TOPIC: INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS – TUITION FEES

The Board of School Trustees approves the tuition fee for international students on an annual basis. The current annual tuition fee paid by these students is \$12,100 with an additional \$800 per student collected to provide for provincial medical coverage.
