It is hard to believe that we are heading into last month of school. June is a busy and exciting time in schools. Teachers are wrapping up the curriculum of this year while making plans for the next one.

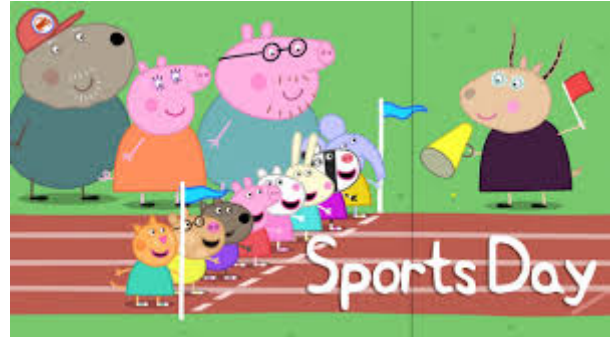
Thank you to our PAC for your support this year and for paying for many year-end field trips. Also thank you for your support at our upcoming sports day. We couldn't do it without you.

## Planning for Next Year

We are starting to make plans for the organization of classes for the coming school year. Information from parents may assist teachers in making decisions regarding the placement of students in classes. Helpful information provided by parents includes: learning styles and interests and social/emotional needs. However, it is important to understand that the placement of students is determined through school-based professional decisions. The teachers at Kennedy Trail work carefully and collaboratively to determine the most suitable placement for your child based on the following criteria:

- Student intellectual, social and emotional development
- Learning styles and strengths of students
- Degree of independence
- Integration of students with special needs
- Social compatibility
- Gender balance
- Maintaining appropriate teacher-student ratios

**If you have educational concerns regarding the placement of your child, please put them in writing to Mrs. Shepherd for consideration by June 1, 2018. It is not appropriate to request that your son/daughter be placed with a specific teacher. **These requests will NOT be considered.**

## Clothing Donation Bin

Big Brothers pays a fee to the school district to have their bin on our site. This money comes straight back to our school to support students. Everyone wins! You get rid of your unwanted items, the earth is happy because items are not in landfills and both Big Brothers and Kennedy Trail earn money to support our programs.

## School Fees

**Student Planner:** We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

**Field Studies and Field Trips:** Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

**Musical Instruments:** Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for less than \$10 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students who take band either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument.

**School Supplies:** Parents have the option of purchasing their child's school supplies on their own utilizing the grade supply list or for your convenience you may wish to purchase supplies as a package through Staples. Payment is made directly to Staples. Costs for supplies vary based on grade.

## School Supplies for 2018/19



Kennedy Trail Elementary will be providing a school supply service to parents through STAPLES this year. By ordering through this service it ensures students have the correct school supplies that are of excellent quality and a good price.

All Students in grade K-7 next year will be given information on how to order on-line or in-store next week. Parents can complete the on-line order form or drop off the manual form at Staples this June. Information will also be posted on the school website.

Your child's supplies will be individually bagged and waiting for pick up at the Staples store on Scott Road. If you do not pick them up before school start the items will be delivered to the school and will be waiting for them in September.

There is no need to shop. **School supply lists will be posted on our website for those who wish to purchase supplies from local retailers.**

## Internet safety

### What are the concerns about access?

The Surrey School Board believes access and use of technology is an integral component of current learning and working environments. However, the potential for misuse of the Internet exists, even with due diligence.

Sending or receiving inappropriate information (e.g. racist, slanderous, pornographic, threatening, sexist, confidential, etc.) or using chat rooms or polling booths for this purpose is possible.

Sophisticated search capabilities and easy access to web sites provide a wide range of information at your child's fingertips. Internet contact with students by strangers with questionable motives is also a major concern, particularly with chat rooms.

### What is the Surrey School District doing to reduce the risk of inappropriate use of technology?

Internet access for all schools in B.C. is provided by the Provincial Learning Network (PLNet), a network supported from Victoria. PLNet provides virus protection service and limited blocking of inappropriate sites, such as pornography.

### School district responsibilities

- To provide age appropriate instruction for students on responsible, appropriate use of the Internet.
- To make every reasonable attempt to ensure appropriate use of the Internet by students.
- To investigate suspected misuse and provide consequences for misuse of district resources.
- To encourage parents and students to complete a Technology Access and Use Agreement form as part of mandatory consent for student access to the Internet at school.



### Student responsibilities

- To follow guidelines set out by the Surrey School District and his/her parents regarding Internet use.
- To make responsible decisions around his/her use of technology and the Internet.

### Parent responsibilities

- Instruct your child to never give out identifying information - home address, school name, or telephone number - in a public message such as chat or bulletin boards and be sure you are dealing with someone you and your child know and trust before providing personal information via e-mail.
- To instruct your child regarding boundaries of what is considered acceptable use of the Internet by your family.
- To be aware of the risks in accessing the Internet.
- To emphasize to your child the importance of personal safety in Internet use and that people online may not be who they seem. Because you can't see or even hear the person, it would be easy for someone to misrepresent him or herself. Thus, someone indicating that "she" is a "12-year-old girl" could in reality be a 40 year-old man.
- To monitor and supervise your child's use of the Internet when not in a school setting.
- To be aware that children can access the Internet from almost any computer (home, friends, or school).

### Suggestions for parents

- Place home computers in a high traffic area in the home, not your child's bedroom.
- Set reasonable rules and guidelines for computer use. Discuss and post them near the computer as a reminder.
- Make casual checks of your child's work while they are using the Internet.
- Monitor the sites visited by your children through logs and bookmarks on your computer.
- Consider 'filtering' software which can block access to objectionable sites, words or phrases.

ਸਕੂਲ ਸਕੂਲ ਡਿਸਟਰਿਕਟ ਦਾ ਇਹ ਵਿਚਾਰ ਹੈ ਕਿ ਅੱਜ ਦੇ ਵਾਤਾਵਰਨ ਵਿੱਚ ਸਿੱਖਣ ਅਤੇ ਕੰਮ ਕਰਨ ਲਈ ਮਸ਼ੀਨੀ ਵਿੱਦਿਆ ਦਾ ਹੋਣਾ ਬਹੁਤ ਜ਼ਰੂਰੀ ਹੈ। ਕਾਫੀ ਧਿਆਨ ਰੱਖਣ ਦੇ ਬਾਵਜੂਦ ਵੀ ਇੰਟਰਨੈਟ ਦੀ ਗਲਤ ਵਰਤੋਂ ਹੁੰਦੀ ਹੈ। ਇਸ ਰਾਹੀਂ ਅਫ਼ਕਵੀਂ ਜਾਣਕਾਰੀ ਭੇਜਣੀ ਜਾਂ ਪ੍ਰਾਪਤ ਕਰਨੀ, (ਜਿਸ ਤਰ੍ਹਾਂ ਜਾਤ ਪਾਤ ਸਬੰਧੀ, ਗੰਦੀਆਂ ਤਸਵੀਰਾਂ, ਲਿੰਗ ਦੇ ਭੇਦ ਬਾਰੇ, ਕਿਸੇ ਦੀ ਬਦਨਾਮੀ ਬਾਰੇ) ਜਾਂ ਹੋਰ ਨਾਲ ਚੈਟ ਦੇ ਕਮਰਿਆਂ ਵਿੱਚ ਸਬੰਧ ਜੋੜਨੇ ਕਾਫੀ ਸੰਭਵ ਹਨ। ਇਸ ਵਿੱਚ ਕੋਈ ਸ਼ੱਕ ਨਹੀਂ ਇੰਟਰਨੈਟ ਰਾਹੀਂ ਕਾਫੀ ਤਰ੍ਹਾਂ ਦੀ ਫੁੱਗੀ ਜਾਣਕਾਰੀ ਬੱਚਿਆਂ ਦੇ ਪੜ੍ਹਨ ਲਈ ਮਿਲਦੀ ਹੈ, ਪਰ ਜਦੋਂ ਇਸ ਮੀਡੀਅਮ ਰਾਹੀਂ ਓਪਰੇ ਇਨਸਾਨ ਬੱਚਿਆਂ ਨਾਲ ਸਬੰਧ ਜੋੜਦੇ ਹਨ ਤਾਂ ਇਹ ਫਿਕਰਮੰਦ ਸਥਿਤੀ ਬਣਦੀ ਹੈ।
