

On our return in January, students and staff will begin preparing very quickly for the end of Quarter 2. Families should have received a Point of Progress interim for each class in Quarter 2 this month, and can use this benchmark to plan and set goals for the remainder of the term. Interim work habits can be accessed through the MyED portal. There are three and a half short weeks on our return, and, in the quarter system, this is the equivalent of close to two months. Attendance is very important, both in class and online. Please take a look at the January calendar to mark down dates for the last day of the quarter.

This year, students will be in classes in full session until Wednesday January 27th, with Thursday the 28th and Friday the 29th as Literacy Assessment days for all Grade 10's, and Completion Days for all students who need to take care of final assignments, tests and quizzes that must be finished before the end of the Quarter. Students in all Grades only attend on those days if they have been called in by their teacher, or if they have requested to come in to finish a project. Grade 10 students may be scheduled for a Literacy Assessment on one of the two Completion Days. Monday February 1st is the first day of a new quarter, with new teachers and 2 new classes. Students can check their new schedules in January in their MyEd account.

Grade 10 Literacy Assessment, January 25–29, 2021

The following email was sent to the Grade 10 parents earlier this week

This email is being sent to inform you that during the week of **January 25-29**, **2021**, grade 10 students will be writing their Grade 10 Literacy Assessments.

<u>Please see the attached schedule that clarifies when and where students are now scheduled to write</u> their Literacy Assessments in January.

**Please note the schedule is based on students current C-Block teachers in Quarter 2. **

Every student in British Columbia must write this assessment in order to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma.

- <u>Students will be assigned to write these assessments based on the C-Block class that they are currently registered in during Quarter 2.</u>
- <u>Students will receive a personalized email in the second week of January which will provide them</u> with the exact details in regards to when and where they will be writing their assessment.
- <u>Please note that some students have been scheduled to write this assessment on the Completion</u> <u>Days on Thursday, January, 28th and Friday, January 29th – This is not an error.</u>

In preparation for the Literacy Assessment we are encouraging students to **check out the B.C. Ministry of Education website BEFORE they write the assessment**. Please see the link provided below in this email for more information on the Literacy Assessment, and to watch the short videos that explain what the assessment looks like and how it will be scored.

Students need to be able to: Analyze, Understand & Communicate about a variety of texts.


