On behalf of the entire staff of Earl Marriott Secondary, I am delighted to welcome everyone back to school. I hope that you all enjoyed a safe and relaxing summer, and that you are looking forward to a year of new learning and experiences.

School will be starting on **Tuesday September 7th** with homeroom (Block C) for students in **Grades 9 - 12** at 10:00 am. You should plan to be at school for about a half hour on Tuesday.

Students in **Grade 8** will meet on the Main Field at **10:30 am**, directly north of the parking lot, to find their **Semester One**, **C block** teacher and class. SCHOOL FEE COLLECTION

This year, we will be collecting our student fees using the school district's secure online fee payment system. We encourage families to log on to our system early.

Please find a current school fee schedule in this newsletter. We would appreciate your attention to this responsibility as soon as possible.



STUDENT DEBTS

Students will be assessed a cost for lost or damaged school property (books, lockers, sport jerseys, etc.) Charges are based on the replacement cost of the item. Students must return the same textbook to receive credit, so avoid lending textbooks and label your text with your full name and student number.



ABSENCES AND LATES

Students are expected to be at school and in class on time. It is the student's responsibility to be punctual for all classes.

 \cdot ABSENT or LATE - Parents are asked to phone the school in the morning.

. Students showing any symptoms of illness must stay home.

VACATIONS DURING SCHOOL TIME

Students away on extended vacations (4 or more days) during school time must complete an extended absence form, available in the office, before departure. The school is not in a position to grant permission to any students to miss school for an extended holiday period, and it is important to be aware of the possible effects on achievement. Further, it is not required that teachers provide work for students on vacation.

IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: MEDICAL ALERTS



A Medical Alert condition is defined as a physician diagnosed, potentially life threatening condition such as:

Diabetes Severe asthma Blood clotting disorders

Epilepsy Serious Heart Conditions

Anaphylaxis (history of severe allergic response)

Parents are responsible to update the school with any medical issues. In emergency situations, a parent/ guardian (or the emergency contact) shall be contacted and the student taken to a hospital. As per District policy, we are unable to provide students with any over-the-counter medication (eg. Tylenol, Advil).



STUDENT PARKING

As there is limited student parking at EMS, student parking is only available to grade 12 students and is on a first-come first-served basis in the designated student rows only. Students parking in Visitor or Staff Stalls (including near or around the portables) or parked illegally (including in the laneway behind the gym), may result in the student's car being towed at the owners' expense (minimum charge \$185.00). Parking at school is a privilege. Unsafe driving practices will result in this privilege being revoked. Grade 12 students with a valid drivers license and their "N" will be able to register via the student sign up system on September 23rd to obtain a parking decal.

PARENT PARKING

Please be sure to park in the marked <u>Visitor spaces only</u> when you visit the school and then report to the office.

LOCKER DISTRIBUTION

Our online locker distribution process will begin for Grade 12 students on August 30th at 10:00 am. Grade 11's will begin August 31st, Grade 10's on September 1st, Grade 9's on September 2nd.

Grade 8 students will sign up on September 3rd. Students will require their student numbers which will be arriving in the mail with their schedules sometime next week.

Free bus transportation is ONLY provided for those students who live in the school's catchment area and who are K-3 and live <u>more than 4.0 km</u> walk distance from the school, or 4-12 students that live <u>more than 4.8 km</u> walk distance from the school, regardless of previous busing history.

If your student(s) is not eligible for free busing they will be put on a waitlist. A paid pass may be obtained **after September 20th if space becomes available**. Routing Schedule and Bus Pass would be issued after that date if space develops and once payment has been received.

> The cost of a paid pass is \$300 per year regardless of usage. Sibling passes are \$150 regardless of usage.

PASSENGER GUIDELINES

- Students must have a bus pass or the written authority of their principal to ride a school bus, and are only permitted to ride their assigned bus, unless approval from the school is given. A pass must be shown every time the student boards the bus. Students may be refused to ride without a pass. There is a \$5.00 replacement charge for lost / damaged / demagnetized bus passes.
- 2. Friends without a pass are not permitted to ride without a temporary pass provided by the school office. A parent or guardian of the friend must provide authorization to the school in advance of the student riding the bus. Space must be available on the bus.
- 3. Students must be at their pick-up point five minutes before their scheduled pick-up time.
- 4. Notifications of late or cancelled buses will be sent via the school's App. where applicable. Students and parents can subscribe to their bus number to receive the notifications.
- 5. Students may be assigned seats by the driver. Once seated, students must stay in their seats.
- 6. On buses equipped with seat belts, students must sit in their seats with the seat belt buckled at all times during the trip.
- 7. Eating of lunches and snacks may be allowed at the discretion of the driver. When permitted, drinks must be in spill proof containers. If abused, this privilege may be suspended. No litter shall be left on the bus by students.
- 8. Small band instruments, or other carry-on items may be taken on the bus provided the item:
 - a) Will fit safely on the student's lap
 - b) Does not sit higher than the seat in front
 - c) Is properly housed or contained in an approved case/container
 - d) Will not create unsafe conditions for other passengers
- 9. Smoking, vaping, lighters/matches, graffiti, loud talking, loud media devices, or distracting the driver are strictly prohibited.
- 10. Windows and emergency doors are only to be used at the direction of the driver.
- 11. Disrespect, inappropriate behaviour or the use of profanity is not acceptable.
- 12. If, in the opinion of the driver, students are behaving in such a fashion as to cause driver distraction or fellow passenger danger, the driver may return the students to the pick-up point or drop them off at the nearest school and place them in the charge of that principal. The principal will contact the parents or guardians concerned to arrange transportation of the students.
- 13. All disciplinary problems will be reported to the school principal and the transportation manager.

Mentors and Coaches are individuals from all backgrounds and disciplines who work with students to share their knowledge and guide them through the season. Many Mentors contribute on a weekly basis during competition season, or support the team with subject matter expertise on an as needed basis. In addition, Mentors help to foster the idea of Gracious Professionalism[®] and have the students do as much of the work as possible.

Remembers what's important – it's about the kids and they come first

Sample Mentor/Coach Roles

NON-TECHNICAL:

Project Management Mentor

- Provides an overview of project management concepts for team
- Guides the team throughout the project life cycle

Scholarship Mentor

- Assist to educate students, Mentors and parents regarding scholarship opportunities available to FIRST students
- Coordinates applications for student/ Mentor nominations for awards

Marketing Mentor

- Provides a basic overview of Marketing concepts
- Assists students with development and implementation of a Marketing Plan in coordination with the development of a Business Plan

Finance Mentor

- Assist the team in preparing a Business Plan,
- financial planning/budget for the seasonOrganize and assists with fundraising efforts

TECHNICAL:

Robot Programming/Software Engineering Mentor

- Assist team members with writing code to control robot in C++, Java, Robot C or LabVIEW (depending on program)
- Maintains process focus

Electrical Engineer Mentor

- Assist team with wiring the robot's power and signal system
- Assist and instruct the team members in the electrical and electronics systems on the robot

Mechanical Engineer Mentor

- Provides assistance with design and construction of the robot
- Advise students on the safe use of tools and safety procedures
