### Grad Assessment – January 24-28, 2022

### (Literacy, Numeracy & French Assessments)

The second session of the Grad Assessment Schedule is planned for Monday, January 24<sup>th</sup> – Friday, January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

At Earl Marriott, we will be scheduling our current Grade 10 students to write their Grade 10 Literacy Assessments during this week. Grade 10 students taking Math 10 in first semester will be writing Numeracy 10. Grade 12 students in French Immersion will be writing French Additional Language 12.

Some of these students will be required to write their assessment on Thursday, January 27<sup>th</sup> and Friday, January 28<sup>th</sup>, which are considered Completion Days at the end of Semester 1.

A schedule detailing the exact times when students will write at, (based on their class or last name), will be published after the Winter Break. Parents will also receive an email, in January, indicating when their child is scheduled to write these assessments.


# Athletics

Two gold medals were won in two relay events together with four golds for our Para swimmer.


