Dear Parents and Guardians:

Re: Community Youth Activities "Grad Pranks"

As we settle into the new school year, we are reminding parents, guardians, and students of our 2023 graduating class, of the expectations regarding pranks and celebrations.

Celebrating educational milestones is a tradition; however, there have been incidents in the past of unsanctioned activities that have crossed the line from good-natured fun, to criminal activity

This fall, social media trends have also amplified acts of theft and vandalism in schools across the region. We are asking your help to ensure your son or daughter is aware that unsafe or unlawful activities can have serious, lasting, consequences. Youth who participate in criminal activity could face criminal charges or school sanctions. These sanctions may include exclusion from graduation activities such as commencement ceremonies, suspensions, and can affect students' eligibility for scholarships and postsecondary admissions.

It is also important for parents and guardians to know they may be held financially responsible for damage caused by their children. Please see the attached excerpt from the *School Act*.

It is important that we work together to ensure that our young people do not take part in, or condone (provoke, encourage, or support):

- Bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat(s) or intimidation;
- Violence of any form;
- Verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- Discrimination in any form;
- Theft;
- Unsafe or dangerous activities;
- Vandalism;
- Possession or use of intoxicating or banned substances;
- Possession or use of weapons (or replica weapons) and explosives.

We ask that you understand the position of both the district and all our schools in taking the necessary disciplinary steps where appropriate, to ensure the safety and security of our school community.

Over the years, students from the graduating class have planned unsupervised camping trips or other group activities. Sadly, some of these activities have resulted in injuries and even deaths, due to impaired driving, or misadventure. We support your decision to not permit your son or daughter to attend unsupervised events. If you are uncertain about the status of an event, please give the school administration a call.

This letter may feel like a dire warning, however, it is because we want to keep your children safe and successful, that we take this matter so seriously.

The Commencement Ceremony will be held on **Tuesday**, **May 23**, **2023** at **7:00** p.m. at **The Bell Performing Arts Centre** (6248 144 Street, Surrey). Students need to arrive **no later than 5:30** p.m. to prepare for the processional and ceremony. The Commencement Ceremony will start at 7:00 p.m. in the theatre with doors opening at 6:45 p.m. Tickets **must** be presented at the door. Grads do not need a ticket, however, all family and guests must have tickets.

Each grad will receive two (2) **Commencement tickets** free of charge. These tickets will be distributed with their Grad Gowns on **Thursday**, **May 18** in the HUB following the mandatory rehearsal in the theatre. Only students who have paid the grade 12 graduation fee of \$60.00, student fee of \$25.00 and all other debts will be issued tickets.

An online form for additional tickets (at a cost of 5.00) will be open on, **Tuesday, April 18.** You may request up to <u>four (4)</u> additional tickets <u>per student</u>. Payment for additional tickets available in front of the Library May 8th to 12th during lunch. Unpaid tickets will be forfeited. After all additional tickets have been distributed there may be additional tickets available on a first come first served basis (at a cost of 5.00). Families should also be aware that this formal ceremony often lasts three hours or longer and is not suitable for small children. If you choose to bring a child they will also require a ticket.

Grad gowns will be distributed Thursday, May 18th following the mandatory assembly and rehearsal. All grads must attend the mandatory rehearsal in the Theatre. This rehearsal will provide important information regarding procedures for the Commencement Ceremony and Dinner Dance.

Grad Dinner Dance and Dry Grad Festivities



Any guest invited to the CHS Grad Dinner Dance and Dry Grad festivities, who are not members of the Clayton Heights Graduating Class of 2023, must receive official written approval from Clayton Heights Administration. This includes grade 11 guests from CHS. Guests can be grade 11 students from CHS or grade 12 students from another school or graduates from June 2022.

Students who would like to bring a guest can pick up a Guest Pass Application form from the student window before school, during lunch or after school. Please fill out the application (completely) and return it to the office **ASAP**.

Both students and guests should note that <u>all school rules apply at both events</u>. Students are advised that use of alcohol, drugs, vapes, cigarettes, cigars before or during these events will result in removal from the festivities and consequent disciplinary action (and ticket costs will NOT be refunded).

Late "guest applications" will not be accepted.

Grads will be advised if their guest application is approved. Once approved, **Dinner/Dance tickets** can be purchased in person. Approval letter must be presented at the time of purchase, payments must be made in cash or cheque **(made payable to Clayton Heights Secondary)**. Your guest, once approved, will also be approved to attend Clayton Heights Dry Grad. The CHS Grad will be required to purchase guest tickets in person during Dry Grad ticket sales. Approval letter and Dry Grad Emergency Contact Form must be presented at time of purchase. Emergency contact form must be completed for guests tickets as well. \$80 cash or cheque **payable to Clayton Heights Dry Grad**.

SO, WHAT IS DRY GRAD ANYWAY? ...

Dry Grad is a **longstanding tradition at Clayton Heights** that is organized each year for the graduating class by a volunteer committee. The purpose of Dry Grad is to provide a **safe, inclusive, fun, and an alcohol and drug-free event** for all grads immediately after their formal Dinner Dance to celebrate their graduation.

It is a **parent supervised all-night** fun event and includes magical decorations, a music DJ, photo booth, large inflatable games, karaoke, and more! Snacks and non-alcoholic drinks are available throughout the party. To encourage grads to stay until the end, special **door prizes** are drawn as the festivities draw to a close.

Grads should change out of their formal party wear into casual clothing that is more comfortable for the Dry Grad activities. Therefore, students are asked to arrange a parent or person on their behalf to pick up all formal wear and belongings between 11:00 p.m. and 11:15 p.m. at Newlands. No bags will be permitted into the venue and Newlands is unable to store belongings. Students board a school bus immediately after the Dinner Dance at Newlands and go to **The Metro** in New Westminster for an exciting and entertaining variety of activities as well as music, dancing, food, and lots of photo opportunities with friends. Transportation will be provide back to the school arriving around 5:00 a.m. where students can walk home, drive home or be picked up.

A high school **graduation party is an important rite** of passage culminating years of hard work. The convocation, the banquet, and the dance are the social events that define where high school ends and "the rest of life" begins. It is a time to celebrate, a time to say goodbye to childhood, and a time to look to the future. The aim of Dry Grad is to reduce the risk of harm to the grads, and the community at large, on a night when risk is unusually high. It is an event where grads can have the time of their lives without risking their lives — and without breaking the law. The size and scope of the party is intended to reflect the grads' achievement and acknowledge the years of hard work they put into completing their high school education. **The party runs straight through until the next morning** to ensure that graduates do not leave to go to another party. Because grads are kept occupied until the early hours of the morning, they are more inclined to "call it a night" by the time the party ends–and go home safe and sober. If a student chooses to leave before the end of the event, a parent or guardian will have to pick them up directly from the Dry Grad venue.

Tickets for the Dinner/Dance will be sold separately by the school, as that is a school sponsored event. Information to come from school will be sent home soon.

On Wednesday, June 28th the students will be picked up from Newlands Golf & Country Club (21025 48th Avenue) between 11:15 p.m.- 12:00 a.m. on charter buses to get to the dry grad location – The Metro in New Westminster.

With the location logistics of The Metro, we will require all the students and plus-one's to change before the bus pick up at Newland's and no bags will be permitted. Therefore please arrange a parent or arrange a person on your behalf to pick up your formal wear (dress, suit, tux, etc) between 11:00 p.m. - 11: 15 p.m. as we will have no area to store them in.

Admin will be searching the students before they get on the bus to ensure there is no alcohol, drugs, vapes, etc. The only access to Dry Grad will be if the students arrive on the chartered buses from Newlands with a Dry Grad Ticket.

We do require all students to stay until the end of the event. If a student chooses to leave, a parent or guardian will have to come and pick up directly from The Metro.

Students will be bused back to Clayton Heights Secondary School where they can walk home, drive home or be picked up. We will be arriving between 4:30 a.m. - 5:00 a.m.

There are no in and out privileges at Dry Grad and there is a NO TOLERANCE policy with alcohol, drugs, smoking or vaping. If any issues arise parents will be called immediately to pick up after first occurrence.
