

In addition to the yearbook, customers may also consider extras such as protective covers and personalization directly through the Jostens website.



Canadian Parents for French – Surrey Chapter (CPF-Surrey) is pleased to announce that its thirteenth annual summer exchange trip between Surrey and Quebec City in June/July 2017 was a great success!

CPF-Surrey is applying for another grant from **EXPERIENCES CANADA** for a fourteenth summer exchange to take place in 2018. Each student will be paired with a "twin" from Quebec City. First the Quebec students stay in their twins' home and work to strengthen their English speaking skills. In the second half students travel to Quebec, to stay in their twin's home and practice communicating in French. This trip is a wonderful cultural experience for both **French Immersion** and **Core French** students and **any** student who wants to experience another region of our great country.

Due to our partnership with **EXPERIENCES CANADA** we are once again able to offer three weeks of activities, accommodation, meals and flights for the very reasonable price of **\$975**.

The activities in 2018 will include 10 days of activities in the Lower Mainland including kayaking, hiking and a day in Victoria followed by 10 days of activities in Quebec City. Activities in Quebec include a visit to Valcartier-Waterpark, Old Quebec and much more. The exchange will tentatively begin the last week of June and end in mid-July, no dates confirmed at this time.

We are encouraging Secondary Students in Grade 8-11 interested in participating in this reciprocal homestay exchange program between Surrey and Quebec City to contact us as soon as possible in order to register and begin the application process.
