We are so proud of all their hard work and success this season. All of our Fall teams have brought us reason to celebrate the great Athletic program here at Earl Marriott, and especially our Athletic Director Mr. Adam Roberts. On our return in January, students and staff will begin preparing very quickly for the end of the semester. Please take a close look at the January calendar to mark down dates for the last day of Semester 1, the Grade 10 Numeracy and Literacy Assessment schedule and Completion Days. This year, students will be in classes in full session until Wednesday January 26<sup>th</sup>, with Thursday the 27<sup>th</sup> and Friday the 28<sup>th</sup> as Literacy Assessment days for all Grade 10's, Capstone presentation days for CLC Grade 11 students, and as Completion Days for all students who need to take care of final assignments, tests and quizzes that must be finished before the end of Semester.

For those **new to our school and all of our Grade 8 families**, the final week of term (Jan. 24<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup>) is often full of exams and final projects in many classes. The Thursday and Friday **Completion Days** are set aside for those students who require a bit of extra time or support to complete their work. **Students in Grade 8 and 9 only attend on those days if they have been called in by their teacher, or if they have requested to come in to finish a project. Senior students may be scheduled for a Literacy Assessment, or CLC Capstone presentation. <b>Monday January 31<sup>st</sup> is the first day of a new semester, with new teachers and classes. Students can check their new schedules in January in their MyEd account.**





#### **Growing Up Trans**


