- Arts: 76%
- Business and Computing: 73%
- **Sciences: 73%**
- Applied and Technical Studies (Trades): 67%
- Engineering Transfer Program: 85%
- Health Sciences: 86%
- Kinesiology: 80%
- **Nursing: 86%**





Example of Approximate Admission Averages (SFU)

- Arts and Social Sciences: 80%
- Business: 83%
- Communication Arts and Technology: 80%
- Engineering: 86%
- Environment: 80%
- Health Sciences: 85%
- **Science: 85%**





SFU UPDATES

- An unweighted average of all approved academic Grade 11 and 12 courses
- Applicants must complete 5 approved grade 12 courses
- Introduction of early and standard admissions.
- Use of official interim grades via STS NO MORE Self-Reported Grades!
- May use Grade 11 final mark to make earlier offers (Applicants with final English 12 marks 75% or lower, still need to complete FAL X99 at SFU)
- One unified approved course list, removing List A/B distinctions.

UBC ADMISSION UPDATES

- Applications will now be reviewed **Continuously as they are received** Early admission deadline no longer exists. Deadline January 15th.
- Applications are considered as soon as all required grade information is available through the STS
- Offers of Admission begin in late October and continue through to June
- If an offer is not made after the first review, UBC may review updated Grade 12 marks and conduct a second review (typically in March/April)
- UBC Admission process is **competitive and comparative**, so completing your application early may enhance chances of an earlier offer (20%)

UBC UPDATES - CONT'D

- Applicants must complete at least six approved Grade 12 courses, including English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12.
- General & Degree-Specific Requirements: These six courses must satisfy both UBC's general admission requirements and any degree-specific requirements.

Grades Considered:

- All academic Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses
- Key subject-area courses related to your intended degree, with an emphasis on Grade 12 courses
- Grade 11 Prerequisites: There are no specific Grade 11 math or science requirements for Arts and Fine Arts. Any course that meets graduation requirements will be accepted
- Check your selected program for specific requirements

Second Language Requirements

There are no longer any post-secondary institutions in BC that require a second language for General Admissions

KPU

O BA programs require a second language 11/12 (Intro/ Beginner courses not accepted) OR one university second language course for university graduation

UFV

 BA programs require a second language 11 (any level accepted) <u>OR</u> a university second language for university graduation

BCIT



- Offers a wide range of programs which all have individual requirements, with admission on a "First Qualified, First Admitted" Basis – Apply Early!
- Faculties: Applied and Natural Sciences, Business, Computers and IT, Technology, Aviation, Engineering, Health Sciences and Trades (Arts/ Humanities programs not offered)
- Check the BCIT website for program specific requirements and deadlines/ start dates
- Following application on Ed Planner, this is the <u>only institution</u> requiring students to upload PDF of Transcript

Post-Secondary & Career Options in the Trades

Trades Pathways

<u>Foundation Program</u>

- Take a 4-6 month program at KPU,, VCC or BCIT, UFV or a private trades college to get your level 1 trades technical training.
- Get a job in the trade area after completing a level 1 Foundation to start accumulating on the job WBT Hours (Work Based Training)

Direct Apprentice

Start a Job with a company in a trade area and that company becomes your apprenticeship sponsor

WBT hours begin to accumulate once a probation period finishes (usually 2-3 months – some companies will backdate WBT hours)

Attend school for 6-8 weeks for Level 1 Technical Training after you have gained on the job training – Level 2-3-4

THE TRADE APPRENTICESHIP

A trade apprenticeship is how you gain the knowledge and skills you need for a career in your trade. As an apprentice, you and others training for the same trade will spend approximately six to ten weeks per year in a classroom or shop, learning from an instructor. The rest of the year, you'll earn while you learn, working on a job site alongside experienced tradespeople and getting paid to do it.

Train in Trades/ACEIT Work in Trades/SSA

Most apprenticeships take about four years to complete. Yours might be a bit longer or shorter, depending on your trade and how many hours you work. Programs like ACE IT and SSA help fulfil the hours you need to complete your trade apprenticeship. At the end, ITA will award you a trade credential or "ticket" that determines where you can work. Once you are certified, you can choose to specialize in a specific area of your trade, work your way up to a management position or even start your own business.

 - Applications all require an application fee to be paid by credit card

- Consider applying to more than one institution with varying entrance requirements

- For all <u>Ontario</u> post-secondary institutions, apply through Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC): https://www.ouac.on.ca
- For applications to any other provinces, please apply directly to the institution

Reporting Marks/ STS

- Student Transcript Service (STS):
 - ○Grade 12 students will be provided information on this process during the week of October 14th – 21st (Block C)
 - This process must be completed for PSIs to receive your transcript
 - No need to send in individual transcripts for PSI applications (Except BCIT)

Things to Consider

- Set realistic goals:
 - Review strengths and weaknesses (look at previous marks)
 - Direct admission into desired institution or transferring between post-secondary schools
 - Consider length of program
 - Certificate, Diploma, Degree
 - Consider desired class size (KPU, Douglas and UFV- may 35 students per class)
 - Consider transportation
 - Consider cost of tuition
