We have a few staff changes and additions for Semester 2. Firstly, we would like to welcome Ms. Bogren (Careers, Drama), Mr. An (ELL) and Ms. Perl (Careers, Math, Info Tech) to our school. We would also like to thank and congratulate Ms. Garbe, who has recently been appointed as a Vice Principal in a neighboring Surrey school. Ms. Garbe has been a huge support to our ELL and International students. In addition, she has been the sponsor of our LEO's club for many years and supported many community initiatives. Thank you, Ms. Garbe, and best wishes in your new school!

Already, our focus is turning to the next school year with planning and course selection. Our students started the new year writing final tests, finishing presentations, and preparing for Semester 2. Our new graduates of 2027 and their parents joined us in a Virtual meeting on January 18th to talk about Grade 8 courses and programs. Grade 11 students are currently presenting their Virtual Capstone projects as part of their graduation requirements. Everybody is moving forward with their courses and their plans for post-graduation.

Typically, as the end of the semester approaches, students are busy finishing assignments and projects, and studying for final exams. The Ministry recently announced the cancellation of the January sitting of Provincial Assessments. Students in Grades 10 and 12 will be writing their assessments in April and June. Grade 12 students who are graduating early will receive information shortly on how their situations will be resolved. We apologize for this late notice, and we will be sending information to the students soon regarding future sittings of the exams. This year, students will be in full session classes until Wednesday, January 26th, with Thursday the 27th and Friday the 28th as Completion Days for students who need to take care of final assignments, or tests and quizzes that must be finished before the end of Semester. If you are unsure whether your child's attendance on the Completion days is being requested, please have them speak to their teacher, or send a quick email.

Semester 2 begins on Monday, January 31st. Student schedules were handed out on Monday January 24th. It is hard to believe, but we are already speaking with students about Course Planning for next year. All of our Grade 8's will be working with us in the Computer Labs the week of Feb. 15th to log into their MyEdBC accounts in preparation for choosing their courses. Grade 9 -11 students will be completing their course selection on line through the student portal of MyEdBC the weeks of Feb. 3rd – 18th after watching a presentation from the counsellors on Feb. 2nd. Parents can ask their son or daughter to go online with them to review their course selection choices. Please check our Course Planning Guide and Course Book online at earlmarriott.ca for all of the information to plan for next year.

As always at this time of year, our Grade 12 students are focused on making choices for their first year out of high school. Information continues to come in from our counseling department, and is posted on our website, along with current scholarship information. Scholarship information continues to be shared through **emsscholarships** on Instagram. Graduation details will be sent out to students in the Spring. We cannot be definitive at this time how our Graduation ceremony and final celebration will look, and which activities will be permitted by the PHO, however we have everything booked and ready to go if large events and gatherings are allowed in May and June. Please know that our Admin and teachers are committed to creating a celebration that will honour our graduates and create a lasting memory.


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Course Planning 2022—2023


EMS Learning Commons New Books

Metis Perspectives on Cultural Wellness




