(c) Presentation: Science Fair Students

Shelagh Lim, Science Helping Teacher, provided Trustees with information regarding the 46th Annual District Science Fair and introduced each of the Science Fair participants present.

The SD36 (Surrey) Science Fair is the largest science fair in Western Canada. Around 260 students participated in this year's science fair, with over 150 gold medals being awarded to students.

The generous support of the Central City Mall for the venue was most appreciated.

Seven years ago a new K-7 science curriculum was implemented. One of the main features of the new curriculum is for students to use an inquiry approach. They pose a question and really think about what they want to know and that drives the research and the presentation. The new curriculum approach is evident again in this year's science fair projects.

Each student made a short presentation on his/her project to the Board. The projects covered a wide variety of scientific concepts and highlighted the achievements of the students. Science Fair projects were presented by:

- Sophini Purewal, Grade 5 student, Erma Stephenson Elementary "BioFuel"

- Henry Lei, Grade 7 student, Ocean Cliff Elementary "Raincouver"
- Ashnoor Arora & Eashan Sharma, Grade 6 students, Betty Huff Elementary – "A Peppermint for your Thoughts"

The Board thanked the Science Fair Committee, for their dedication and commitment in organizing the annual District Science Fair, as well as the students for bringing their projects to share with Trustees.

Chairperson Wilson recessed the meeting at 7:28 p.m. in order for Trustees to view the Science Fair Presentations more closely and reconvened the meeting at 7:42 p.m.

(a) <u>Delegation: Aridam Kumar, Student, re: Surrey Youth Sustainability</u> <u>Network</u>

Aridam Kumar and Alex Land Grade 12 students, Enver Creek Secondary, as well as Raaj Chatterjee, Grade 11 student, Semiahmoo Secondary and Shakti Ramkumar, Grade 11 student at Kwantlen Park Secondary, representing the Surrey Youth Sustainability Network, provided Trustees with information about the youth sustainability network throughout Vancouver's lower mainland.

The Surrey Youth Sustainability Network (SYSN) Vision includes:

- Student to student network to support idea and resource sharing and inter-school collaboration.
- Facilitate events and opportunities to generate increased awareness and action for environmental issues important to Surrey students and schools.
- Hope to support the school district to achieve its sustainability objectives (GHG reductions, waste reduction, etc.)

The SYSN was established in the Fall of 2010 and currently has 50-75 students participating in monthly meetings and regularly communicating through social media. SYSN is supported by teachers and community partners in Surrey. The group is governed by a student committee selected by active members. One of their primary purposes is to connect the various Green Teams in Surrey schools.

Current projects include:

- City of Surrey Earth Hour
- Improving SYSN network
- Spreading SYSN network.

Future plans include:

- Changes in organization (formal leadership structure)
- Recruit new members
- Have guest speakers, film screenings.
- Host events in the community
- Organize team-building field trips, excursions and activities.
- Stay involved with City of Surrey's sustainability initiatives
- Host an Earth Day festival in April 2014.

The delegation is requesting the Board for:

- Support for monthly meeting venues.
- Support for strategy to disseminate money.

Support to grow SYSN and align with district priorities while remaining student-led.

The Chairperson and Mike McKay, Superintendent advised the delegation of some specific areas of support with reference to meeting space and communications that may be available. Potential support will be reviewed and discussed with the delegation by staff in the near future.

LA Matheson Secondary launched an experiential learning program in September 2012. The program was created to give opportunities to students, particularly those of Aboriginal descent, to learn through hands on activities, participation in the community, outdoor and environmental excursions. Forty students in Grade 10 and 11 are registered in the program this year.

The Business Development Department, with support from the Aboriginal Education Department, wishes to submit an application for funding of a new Urban Aboriginal Discovery Program to the Government of Canada's Cultural Connections for Aboriginal Youth (CCAY). Funding will support the costs of busses, program admissions and equipment necessary for the many out trips necessary to meet the mandate of their program.

The Urban Aboriginal Discovery Program, based on the experiential learning program at LA Matheson Secondary, will operate at 3 inner city secondary schools: Kwantlen Park Secondary, Guildford Park Secondary and LA Matheson Secondary. The program format will include wilderness expeditions with Outward Bound including sea kayaking, rock climbing, snowshoeing and hiking; cultural activities and experiences through the Stó:lō Nation, service learning projects with school staff, curriculum connected field trips around the Lower Mainland and sports activities with the Aboriginal Sport Council.

The Urban Aboriginal Discovery Program will build cultural identity and connections; inspire character development; and instill resilience, leadership, connections and compassion in the natural world. Program activities will build confidence and self-esteem; develop meaningful mentorships and strengthen friendships through shared group experiences in unfamiliar settings.

CCAY will provide up to \$60,000 to applicants who can provide a complete set of audited financial statements and who have not previously received a CCAY grant.

CCAY's objective is to enable participation of urban Aboriginal youth in the economy by providing funding to support projects that:

- engage urban Aboriginal youth and other stakeholders in planning, development, and delivery of programs and services to reduce barriers to urban Aboriginal youth participation in the economy.
- support urban Aboriginal youth in reducing barriers to their participation in the economy.
- include cultural and language development, preservation, and revitalization in relation to the above mentioned initiatives and projects.
- assist urban Aboriginal youth in realizing their leadership potential through volunteer and social enterprise activities.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED:

THAT the Board support the submission of a funding proposal in the amount of \$60,000 to the Government of Canada's Cultural Connections for Aboriginal Youth program through the BC Association of Aboriginal Friendship Centres to fund the Urban Aboriginal Discovery Program.

URBAN ABORIGINAL YOUTH DISCOVERY PROGRAM OVERVIEW FOR CCAY GRANT APPLICATION

The Surrey School District proposes a collaborative youth leadership initiative – The Urban Aboriginal Youth Discovery Program -- working with Outward Bound, Stó:lō Nation and other partners. The purpose of this program is to address the unique cultural, social and educational needs of 60 emerging Aboriginal youth leaders, and to prepare them to be lifelong, effective, contributing, resilient members and leaders in their schools and communities.

The Urban Aboriginal Youth Discovery Program will operate at three Secondary schools, two days a month during the regular school day, over a six month period from October 2013 – March 2014. 60 Aboriginal youth (aged 15 to 18) will be engaged in hands-on, inspiring and challenging journeys of self-discovery through life-changing, culturally relevant education experiences and instructor led outdoor adventure expeditions.

A Community-Schools Aboriginal Program Coordinator will be recruited to implement and oversee the Urban Aboriginal Youth Discovery Program. In addition, each targeted secondary school will form an Aboriginal Youth Advisory Committee for the project. The Program Coordinator will collaborate with and support the Aboriginal Youth Advisory Committee at each school to organize and implement the following program activities:

Camp Fircom, Gambier Island: An interactive cultural/leadership camp where youth will spend two nights and three days engaging in a variety of culturally based social and recreational activities, arts and crafts and traditional teachings. Activities will be designed to foster positive cultural identity and leadership skills, such as: decision making, effective communication, teamwork, cooperation and increasing their sense of responsibility. Youth will learn the fundamentals to being positive role models as they build confidence in a safe and supportive culturally based learning environment.

The Shxwt'a:selhawtxw Interpretive Centre, Ethno botanical garden and Coqualeetza Educational Longhouse (Chilliwack, BC): Youth will learn about successful First Nations Tourism businesses; hear the oral history of Coast Salish people and relationship to the land; a presentation of residential school history; view cultural artifacts, tools and archives; tour the botanical gardens to learn about the important plants and medicines Coast Salish used historically and how they are still used today; and create a cedar project to take home.

Outdoor Adventure Expeditions led by instructors from Outward Bound Canada: Youth will travel and explore the landscape of traditional Coast Salish territories and partake in leadership and team building activities, such as hiking, snowshoeing, rock climbing, and canoe/kayaking across the Lower Mainland's most beautiful outdoor areas. Youth will develop interpersonal and leadership skills and gain practical learning and technical experience in: selecting appropriate gear, self-care, nutrition, safety, risk management, survival tactics, life skills, and low impact/no trace travel.

Youth-led follow-up events and activities: Aboriginal Youth will hone their leadership skills through the development and implementation of a Youth Advisory Committee at each school. The Youth Committee will work collaboratively to create a supportive youth network of natural leaders; plan youth-led community service projects; and build connections to local elementary schools through a variety of youth-led mentorship opportunities.

The Urban Aboriginal Discovery Program will give Aboriginal youth, who might otherwise not have access, the opportunity to:

- Enhance their cultural identity and leadership capacity;
- Connect with the outdoors in a meaningful and sustainable way;
- Build character, resilience, confidence and self-esteem;
- Develop connections and compassion in the natural world;
- Cultivate meaningful mentorships and strengthen friendships through shared group experiences in unfamiliar settings;
- Develop the desire, confidence, skills, perspectives and practices essential to becoming effective leadership ambassadors in schools and communities, to reduce barriers to participating in the economy.
