- Reminder no sweets or goodies are allowed to be sent to school as some people can't eat them and some parents can't send it for their kids.
- Drop off and pickup issues although we are lucky we have 2/3 pickup and drop-off areas compared to other schools
- As per school district no full face masks and no weapon replicas allowed for Halloween
- Bullying policy and process:
 - Bullying is **<u>not</u>** when kids call each other names
 - Bullying is when the behaviour is ongoing and it is degrading, etc
 - Some kids have difficulty getting along and they may feel bullied although they are not
 - Most problems at playgrounds is communication
 - If there was real bullying then it would get explored
 - Would get info from kids and the parents
 - Depending on severity will bring in Safe Surrey or police
 - If little kids will have more of a talk and bring in more people as needed
 - If bullying is severe can lead to suspension. Ms. Stanger has not yet encountered this level of bullying during her time as Admin.
- Question was brought up about possible collaboration between CTS PAC and Admin to invite a speaker to discuss the topic of bullying. Ms. Stanger supports that idea and said would be good to have parents there too.
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- Any questions?
 - Question was brought up by a parent what can we do for kids during school regarding bullying
 - Some kids are just aggressive and some kids think of that as bullying but being aggressive isn't right either. What are we going to do to help with this

- Principal said a couple of things the teachers do talk about this with kids and how to speak kindly to one another and how to deal with being upset or angry
- Kids can come to principal or adult to come and talk to
- As parents we can have kids standup for themselves
- Tell you kids they have a voice they can advocate for themselves
- If kids are shy parents can also advocate for their child
- Ms Stanger did say during morning announcement she sometimes does send out reminders on being kind or reads an encouraging quote.

Other Items

- Esther brought up an opportunity at the PAC Exec level to share the DPAC Representative position with Jind. DPAC meetings take place on the last Wednesday of the month at Surrey District site. Agendas are posted on the DPAC website (surreydpac.ca). Shana V. is interested, Esther will reach out to her.
- Satvin: a gentle reminder for kids to bring utensils (fork and spoons)for hot lunch days as vendors are having issues providing and if we get it from them they will charge us a dollar for each wooden utensil.
- Also if kids have feedback regarding hot lunches would be great to hear.
- Esther: this is the last PAC meeting of the calendar year, as there will be lots of events coming up in Nov/Dec. Next PAC meeting will be in 2023.
