# **Indigenous Grad Requirement**





Effective the 2023/24 school year, all students must successfully complete a minimum of 1 course in Indigenous-focused coursework. There is no change to the total number of credits required to graduate, which remains at 80.

#### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

At North Surrey, students can satisfy this requirement by **choosing at least one** of the following courses:

BC First Peoples 12 (in Gr. 11 or 12 which also satisfies Socials 12 requirement)

English First Peoples 12 in grade 12 (replaces English Studies 12)



- Math Foundations
  - For students interested in University studies
- > Pre-Calculus
  - For students interested in University studies
- > Math Workplace
  - Designed for entry into many college/trades programs and the workplace

- > If you have math this semester, talk with your teacher & heed their recommendation.
- If you have math next semester, talk to your teacher from last year or refer to your experience in previous math class.
- > If you are in Workplace Math 10, you will take Workplace Math 11.

# Accounting 11

Thinking of going into Business? This entry-level accounting course is a must have for any student considering a career in Business.

Students will learn the fundamentals of accounting, basic book-keeping concepts, Excel and accounting software. Whether you are going to run your own business or simply balance a cheque book, this course is for you!

Note: This course is open to both grade 11 and 12 students.

### **Life Sciences 11**

#### You should take this class if you:

- Enjoyed biology in science 8 10
- · Enjoy labs, projects and dissections

- · Will be taking 1st year post-secondary biology classes

#### We will learn about:

- Cell structure and function
- Evolution
- · Taxonomy Classifying and naming systems for organisms
- · How all organisms are categorized into the 6 kingdoms of life

#### Fashion and Textiles 12

If you are you thinking about pursuing a career in the fashion industry or want to master your design, pattern drafting and sewing skills as a hobby so you can "knock off" your favorite designer and brands then this class is for you! In this class you will learn about fashion sketching, trend forecasting, branding and marketing your own clothing line. Advanced sewing techniques, digital flat pattern drafting, draping and fabric dying will be included! You will have access to specialty equipment such as sewing machines, sergers, embroidery machines, cover stitching machines and scan/cut printers. What you design and construct will depend on your personal interests and current skill level so bring your ideas! Check out the video below!

# There are Other Ways to Get Credits

- Take a course during Summer School or Online.
- Submit documentation to counsellor for:
  - courses completed outside of the district, province or country
  - completed external credits i.e. sports, music, dance, lifesaving, driver's education (ICBC).

Please see your counsellor if any of these apply to you, or if you have any questions regarding external credits

# Summer School

- If you do not meet the learning outcomes of a core academic course, it's recommended that you speak with your counsellor to review options. One option may be summer school.
- NOTE: Summer school is a **BIG** decision because it condenses 5 months of school work into 5 weeks.
- When entering course requests in MYED PLEASE indicate in the Counsellor's Notes section if you are planning on taking a course in summer school and what course you would want it to replace in your schedule



### **Online Courses**

You may choose to cross enroll with an online school to take an additional course to advance ahead, or to take a course that you may not have in your schedule.

Please consider the following characteristics of what a successful online learner looks like:

- Independent learner
- Self-motivated
- Skilled with written communication
- Able to set a schedule and keep it
- Able to meet deadlines

When entering course requests in MYED PLEASE indicate in the Counsellor's Notes section if you are planning on taking a course online and what course you would want it to replace in your schedule

# Frequently Asked Questions

#### 1. Can I take all academic classes?

- We recommend you balance your schedule with academic and elective courses
- ► Keep in mind if you are looking for top marks, you only have so much time to complete homework and so this has to be something you think about is it better to take less "hard" courses and do well as oppose to take everything but get lower marks as a result

### 2. What do I do if my marks aren't high enough for the program entry?

- Apply to multiple programs that have different entry requirements
- Ask yourself, "Am I ready for this program"
- ► College's have many prerequisite courses and so you can start your program of study there and transfer at a later date.

## FAQ's continued...

- 3. Can I drop a class after a month if I don't like it or don't like the mark I am getting?
  - ▶ It is ok to take a course that you are not interested in or ends up not being what you thought it would be
  - Focus on doing the best you can
  - ➤ You may be learning what you don't want to do in the future crossing things of the list of potential job/careers helps narrow things down
  - ► Focus on some other skill/knowledge you can take out of the class (i.e. public speaking skills, computer skills, perseverance, working in a group, etc.)
  - Universities have started to focus more on the marks students get in the COURSES in the field you are applying for rather than a total GPA approach

## FAQ's continued...

- 4. Do I need to take EVERY science 11 and science 12 for post-secondary?
  - ▶ No, check admission requirements for each post-secondary
- 5. How do I know what math to take?
  - You need to consider your ability level (how have you done in Math up until now) AND your work habits
  - Check with your teacher to see what he/she would recommend
  - Consider future plans of study and prerequisites required (note taking a class because it is "needed for a career path" shouldn't supersede ability and work ethic)
- 6. If I have 60% in Pre-Calculus 11, will I be successful in Pre-Calculus 12? (I plan to work harder and get a tutor)
  - ▶ It is not uncommon to drop 10-15%; *Discuss* with your math teacher if they feel you will be successful in Gr. 12 *and* be *open* to their feedback your teacher is the expert in the curriculum and knows your ability (even despite your effort)

## FAQ's continued...

- 7. Can I go to university having only completed Foundations of Math 11?
- > Yes, but check requirements of each institution and each faculty
- 7. If I go to summer school or take an online class can I get ahead the following year?
- There is NO guarantee a student can take a class that is a year above their grade level because priorities go to the students in that grade. If you take a summer school course, please be prepared to take an elective course in place of the course you requested if there is no space in it
- 8. Can I choose my teacher or my block order?
  - ▶ No, the computer generates your schedule counsellors do their best to review each schedule and balance WHERE POSSIBLE
