
# HPV vaccination – Closing the gap




HPV (or human papillomavirus) is a common infection that can cause a variety of cancers, no matter your sex, gender or sexual orientation.

## Why vaccinate against HPV?

It protects against HPV types that cause:

90% of cases of genital warts

90% of cases of cervical cancer


80% of cases of anal cancer

and several other cancers such as cancers of the vagina, vulva, penis, mouth and throat.

#### Earlier is best.

Preteens make more antibodies after getting the vaccine than older teens.

## What can you do to help?



#### Communicate

Spread the word in your school communities about immunization and school immunization clinics.



#### Connect

Refer students, families or school staff with questions or concerns to the school's public health nurse.



#### Counsel

Share trusted resources on immunization with your school communities.
