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Principal's Message

On behalf of the entire staff of Earl Marriott Secondary, I would like to welcome everyone back to school. I hope that you all enjoyed a safe and relaxing summer and that you are looking forward to a year of new learning and experiences. This year continues to be very different as we adjust our teaching and learning to accommodate schedule changes. As announced by the Ministry on July 29th, all schools in BC will be starting with students in Learning cohorts to minimize contacts in the school. All secondary schools in Surrey will be on a four quadrant year, with two classes per term. Our Grade 10 -12 students will be taking one course at school and one course through hybrid learning. In addition, the Surrey School District has announced a Secondary Transition Program for Grade 8 and 9, for those families not ready to return to full instruction in September. GRADES 8 AND 9 TRANSITION PROGRAM



On August 26th, the Surrey School District shared its <u>plans</u> to safely return to in-class instruction. These plans reflect the measures put forth by provincial health experts and the Ministry of Education and include the important steps our schools will take to safely welcome our students back in September.

We are confident in our plans, but we know that many of our families are nervous. In response to parent feedback and concerns, we will be offering a **Secondary Transition Program** that will be available to all grade 8 and 9 families who are not ready to have their child return to full-time face-to-face instruction when school begins in September.

What is the Secondary Transition Program?

This learning option offers flexibility for families that are unlikely to return to school in September. School staff will work with individual families on plans for transition which may include a delayed start or reduced attendance, with a gradual transition back to full-time in-class instruction

School staff may also discuss options related to online learning, including what is involved, the available courses, and the student's individual educational program and needs. Online learning will be offered through the district's online learning school Surrey Academy of Innovative Learning (SAIL) or possibly their local school.

What does online learning entail for my grades 8 or 9 student?

- This program will keep students on pace with their grade level until they can transition back to face-to-face learning.
- If a student chooses this option, they will be withdrawn from their two courses in the first quarter, but will remain registered at their current school.
- Students can expect a structured timetable of limited online options dedicated to core academic courses.
- Courses offered through this option will focus on English Language Arts,
 Mathematics, Social Studies and Science. There may be opportunities for
 students to focus on French-as-a-Second Language or Physical Education.
 No electives will be offered through online learning at your regular school.
- Students will retain their other courses as scheduled, and can choose to return to face-to-face classes at their school at the beginning of the second or third quarter depending on the needs of the student, the educational program, and the available courses.

What is expected of parents in this model?

In this model, students will spend the majority of their time at home, so parents will need to dedicate time for support and guidance.

Is there a transition program available for grades 10, 11, 12?

YES. The <u>current structure</u> for all students in grades 10–12 includes a blended model of one block face-to-face every morning and one afternoon block online, with a single afternoon of instruction per week. These students can also consider online learning through <u>SAIL</u>.

What are next steps?

If parents of students in grade 8 or 9 are planning to not send their child to their secondary school, they should complete this <u>online form</u>. Upon completion, school staff will contact families and work with them to identify the best option for your student.

PLANS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS



The district has over 28,000 students in 20 secondary schools, 15 of which have more than 1300 students and the largest has just under 2000 students.

The district's plans outline how schools will reduce the number of in-person, close interactions students and staff will have in a day through set cohorts/learning groups and physical distancing. Key components include:

THE NEW MODEL

JUNIOR PROGRAM STUDENTS (GRADE 8, 9)

- Students will be arranged in cohorts* of approximately 60 students and staff combined.
- Students will have 2 face-to-face classes each quarter (for a total of 8 classes in the school year).
- Start times, break/lunch times, and dismissal times will be staggered from graduate program at some sites.

GRADUATE PROGRAM STUDENTS (GRADE 10, 11, 12)

- Students will be arranged in cohorts* of 30 students and staff combined.
- Students will have 2 classes each quarter (for a total of 8 classes in the school year).
- Students will be on a blended program with one in person class and one online class where small groups of students will attend in person one day a week.
- There will be time built into the blended program schedule to allow teachers time to prepare, deliver and support the blended program.

ADVANTAGES OF THE NEW MODEL

- + Keeps cohorts below the recommended 120
- + Allows students to take the courses they requested and stay on the graduation pathway selected
- + Staggers entry, breaks, lunch, and dismissal to ensure minimal contact
- + No more than 60% of the school will be in session for lunch on any given day
- + Provides teachers with time to attend to truly blended learning with in-service time available
- + Provides maximum contact (100%) to our junior students who need this support the most
- + Has every student attending school every day
- + Can easily be adapted to changes in pandemic stages (i.e. face-to-face classes can be transitioned online)

^{*} A cohort is a group of students and staff who remain together throughout a school term. Within the cohort minimized physical contact should be encouraged, but a two-metre physical distance does not need to be maintained.

Earl Marriott Community Re-start Plan

In order to meet the requirements of the BC Education Restart Plan, our school year will be divided into four sections or quarters. Each quarter is approximately ten weeks long. In each quarter, students will take one class in the morning (A block) and another class in the afternoon (B block).

According to the Surrey School District plan, students in Grade 8 & 9 will attend both Classes at Earl Marriott.

Students in Grades 10, 11, and 12 will all attend classes in the morning at the school. In the afternoon, classes will be blended with only a small number of in class students attending at school. On Monday and Friday, all Grad program students will be expected to connect with their teachers in an online class using the Teams platform from home. Up to one third (10 students) will attend class in the afternoon on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please see the Surrey School Opening graphic following this page.

Student Learning Groups (Cohorts)

Learning groups are a recommended public health measure to help reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, and support contact tracing. All EMS students will be scheduled into learning groups according to their first block (A) course. Students will remain with these groups/zones for one term or Quadrant. The learning group a student is scheduled into will determine the entrance and stairwell they access during morning. Student breaks will take place in their A block classroom or outside of the school. To reduce the risk of contact, movement through common areas such as the cafeteria and front foyer will be strictly reduced.

Once timetables are released, students can identify their learning cohort group based on the Block A classroom they are assigned to.

Entering and Exiting the School

Students are required to enter and exit through the designated entrance for their Learning Cohort or A block class. These instructions will be given to students on their Orientation day.

Hallway Directional Flow

Hallways will maintain a one-way flow, directional arrows on the floor to indicate direction of flow in the hallway. Students must adhere to all established traffic flow signage. We will be reviewing our directional flow regularly to ensure the best physical distancing.

Hand Washing & Hand Sanitizing & PPE

Students and Staff will be required to sanitize their hands:

- upon entering the school in the morning
- before/after eating lunch
- after break time or movement outside their cohort
- after washroom use
- other opportunities where appropriate

There will be hand sanitizing stations at each major entry way and throughout the hallways. Students are encouraged to bring personal hand sanitizers to school.

Mask wearing

Masks are to be worn in all common areas: hallways, washrooms, front foyer, cafeteria, entering and exiting the building or classroom, or when moving through the classroom. Students may wear masks in the classroom.

Washrooms

Washrooms will permit a maximum of three students at a time, to ensure physical distancing.

Lunch

All students in Grade 8 and 9 are encouraged to bring lunch to school. At this time, we are unsure when cafeteria services will be available. Vending machines will not be available due to health and safety concerns.

Students in Grade 8 and 9 have several options for lunchtime: return home for lunch, eat outside while maintaining physical distance, or remain in the A block classroom. Common areas such as the cafeteria will not be available.

Students in Grade 10 -12 will be returning home at lunch to continue their classes on line. The smaller number of students who will be continuing at school on Tues. -Thurs. may follow the same options as the Grade 8-9 students.

Lockers

Students will not be provided with hallway lockers this year. They may bring all personal items for each class to their classes.

Due to Covid-19 and in adhering to social distancing measures, Counsellors will not be using the online system for making appointments. Students who require to see their counsellor for mental health concerns and/or other issues/concerns will need to email their counsellor to arrange for an appointment. Counsellors will let the student know when/where the meeting will take place.

Grade 8 and 9 student schedules cannot be changed in any way. These students have been placed in cohort sections, as per the Ministry of Education, and these cannot be changed.

Once a student attends the first class in the Term, they must remain with that cohort. For this reason, classes cannot be changed after the first day of the term if a student has attended.

Grade 10-12 students with schedule concerns will need to email their counsellor. There is minimal room or space for changes. These emails will be answered in order of urgency:

Any students who are missing courses in the current semester will be given priority.

Schedules will be worked on in the following order: grade 12, 11 and then 10.

Academic course changes will be priority over elective courses.

We appreciate in advance the patience that will be required this year on behalf of staff, students and families as we work through the requests/emails.

SCHOOL FEE COLLECTION

This year, we will be collecting our student fees using the school district's secure online fee payment system. We encourage families to log on to our system early.

Please find a current school fee schedule in this newsletter. We would appreciate your attention to this responsibility as soon as possible.



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STUDENT DEBTS

Students will be assessed a cost for lost or damaged school property (books, lockers, sport jerseys, etc.) Charges are based on the replacement cost of the item. Students must return the same textbook to receive credit, so avoid lending textbooks and label your text with your full name and student number.



ABSENCES AND LATES

Students are expected to be at school and in class on time. It is the student's responsibility to be punctual for all classes.

- · ABSENT *or* LATE Parents are asked to phone the school in the morning.
- . Students showing any symptoms must stay home

VACATIONS DURING SCHOOL TIME

Students away on extended vacations (4 or more days) during school time must complete an extended absence form, available in the office, before departure. The school is not in a position to grant permission to any students to miss school for an extended holiday period, and it is important to be aware of the possible effects on achievement. Further, it is not required that teachers provide work for students on vacation.

IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: MEDICAL ALERTS



A Medical Alert condition is defined as a physician diagnosed, potentially life threatening condition such as:

Diabetes Epilepsy

Severe asthma Serious Heart Conditions

Blood clotting disorders Anaphylaxis (history of severe allergic response)

Parents are responsible to update the school with any medical issues. In emergency situations, a parent/guardian (or the emergency contact) shall be contacted and the student taken to a hospital. As per District policy, we are unable to provide students with any over-the-counter medication (eg. Tylenol, Advil).



STUDENT PARKING

As there is limited student parking at EMS, student parking is only available to grade 12 students and is on a first-come first-served basis in the designated student rows only. Students parking in Visitor or Staff Stalls (including near or around the portables) or parked illegally (including in the laneway behind the gym), may result in the student's car being towed at the owners' expense (minimum charge \$185.00). Parking at school is a privilege. Unsafe driving practices will result in this privilege being revoked. Grade 12 students with a valid drivers license and their "N" will be able to register via the student sign up system on September 23rd to obtain a parking decal.

Please be sure to park in the marked <u>Visitor spaces only</u> when you visit the school and then report to the office.


I have two children at Earl Marriott. Can I view both of children's profiles?



Where can I see my child's report card?




