Principal's Message

It is hard to believe that we are heading into the final month of this school year. Once again, I am so proud of the students of Earl Marriott and the dedication they show to their studies and to their school community. As a staff, we have already begun to plan for next year's events. **Attached to this newsletter is our District Calendar and our fee schedule.** The year-long calendar will be available in June, so that families can plan for non-instructional days and holidays.

A group of our staff met in a committee this year, and proposed a change in our weekly schedule to introduce a Collaboration period on Wednesday afternoon. This schedule was presented to our PAC in April. **You will see that our bell schedule for 2022-23 will show a one-hour earlier dismissal time for students on Wednesday.** The overall minutes of instruction for the week remains the same. This time may be used by staff to meet in Committees, collaborate with dept colleagues, meet with students outside of class, run activities and athletics, etc. Our bus schedule for next year will include an earlier pickup at the end of the day on Wednesday for our students. We are excited to see how this time is used and how it supports our students with their learning and activities. Please watch for our Bell schedule in our next newsletter.

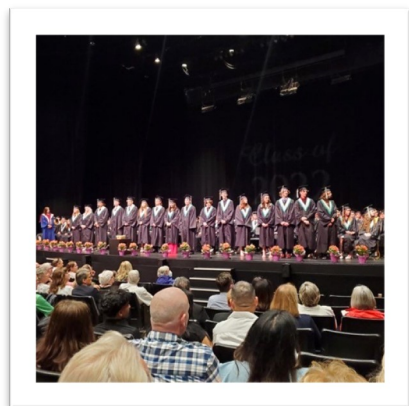

The New Surrey Schools App

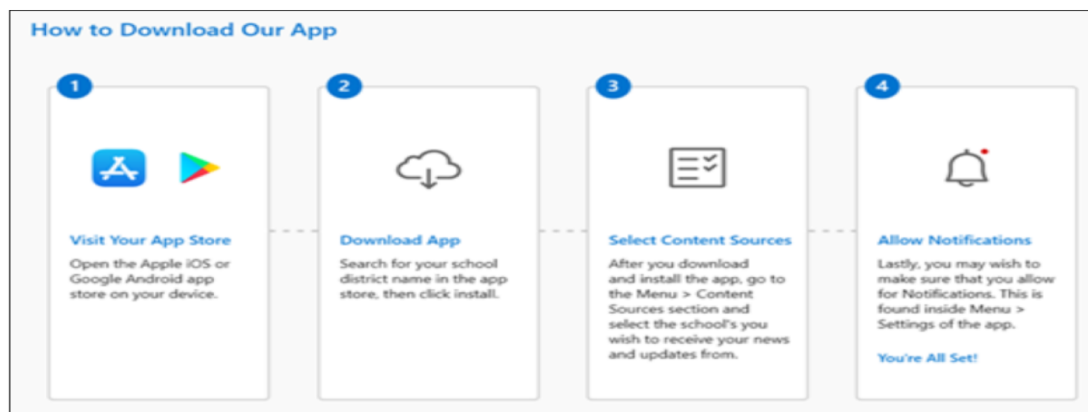
The new Surrey Schools app is available for free through the iOS or Android app stores, by searching for 'Surrey Schools'.

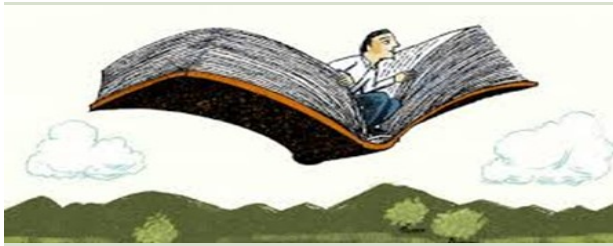


Step by Step:

1. Search for "Surrey Schools" in your chosen app store
2. Click Surrey Schools. Install. Then Open the app.
3. In the app, click **Menu** and then click **Content Sources**. In addition to district news from Surrey Schools, pick which school(s) you want to receive your news and updates from. Click **Next**.
4. To receive push notifications, make sure that setting is enabled. In the app, click **Menu** then click **Settings**. Select what notifications you want to receive (Notifications, News and/or Events) and ensure **Push Notifications** is set to On.

How do I use the new Surrey Schools App?

1. On your device that contains the app, click **Surrey Schools** to open.
2. To select which Surrey Schools site(s) you want to receive your news and updates (content) from: click **Menu**, click **Content Sources** and select the name(s) of the district and/or School & Affiliate site(s). Click **Next**.
3. To receive push notifications, make sure that you enable notifications. In the app, click **Menu** > **Settings** and select what notifications you want to receive (Notifications, News and/or Events) and ensure **Push Notifications** is set to On.
4. Click **Home** (bottom of your device display) to view the news from your selected sites.
5. Click **Calendar** to view the calendar events from your selected sites.
6. Click **Menu** where you can adjust your notification settings. Click the back arrow to return to the previous menu.
7. Click **Content Sources** to select or deselect the name of sites that you would like to view the content for.

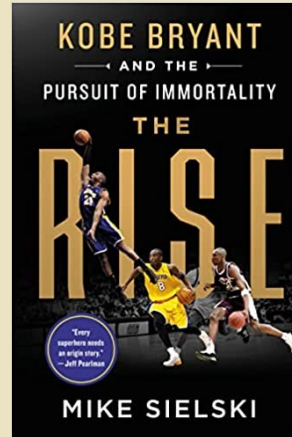

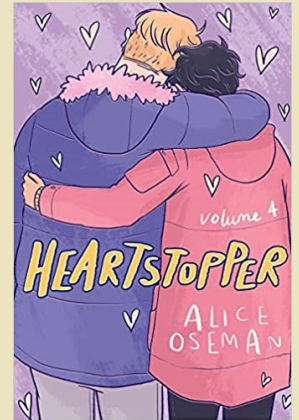

STEP 3: Watch and wait for the Call-back lists to be posted and for further instructions after all the first singing and dance auditions are complete.
