We are so grateful for the commitment that he has made to our students and school, and we will miss seeing him outside greeting students each day. Joining our Admin team is Ms. Kirsten Farquhar as Vice Principal at Earl Marriott. Ms. Farquhar is an experienced Vice Principal who has worked most recently at Kwantlen Park Secondary. Ms. Farquhar worked early on in her career at Earl Marriott as a student teacher, which just proves 'Once a Mariner, Always a Mariner'. We welcome her to our school, and look forward to working and learning with her this year.

Already, our focus is turning to the next school year with planning and course selection. Our students started the new year writing exams, finishing presentations, and preparing for Quarter 3. Our new graduates of 2026 and their parents joined us in a virtual meeting to talk about Grade 8 courses and programs. Grade 10 students are writing their Literacy exams in the last week of January and we wish them all the best. Grade 11 students are presenting their Virtual Capstone projects as part of their graduation requirements. Everybody is moving forward with their courses and their plans for postgraduation.

As the end of this semester approaches, students are busy finishing assignments and projects, and studying for final exams. This year, students will be in full session classes until Wednesday January 27th, with Thursday the 28th and Friday the 29th as Completion Days for students who need to take care of final assignments, or tests and quizzes that must be finished before the end of Semester. If you are unsure whether your child's attendance on the Completion days is being requested, please have them speak to their teacher. In addition, Grade 10 students will be writing the Literacy 10 Assessments the week of the $25^{th} - 29^{th}$. Please check our website for a full schedule and more information about this assessment.

Quarter 3 begins on Monday, February 1st. Student schedules were handed out on Monday January 11th. It is hard to believe, but we are already speaking with students about **Course Planning** for next year. All of our Grade 8's will be working with us in the Computer Labs to log into their MyEdBC accounts in preparation for choosing their courses. Grade 9 -11 students will be completing their course selection on line through the student portal of MyEdBC the weeks of **Feb. 4th – 26th**. Parents can ask their son or daughter to go online with them to review their course selection choices. Please check our Course Planning Guide and Course Book online at earlmarriott.ca or all of the information to plan for next year. Students who are transferred to Grandview Secondary for next year will be completing their course selection at the same time through the Grandview MyEd site. A reminder to families that all out-of-catchment applications are due by Friday, January 29th for consideration for next year.

As always at this time of year, our Grade 12 students are focused on making choices for their first year out of high school. Information continues to come in from our counselling department, and is posted on our website, along with current scholarship information. Scholarship information continues to be shared through **emsscholarships** on Instagram. Graduation details will be sent out to students in the Spring. It appears that we will likely be holding a similar ceremony to the one held last year, which will be captured on video for families. Please know that our Admin and teachers are committed to creating a celebration that will honour our graduates and create a lasting memory.



Student Learning Survey 2020/2021

The Provincial Student Learning Survey gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

In Quarter 3, the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 10 and 12, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.



Dear Parents and Guardians:

Re: Community Youth Activities "Grad Pranks"

We share the pride of accomplishment and look forward to joining you in congratulating the class of 2021. However, in past years there have been troubling incidents of unsafe behaviour and acts of vandalism involving youth in our neighbourhoods participating in reckless events, often characterized as grad activities. Such events are a trend, not just in our school district, but in other communities as well. We are asking for your help in ensuring your son or daughter is aware that unsafe and unacceptable behaviours can have serious, lasting, consequences.

It is important that we work together to ensure that our young people do not take part in, or condone (provoke, encourage, or support):

- Bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat(s) or intimidation;
- Violence of any form;
- Verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- Discrimination in any form;
- Theft;
- Unsafe or dangerous activities;
- Vandalism;
- Possession or use of intoxicating or banned substances;
- Possession or use of weapons (or replica weapons) and explosives.

Youth involved in these types of activities may face criminal and school consequences, including losing the privilege to attend extra-curricular events, including graduation related activities such as commencement. Students may also face suspension from school and/or criminal charges. Given that positive citizenship is often considered in selection for school and district scholarships and post-secondary admissions, poor decisions can also impact those opportunities. Parents are also financially responsible for damage caused by their children – please see the attached School Act excerpt. We ask that you understand the school's and district's position in taking the necessary disciplinary steps in circumstances where inappropriate behaviour occurs.

We also fully support your decision to not permit your son or daughter to attend unsupervised <u>events</u>. We often hear about camping trips, parties or trips to vacation spots like Whistler which are not organized by the district, parents or the school. Our shared goal of safety for all of our young people is compromised when these events occur. If you are uncertain about the status of an event please give school administration a call. We would be happy to clarify if this is an event supported by the school or the district. Each year in B.C., there are tragic events associated with "grad activities" that could be avoided through increased awareness and clear expectations.

SCHOOL ACT BC Ministry of Education Governance and Legislation Branch C-1 April 16, 2009 REVISED STATUTES OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, 1996

Division 3 - Joint Rights and Duties Liability for damage to property

10 If property of a board or a francophone education authority is destroyed, damaged, lost or converted by the intentional or negligent act of a student or a francophone student, that student and that student's parents are jointly and severally liable to the board or francophone education authority in respect of the act of that student.
