

8 Days in May - Haida Gwaii

May 1st, 2018 was another milestone for our First Nation Program. For the second year, 18 of our First Nation Program students along with staff and Semiahmoo First Nation travelled to Haida Gwaii. In short, it was magical. The trip included a wide variety of activities such as kayaking, whale watching from shore and a remarkable 13 hour Zodiac excursion down the Hecate Straight to Gwaii Haanas. We visited K'uuna, Windy Bay and Hot Springs Cove. In other activities we fished, kayaked - dug for razor clams, beach combed, and the 30 + km hike to the birthplace of Haida Civilization, Rose Spit. As well, we found time to visit some of the Island's renowned artists and met with teachers, administrators and the District Principal for Aboriginal Education, Joanne Yovanovich. Shout out to our staff, Dawne Kalenuik, Rachel Hare, Jennifer Koehler and Sara Amyotte for supporting our students on this tremendous trip.
