### Kindergarten Registration...

It's time to register for KINDERGARTEN. Those children who will turn 5 before January 1, 2024 are eligible to begin school in September 2023. Registration began on Monday, January 16<sup>th</sup> and can be done through the online school District website.

To register, take pictures (to attach) or (scan and attach) the citizenship for both the parent and your child, proof of residency, and proof of guardianship. For proof of residency, we require any three of the following: purchase or rental agreement, income tax statement, property tax statement, utility bill, drivers licence, Care Card, BC identification or a signed letter form your landlord. These can also be scanned and attached (or take pictures to attach).

It is very important to register as quickly as possible as the District bases the teacher allocation based on our enrollment. Thank you for your assistance in getting registrations in as soon as possible.

### **Black History Month**

### Weather/Change of Clothes

### Pink Shirt Day / **Anti-Bully Day**

Pink Shirt Day is February 22, 2023. Pink Shirt Day began in 2007 when a student in Nova Scotia was bullied for wearing a pink shirt to school. It has since been recognized annually worldwide as a day to stand against bullying. Pink Shirt Day aims to reduce bullying by celebrating diversity in all its forms and supporting workplaces, communities and schools to be safe, supportive, welcoming and inclusive of all people. While all people can be the target of bullying, some groups or individuals experience more bullying than others. Please encourage your children to be accepting of all people regardless of their beliefs, race, skin colour or identity. We encourage you to wear pink on Anti Bully Day. Anyone that ordered a shirt will receive them before February 22.

### Drop off and Pick Up Safety Policy...



Please drive slowly at drop off and pick up times. The parking lot beyond the rainbow crosswalk is for staff only. Please do not park there. Parents should move forward for drop off in the "Kiss and Go' area. Please do not park in the drop off only zones as it creates a safety concern for pedestrians. Back up into visitor spots if possible so you can see pedestrians when you leave. We are working on getting a second crossing guard for the Roper Street walkway near the school steps.

#### Kindness Focus / Weeks

Kindness Weeks will take place between February 14-23. We will be asking students to do Random Acts of Kindness during this time. We will have a have a colouring contest due on February 22, hand out several Kindness Rocks tickets during the week. Student will participate in Kindness activities in their classes. The Surrey Board of Education is committed to the prevention of unlawful discrimination, and does not accept any action of intolerance or discriminatory treatment of students or staff on the basis of:

- a person's race, colour or creed
- gender
- religion
- disability
- political affiliation
- sexual orientation
- other reasons prohibited by the Human Rights Code and the Charter of Rights and Freedoms

(Subject to bona fide exceptions outlined in the Human Rights Code such as affirmative action)

#### What is discrimination?

Discrimination involves inappropriate comments or actions that relate to the attributes listed. It also includes disparagement by slurs, jokes, graffiti, stereotyping, teasing, threats, harassment, intimidation, abuse, violence and systemic discrimination.

#### What is the impact of discrimination?

Everyone suffers when discrimination occurs. People may feel humiliation, or anxiety. Learning and working relationships may break down. Tension and an escalation of inappropriate conduct may permeate the environment

#### What should you do in cases of discrimination?

**Students:** A student who feels that he or she has been discriminated against or who witnesses discrimination may discuss the concerns with the

person causing the discrimination or, if preferred, with his or her teacher, a counsellor or principal.

**Employees:** An employee who feels that he or she has been discriminated against or who witnesses discrimination may discuss the concern with the person causing the discrimination or, if preferred, with his or her immediate supervisor unless the concern is with the supervisor, in which case it should be discussed with an appropriate district supervisor or manager.

Employees should also refer to the applicable collective agreement for direction.

#### What can the school district do?

The Surrey School District is committed to providing learning and working environments which are free from discrimination.

The school district expects that students and staff treat each other with mutual respect. It also encourages people to speak out when acts of discrimination occur. The district will take appropriate actions against those who are discriminatory.

- **All staff** have a responsibility to deal with acts of discrimination. Where reported incidents are not satisfactorily resolved, they shall be reported to an administrative officer or supervisor for action, and, if appropriate, recorded for future reference.
- **Teachers** have the responsibility for identifying racial and discriminatory bias as it may be present in the curriculum.
