

Dear Families and Students,

September has flown by so quickly, it's hard to believe that we are already almost 20% through first semester. We had an excellent start to the year in spite of the usual adjustments to student schedules caused by the enrollment of new students. We have about 1450 students enrolled at this time with some very large groups in the junior grades. To accommodate increased enrolment, we added sections of Math, Social Studies, PE, Science and English and welcomed 5 new staff members in early September. I am very appreciative of how cooperative and accommodating students were as we made the necessary adjustments to classes.

Our first PAC meeting was on September 20th and we had over 80 parents in attendance. I value parent input and I'd like to encourage all parents to attend PAC meetings. The "A" in PAC stands for 'advisory' and I appreciate the perspectives and insights of our PAC.

On Friday, September 30th the school is closed in recognition of the National Day for truth and reconciliation. This day honours the children lost to the residential school system as well the survivors, their families and communities. We have attached information about the events taking place on the peninsula to honour this day and encourage families to participate. Additionally, truth and reconciliation week is a national program open to all schools across Canada providing learning opportunities and commemorating the truth of our history as an important part of the path to reconciliation. Thursday September 29th is our school wide Orange Shirt Day. We ask that students wear an orange shirt to school on this day. We will also be selling orange shirts with the message of "every child matters" for \$10 on Tuesday to Thursday. The school will be collecting donations for the <u>Orange Shirt Society</u> between September 23rd and 30th. If any students would like to donate, they can bring their donations to their block C teacher.

As we approach October, fall activities are beginning to ramp up. Our school clubs will be up and running next week and Student council will be hosting Club Day on September 28th. Club day is a great opportunity for students to learn about all of the student led clubs that Semi-ahmoo has to offer and allow them the opportunity to join the ones that they are interested in. Our Band program is gearing up for their fall concert on October 26th and our Volleyball and Soccer teams have started another exciting season of competition.

On the first Friday of the new school year, we were excited to welcome our new IB 11 students with a daylong orientation to the program. There were important presentations on program structures and guidelines in the morning as well as an introduction to the IB Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) program hosted by Ms. Harrison and Mr. Yeung. In the afternoon, our incoming IB 11 students enjoyed a series of team building activities, puzzles and games, organized and hosted by Mr. El Halabi and his IB Physics 12 volunteers. A great time was had by all. We are excited to revive a Semiahmoo IB tradition that had been on pause these last few years. It is our pleasure to welcome our new cohort of 2024 and wish them success in their two-year IB journey!

We are also proud to congratulate our IB Diploma grad class of 2022 who were among 173,882 DP candidates in 3090 schools, across 150 countries worldwide. Yet again, our IB grads achieved excellent results in another high performing year for us. The average grade achieved by our students was 37 points out of a possible 45 – 5 points above the world average of 32. Our top student spot was shared three ways this year by Tyler Gosal, Victor Spassoff, and Vicky Wei who all achieved an impressive 43 out of 45 points. We applaud the outstanding efforts of all our grads and thank their teachers for their hard work and support.

While we celebrate these results, it is even more important to congratulate our students as they reap the fruits of their two-years' labour and enter universities of their first choice at major Canadian, US, and UK institutions. We are proud to see them off on the next step of their journey.

Lastly, we would like to commend the class of 2022 for their exceptional commitment to student leadership and service at school and beyond. IB students played important roles in numerous school clubs such as Globalizers, Student Council, Earthworks, Model UN, Debate, and Science and STEM Outreach. They helped organize and volunteer at local events in the community. They cared about our environment through the Surrey Adopt a Street Program and by conducting beach clean ups for Friends of Semiahmoo Bay Society. They volunteered at different senior centres, led concerts, letter campaigns, and other programs. And these accomplishments and initiatives are just the beginning. All and all, our grads made a strong impact at our school and in the greater community.
