## Meeting Minutes October 16 2025

-review of gaming and chequing accounts was completed as well as this year's proposed budget

-the proposed budget for the 2025/2026 school year was approved by Laura and seconded by Mal

#### DPAC notes:

At the September meeting, there was an education session called "Begin with the End in Mind", where DPAC talked about what success could look like for PACs if fundraising wasn't the main focus. It was explored how Grade 7 leaving and Dry Grad committees can be set up for success, and how PACs can build bench strength through good succession planning.

In the business portion of the meeting, Surrey DPAC shared the results of our "Community Snapshot" poll. PACs across Surrey said their top needs are training, templates, and opportunities to connect and learn from one another. In terms of advocacy, priorities included more supports for diverse learners, better communication and transparency from the district, and sustainable funding for public education.

The President's Report covered a lot of ground. Surrey DPAC has been active in the media, continuing to raise awareness about overcrowding, inclusion, and funding issues in Surrey schools. They also met with CUPE 728 and the Surrey Teachers' Association to strengthen collaboration across education partners. This year's focus areas are inclusive education and family voice, transparency in capital planning, and building PAC and Surrey DPAC leadership capacity.

Trustee Holmes provided an update on the district budget and enrollment. Although the district showed a \$33 million surplus last year, most of that was one-time funding and already allocated to system upgrades. Enrollment has dropped by about 300 students, which may affect future budgets. There are no current plans to reinstate Grade 7 band or IESW positions.

Finally, members voted on two motions. Surrey DPAC voted to end its membership in BCCPAC starting next year, and to request that the Surrey Board of Education take steps to improve meaningful public engagement at board meetings. The 2025–26 budget was adopted based on those decisions.

The next event is Connect the Dots: Tools for Confident PAC Leadership on October 18.
