#### ALLERGY-AWARE SCHOOL

Several of our students at North Ridge have severe life-threatening allergies/allergic reactions to peanuts, nuts and their by-products, as well as other food products. Please help us in doing everything possible to protect these students. Some ways you can help include not sending food to school that contain peanuts/nuts. Remind your child to wash their hands carefully after eating and to not share or trade snacks. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we continue to make our school a safe environment for all of our students.

#### WHY WE NEED YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL EVERY DAY

Here are some critical reasons why we want and need your child at school, on time, every school day.

- 1. We love your child! When they are not here, we miss them! They are important and our class community grows around them.
- 2. Habit is everything: If you let your child frequently miss school or sleep in, you are building a poor lifelong habit. We do not want your child to develop a habit that they stay home if things get tough or if they are a little tired. It is far better to build habits of endurance, perseverance and commitment. These good habits will serve your child well in life!
- 3. Learning happens best when your child is relaxed, happy and involved. If you let your child miss many school days, they will become more anxious, confused and disconnected; learning will then grind to a halt. Ensure they come every day to keep their learning in a good flow!
- 4. Research shows that students who attend school regularly are much more happy and emotionally healthier than kids who frequently miss school.

Of course, the exception is when your child has a fever, stomach flu or is really sick. During these times, your child needs to rest and recuperate before coming back to school.

#### WEATHER UPDATE

This is a reminder that all students will be expected to go outside at recess and



lunch each day. Students will only be kept in during extremely poor weather. Children should be dressed to go outside with appropriate clothing and footwear. Waterproof coats, rubber boots and umbrellas are recommended for our rainy climate. It is recommended

that your children keep a change of clothes or socks at school. This will ensure that you are not called during the day to bring dry clothes. Please know we will call inside days for extreme weather, especially high winds.

#### SAFE PARENT PARKING OPTIONS

Please continue to be considerate of our neighbors when parking near the school:

- Follow No Parking signage!
- Parking at least 1.5 meters away from a driveway
- No U-turns in the school zone
- No drop offs on road behind school that goes from gate off of 62<sup>nd</sup> avenue to the garbage/recycling area
- Please be mindful not to block residents' driveways when dropping off or picking up students

Some good streets to park on are:

- 62 Ave east of the school all the way to King George Boulevard
- 135<sup>th</sup> Street north of the school
