- Stress and anxiety are important coping mechanisms and understanding why we need them can help us to stay safe, respond to danger and help us grow
- <u>Foundry Surrey</u> Services available virtually on their app, drop in counselling services for ages 12-24/families, access to doctors and nurses, resources for youth or caregivers for mental health - Surrey location opening Summer 2024
