





# Keeping our schools safe

(Page 1 of 2)

The Surrey Board of Education is committed to providing safe and caring environments in which all learners can achieve academic excellence, personal growth and responsible citizenship. Safe and caring school environments are free of acts of:

- bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat and intimidation;
- violence of any form;
- verbal, physical or sexual abuse;
- discrimination in any form;
- theft; and
- vandalism.

Safe and caring school environments do not tolerate the presence of:

- intoxicating or banned substances;
- weapons (or replica weapons) and explosives;
- intruders or trespassers.

Responsibility for an effective discipline program is shared among many partners including the district, schools, students, parents/guardians, community groups, social agencies and the RCMP. The board promotes understanding and acceptance of the interactive roles required to achieve safe and caring schools.

#### It is expected that students will:

- (a) neither take part in, nor condone (provoke, encourage, or support) any form of violence, including bullying, harassment, threat and intimidation, verbal, physical or sexual abuse, discrimination in any form;
- (b) seek to prevent violence and potentially violent situations;
- (c) not use, possess or display any weapon, replica weapon or toy weapon, on any school property

- or at any event that is organized or sponsored by a school;
- (d) not use, possess or sell any intoxicating, banned or controlled substances;
- (e) demonstrate, when using electronic resources, appropriate on-line conduct in keeping with Policy #5780 Information & Communication Technology (ICT) Access and Use, including refraining from any acts of cyberbullying;
- (f) show respect for the property of others by refraining from theft, vandalism, graffiti and other inappropriate behaviour;
- (g) abstain from smoking on school and other district property;
- (h) be present at schools and school properties for school-authorized purposes only;
- (i) use respectful language and refrain from using obscenity or profanity while in a school building, on school or district property and at school-sponsored activities;
- (j) demonstrate commitment to learning by coming to school prepared to learn and by contributing to a positive, orderly, peaceful environment; and
- (k) practise academic honesty and personal integrity by not participating in or encouraging plagiarism, cheating, theft of evaluation instruments, use of unauthorized aids, or false representation of identity.





# Protecting Surrey Schools Together (PSST)

PSST is an information and reporting site that has been created in collaboration with and for students in the Surrey School District. With over a decade of success in Surrey, PSST provides students access to safety related information that is relevant to them and their school community and to access other credible sites to further assist with their searches. These tools were developed by the Safe Schools Department in collaboration with the Surrey RCMP and Surrey Crime Prevention Society. They are routinely updated based on input from students within the Surrey School District.



#### The 'Report It' tool:

- Allows students to report concerns anonymously
- Students encouraged to report any and all concerns about themselves, their school or others
- Submitted reports are sent to Safe Schools Department and followed up-on based on provided information
- If a report is a community concern or deemed to be serious in nature, it will be shared with the Surrey RCMP
- If the concern is not immediate, it will be passed along to the school's administrators, with Safe Schools providing support as needed
- Each report is attended to on a case-by-case basis

The PSST Report It tool can also be used by students to reach out for help. If a student wishes to speak with a Safe Schools representative, they may ask to be contacted through the reporting tool, or contact Safe Schools directly at safe-office@surreyschools.ca or 604-595-6195.

Students are made aware of the PSST site/app and its functions through in-school promotions, social media and presentations.



Schools, parents and other community members should be aware of the potential danger of toy and replica guns.

While such guns may be considered toys, many replica and toy guns can be easily mistaken as real. Whenever reports of a handgun are received, it typically results in a rapid, high-level police response as law enforcement must treat all such reports a real firearms threat.

Some replica guns are so realistic, they can easily be seen as an actual weapon and may result in a defensive action when pointed at someone. Police officers and other security personnel are trained to draw their own weapons in defense when threatened.

Possession of a real or replica weapon in school or on school grounds violates district policy and will result in serious consequences for students. Schools, parents and other community members should be aware of the potential danger of replica guns, particularly to the person holding the gun. Police may respond with force if they are unsure whether a weapon is real or fake.

Parents are urged to monitor their children's belongings to be aware of the very real dangers in owning or using these "toys."
