Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements

Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate.

52 credits from:

- **Science 10** (4 credits)
- **A Math 10** (4 credits)
- **Social Studies 10** (4 credits)
- **A Language Arts 10** (4 credits)
- **PE and Health Education 10** (4 credits)
- **Career-Life Education (CLE 10)** (4 credits)

Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements

- **A Language Arts 11 (4 credits)**
- **Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)**
- **A Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)**
- **Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)**
- **A Language Arts 12 (4 credits)**
- Indigenous-Focused Course: First Peoples English 11, Contemporary Indigenous Studies or BC First Peoples 12
- **Career Life Connections (CLC/Capstone) (4 credits)**
- **An Arts Education and/or an Applied Design, Skills and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)**

Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements

28 credits from elective courses

Note: At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level (this can include English 12 or SS 12 credit)

Courses

- **2 Required courses – English 12 & CLC 12**
- **6 Other courses (electives)**
- **1 or 2 can be a study**
- **3 alternates for electives (in case don't get first choices)**

Required: Fine Arts or Applied Skills Elective

- If haven't completed a Fine Arts or Applied Skills course in grade 10, 11 or 12
- Must choose one this year for graduation

Comparative Cultures 12

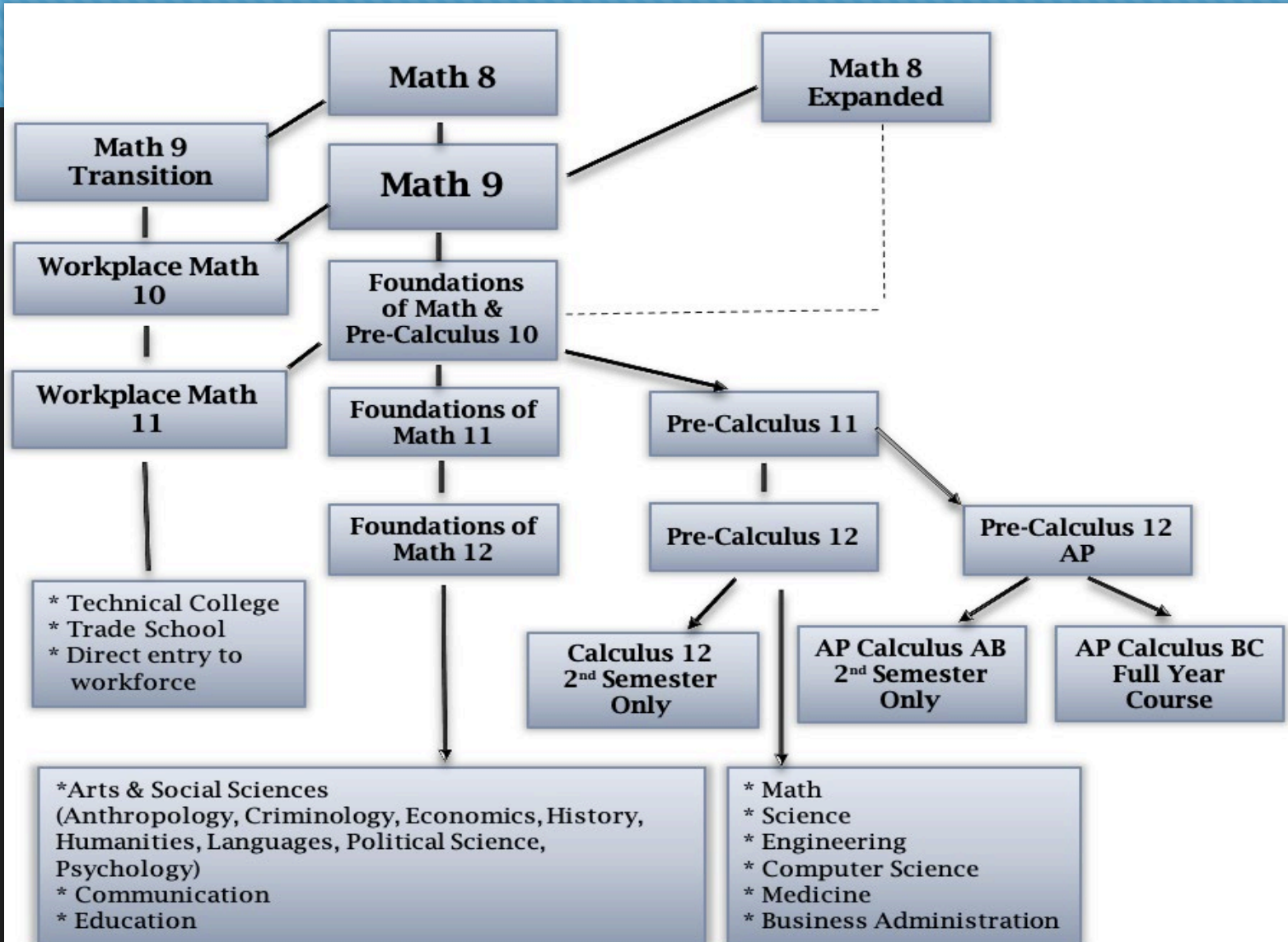
The course is comprised of six units including an introduction to anthropology, comparative religious studies, micro-cultures, sociolinguistics, cultural exchange and contact theory, and a final study on contemporary cultural issues. We focus specifically on the fields of anthropology, linguistics, and religious studies throughout the course, and take a sense of the diverse landscape of humanity through various lenses.

New Socials Courses

Genocide Studies 12

Genocide Studies addresses a deeper understanding of the political, social, cultural and economic movements, which led to some of the worst atrocities in human history. This course begins by understanding what the term genocide means, and the impact of many events around the world in shaping our global landscape.

OPTIONAL Hybrid Courses

Hybrid Learning is **different** from what students experienced during COVID 19. Hybrid courses will be facilitated in a combination of face to face in classroom learning along side of independent online studies.

This could look like an alternating day one/day two schedule, where students would be face to face with their teacher every other day.

Students must commit to completing both aspects of the course (face to face and online). Curriculum remains the same in the Hybrid model.

OPTIONAL Hybrid Courses

The following courses will have a Hybrid option for next year. These courses will only run if there is sufficient interest. If a student selects the hybrid option and it does not run, the request will automatically be adjusted to the full time in class course.

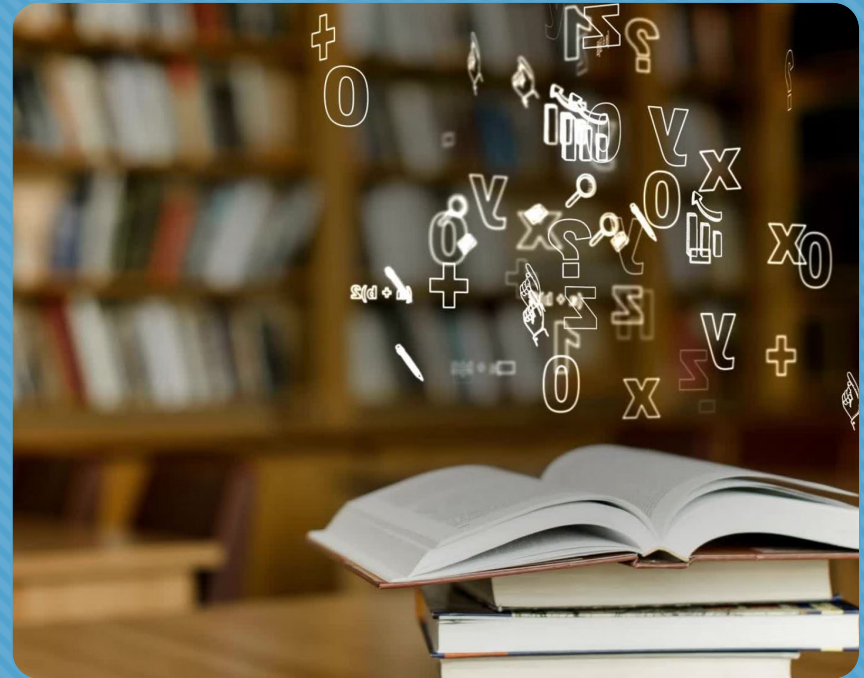

Grade 12 Studies (under electives)

- Make sure you have enough credits to graduate
- Choose Study Block 12-1 for first
- Choose Study Block 12-2 for second

EARLY GRAD

- If you think you may be graduating early, select Early Grad course and 3 other electives
- This will alert us to remove some of your electives
- Write in Counsellor notes which courses you would like removed

Grade Twelve Course Selection



Each Grade 10 student is required to take the following courses, which will automatically be selected for each student:

- English Studies 12
- Career Life Connections 12

Do not choose a course more than once. Duplicate requests will be deleted.

Students are encouraged to take one Arts Education Elective course and one Applied Design, Skills & Technologies (ADST) Elective course. Students are also encouraged to take a language as an elective to keep as many post-secondary choices available.

Please make wise course selections now. As time progresses, it will become increasingly difficult to make changes to courses.

- Individual Post-secondary requirements and pre-requisites should be reviewed and considered when making course selections.




- If the course is a **REQUIRED** course for graduation, you will have no choice but to select it. Put a note in the **Counsellor Notes** in the portal to let the counsellor know what course you are intending to take in summer school/online and **what you want instead** of that required course.
- If the course you plan to take in summer school/online is an elective (i.e. Spanish 11), select a different course (i.e. Woodwork 11 – not the one you are taking in summer school/online). You do not need to let your counsellor know in this case.
- If you do not get accepted into the summer school course, contact your counsellor immediately to try to get the course back into your Fraser Heights timetable. Be aware that this may not be possible and you will have to choose another course instead.
- Note: It is your responsibility to register for Summer School through Continuing Education



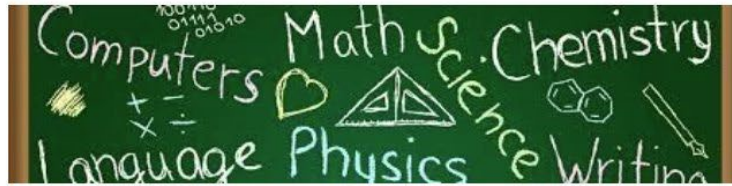
