KINDERGARTEN LOTTERY PROGRAMS

Surrey Schools offer several programs at a number of school sites. Entry into these programs is either by district lottery or application through the school. District lottery programs include: Early French Immersion, Intensive Fine Arts, Montessori and Traditional Programs.

STEP 1
Getting started

The four District lottery programs are available for kindergarten registration. Parents can apply for up to three of these programs. There are no special fees and you do not need to live near the school to apply but, transportation will be up to families. Please see the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) page at: www.surreyschools.ca/programsandservices

Kindergarten: Children who will turn five years old before January 1, 2023 are eligible to begin school in September 2022.

Parents must register their child online for their local catchment school before applying to the Kindergarten Program of Choice Lottery.

Regular Kindergarten registration begins for catchment schools Monday, January 10, 2022

You will be required to provide the following documents to register

- Proof of birth date for the student (Birth Certificate or Passport),
- Proof of guardianship (as shown on child's Birth Certificate or other appropriate legal documentation such as Landed Immigrant Document or guardianship order),
- Proof of Citizenship for both the parent and student (Canadian Birth Certificate, Citizenship Card, Passport, Landed Immigrant Document, Permanent Resident Card, Enhanced Driver's License or Enhanced Identification Card),
- Proof of residence (e.g., ordinarily resident) of parent/guardian in BC: Three pieces of identification showing the address of residence (purchase or rental agreement, utility bill, Driver's License, etc.). One of the three pieces above must be government issued in order to complete the registration process (BC Driver's License, BC Services Card, BCID or BC Care Card of parent/legal guardian).

The lottery application will open online Monday, January 24, 2022 at 8:00 am. Parents will have up until Friday, February 11, 2022 to apply, edit and/or change their application.

January 10 - Regular Kindergarten registration opens online for your local catchment school

January 24 - 8:00 am online lottery application opens

February 9 - Last day to register for catchment school in order to meet the deadline to apply online for the Kindergarten lottery

February 11 - Online lottery application closes

February 22 to March 11 - Random draw takes place

During the weeks of February 22 - March 11 emails will be sent to all applicants announcing the lottery results. The email will indicate whether your child has received a space in one of your selected choices and outline the next steps to accept or decline. Note - applicants not offered a space are automatically placed on a waitlist.

FRENCH IMMERSION

French Immersion is a research based French language learning program available to all students. It is designed for non-French speaking students who wish to attain a high level of proficiency in both official languages. Surrey offers two programs: Early Immersion starting in Kindergarten, or Late Immersion starting in Grade 6. Students are immersed in the French language within the classroom where French is used for meaningful communication and for instruction in all subject areas. French Immersion students develop strong communication skills in both French and English. They also develop a knowledge and understanding about the structure of language that may enable them to learn other languages more easily. French Immersion goals are:

- to produce students who are able to understand and communicate in French and English and achieve a level of learning in all subject areas equivalent to that achieved in the English program.
- to allow students to develop linguistic and cultural knowledge of both Canada's official languages that supports a spirit of positive appreciation and respect.
- to foster intellectual, physical, emotional, social and creative development of children.
- to develop awareness, appreciation, respect and understanding of the French and English cultures and values.
- to enable students to pursue further education and careers in either or both languages.

French is one of Canada's two official languages. It is also a "world" language because of its geographical distribution on the planet: French is spoken in five continents and is a language shared by more than 45 countries. Since we live in an increasingly global society, the acquisition of French is proven to be an asset for the future.

MONTESSORI

The Montessori program is intended to develop self-directed students with a global vision. In the Montessori classroom there is a multi-age group in each class, ideally a three year age span, with six to nine year olds grouped together and nine to twelve year olds in another group. Wherever possible, students stay together for three years. The program is individualized wherever practical. An emphasis is placed on students progressing at their own rate. At the Primary level, the method is based on the use of self-correcting, concrete materials, which are devised to be used in a sequence matched to the child's level. Materials are limited so that children learn to share and help one another. There are large unbroken time spans for work, with a minimum of interruptions to disturb the student's concentration. The curriculum is designed to develop in the child a global view of humankind, stressing the interdependence of people and the care of the environment. There is an emphasis on the development of the child as a contributing member of the society, including a multicultural focus.

INTENSIVE FINE ARTS

The BC Curriculum Goals and Rationale states, in part:
"A strong arts education benefits all students, communities, and societies by contributing to the development of well-rounded, educated citizens. ... Arts education ... stimulates students' imaginations, innovation, creativity, and sense of well-being while developing competencies useful to students' education and careers."

The Arts Education curriculum is founded on the artistic habits of mind – exploring and creating, reasoning and reflecting, communicating and documenting, and connecting and expanding. All are lifelong and transferable knowledge and skills.

While the development of artistic habits of mind and learning in all four areas of the arts (dance, drama, music, visual art) are part of the curriculum for all students, in the Intensive Arts Education choice program there is a particular emphasis on learning through the arts. A concerted effort is made to:

- go deeper in skill and knowledge development;
- encourage students to demonstrate their learning through the arts;
- use the arts as a lens for exploration of other curricular areas.

In the Intensive Fine Arts Education program the arts are not seen as one part of the curriculum; **they are the lens through which the curriculum is explored.** We create learning environments where in-depth experience with the arts becomes a fundamental way of knowing.
