National Indigenous Peoples Day-June 21



June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of <u>First</u>

<u>Nations</u>, <u>Inuit</u> and <u>Métis</u> peoples. The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples.

Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs.

In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many <u>Indigenous peoples and communities</u> have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.

Surrey is on the traditional unceded territories of the Semiahmoo, Katzie, Kwikwetlem, Kwantlen, Qayqayt and Tsawwassen First Nations. The city also has the largest urban First Nations population in the province. Surrey will be celebrating this day with a special event at Bill Reid Millennium Amphitheatre located at 17728 64 Avenue. The PAC's Annual General Meeting will be held on Thursday June 8th at 6pm at White Rock Elementary.

This will be the meeting where we nominate and elect parent executive members for the 2023/2024 school year.

The PAC needs you! <u>All</u> parents and guardians of students registered in the school are already members of the PAC. However, we are looking for parents who want to be more involved.

Our school PAC applies for a gaming grant that results in almost \$10,000/year of school funding. Without a PAC, we are not eligible for this funding. This year alone PAC accomplished:

- A weekly hot lunch program
- An invited artist for art programming for 8 divisions
- \$2500 in field trip funding
- Purchase of 30 iPADS to replace old technology
- \$ to cover the Grade 7 grad DJ
- \$500 for non-curriculum library content
- Teacher and EA classroom funding

- A subsidized Spike Ball program for intermediate grades
 - (without PAC, it would have been \$15/student)
- A school wide Monster Foam Party and picnic for families

Kindergarten Registration

It's time to register for KINDERGARTEN. Those children who will turn 5 before January 1, 2024 are eligible to begin school in September 2023. Registration began on Monday, January 16th and can be done through the online school District website.

To register, take pictures (to attach) or (scan and attach) the citizenship for both the parent and your child, proof of residency, and proof of guardianship. For proof of residency, we require any three of the following: purchase or rental agreement, income tax statement, property tax statement, utility bill, driver's licence, Care Card, BC identification or a signed letter form your landlord. These can also be scanned and attached (or take pictures to attach).

It is very important to register as quickly as possible as the District bases the teacher allocation based on our enrollment. Thank you for your assistance in getting registrations in as soon as possible.

Dear Parent or Guardian:

Each school year, parents support their child(ren)'s formal learning experiences in a wide variety of ways. We so appreciate all that you do to ensure a successful year!

In addition to providing the school supplies itemized on a grade list, parents are periodically asked for monies to cover specific items and/or special events. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in any school activity due to the inability to pay. Please contact the Principal should you require any financial assistance.

As we plan for the 2023/2024 school year, we anticipate the following costs:

Student Planner: We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

Field Studies and Field Trips: Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

Musical Instruments: Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for \$5 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students who opt to take band either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument.

Intensive Fine Arts

The Intensive Fine Arts program charges a \$40 dollar fee in September for students in the program to cover the cost of fine arts specific materials, cultural outings and performance props.

School Supplies:

Parents have the option of purchasing their Grade 1-7 school supplies on their own utilizing the grade supply list or for your convenience you may wish to purchase supplies as package through School Start. Payment will be made directly to School Start and the supplies will be sent directly to your home. Fees for school supplies should not exceed \$65 (with the exception of the fine arts program) Lists are available on the school website. Kindergarten teachers will purchase the kindergarten supplies for a cost of \$40.
