PROCESS FOR CAREER PROGRAMS:

1. Indicate on Course Selection portal: ☒ Applying for a Co-op
2. Use the school website, GH Careers Instagram, and Careers Room Board to apply for desired Co-op and submit application.
3. Give Teacher Reference Forms to two (2) Teachers (Math/Science Teachers only). Teachers will return forms to the Career Centre.
4. Attend assigned interview time with your resume.
5. Students interview and application responses, attendance and marks will all be taken into consideration for selection.

This program takes place in Block C and Block D. After 10 weeks of regular classes, students will then complete a 90-hour work placement in an area of interest for approximately 4 weeks. This will be done during Block C and D to receive WEX12A (4 credits). Students will no longer have the spare as they would be attending work. The students will then return to class after 4 weeks of work experience and work on Career Life Connections 12 and their Capstone Project.
